Miller: "Deal is an improper violation of the public trust"

by Pat DiMaggio Litigation continues bet ween the Rahway Board of Education, the Rahway Education Association (REA) and the New Jersey Education Association

Amidst charges of unfair labor practices and outdated and inaccurate seniority lists, proposals for a settlement between the two sides have been re-

jected. The Reduction In Force ordered by the board included 10 teaching and 2 nursing positions and was deemed necessary to head budget. The REA and NJEA has maintained that money in the budget could be transferred from other accounts to re-hire laid-off teachers.

One settlement offer included a promise from the passage of the 1986-87 Board of Education budget, in return for the re-hiring of teachers affected by RIF.







Company Pension Plans: How they affect your investing

for your retirement, your first step is to look closely at what's already piling up for you in your company retire *Defined contribution plans take many forms, including profit-sharing, money-purchase pension, thrift salary saving, 401K, ESOP, TRASOP, PASOP, and target-benefit. All have a common feature: The company adopts a formula (based on profits, salary, years of service or other factors) that establishes how much you and the company contribute to your individual account. *Defined benefit plans commit the company to pay a certain sum to a covered employee at normal retirement age. The benefit is arrived at by a formula that usually takes into account the employee's years of service and compensation. On your annual statement from the defined benefit account the figure called accrued vested benefit payable to date is the amount of money you'll get at normal retirement age — even if you leave the company right


It's important for you to know how much of your company retirement benefits are vested - which means | Department of Higher of Technology. to work for the company. In defined contribution and minimum standards. Check with your company plan administrator to determine the extent of your vesting. Retirement plans can be a source of liquid funds even before retirement. Many defined contribution plans. for instance, allow you to take out funds for very specific reasons; a major health crisis, purchase of a primary residence, educational needs. Companies also usually allow employees to borrow against funds in a defined contribution plan. If you are covered only by a defined benefit plan, however, it is unlikely that you can either borrow or withdraw funds from it while you are still a

If you leave a longtime employer that has a generous retirement program and can take the funds out, you will probably have more cash assets to invest at one-time than you have ever had before. It's essential to talk with a Financial Consultant to make sure you put the funds to work for you in the best way. You have only 60 days from the day you actually receive the check from your former company to roll over the funds into another retirement account without paying income tax on the whole

Once you have a clearer idea of what you will get retirement income up to the level you really need. At a minimum, set aside the \$2,000 a year that you can invest in an IRA and deduct from your taxable income. If you are self-employed, or earn consulting or freelance income in addition to your salary, be sure to talk. to your Financial Consuftant, too, about setting up a Keogh account that will give you even more tax savings and help you build your personal retirement fund even

For any investments toward retirement, concentrate on steady-performing securities that will not expose you to a serious loss position in a down cycle. This is especially important if you are in your 50s and just getting started Also, be aware that federal tax reforms could affect the above information. Check with your tax and investment advisers to get the latest information as it pertains to
