



Bond swapping can save you in taxes

Editor's Note: Following is the 12th in a series of col-umns on financial planning by Jennifer Hicks, a financial consultant for Shearson Lehman/American Express, Inc. of East Brunswick.

Now is the time to search your bond portfolio for loss items—corporates, governments, municipals, even units of bond unit trusts—that may be candidates for an excellent tax-saving technique known as "swapping." As the experts at the accounting firm of Coopers & Lybrand point out, there are a couple of good tax reasons to act

-Swaps must be completed by the end of 1985 to establish a tax loss for this year. —Any tax deductions you achieve will be worth more to you this year than next if the Reagan proposal to cut

tax rates is adopted in 1986.

There's also a solid investment reason not to delay: The rush to swap bonds in the last couple of weeks of December often limits the supply of issues to swap into

and pushes up their prices. Swapping is a relatively simple transaction. You sell for example those with long maturities whose value has declined considerably since you bought them. You then use the proceeds of the sale to buy similar issues (but not "substantially identical" issues, as the IRS instructs). To qualify as similar and not "substantially identical," a security must differ in at least two of the following characteristics: The issuer, the maturity date or the interest rate (coupon).

After the swap you may own bonds with the same face value as before, and you will receive approximately the same income for the same period of time. But you will also have realized a capital loss, amounting to the difference between what you paid for your original bonds and what you sold them for. (Remember, though, if you purchase a bond at a low price in a swap, you'll have a capital gain when that bond matures to its face value or if you sell it when it increases in value.) The loss you incur in the swap can be used to offset. dollar for dollar and with no limit, short-and long-term capital gains on your other investments. And if your loss

is greater than your capital gains, you can apply the re-mainder to your ordinary income (salary, interest, etc.). up to a maximum of \$3,000 of income (\$1,500-for-marpeople filing separately). Excess of long-term capital losses are applied on a two-for-one basis, which means it takes \$2 of losses to offset \$1 of ordinary income. Moreover, losses above the \$3,000 ceiling can be carried forward and used in later

The trickiest part of a swan is picking a hond sufficiently different from the original one to meet the requirements of the tax laws. It is here a financial consultant skilled at analyzing the bond market and selecting specific bonds in conjunction with your investment goals is essential. You should also consult your accountant to find out whether a swap makes tax sense for you.

It's important to remember the concept of tax swapping assumes you want to retain the same portfolio mix of don't need to swap. Simply sell your bonds, take the loss as a tax deduction and do whatever you wish with the
