REA and NJEA litigation continues. . .

Miller: "Deal is an improper violation of the public trust"

Litigation continues between the Rahway Board of Education, the Rahway Education Association (REA) and the New Jersey Education Association (NJEA).

Amidst charges of unfair labor practices and outdated and inaccurate seniority lists, proposals for a settlement between the two sides have been rejected. The Reduction In Force ordered by the board included 10 teaching and 2 nursing positions and was deemed necessary to head off deficit spending in the budget. The REA and NJEA has maintained that money in the budget could be transferred from other accounts to re-hire laid-off teachers.

One settlement offer included a promise from the unions to work to promote passage of the 1986-87 Board of Education budget, in return for the re-hiring of teachers affected by RIF.

Board Member Bernard D. Miller released a statement to the press criticizing the REA and NJEA's plan to incorporate support of the budget into the settlement. "Conceptually, the

proposed deal was that the Board of Education would give the teachers union a settlement acceptable to them in return for the state and local unions professional staffing and financing of an election campaign to support a school budget acceptable to them," said Miller. "In my judgement, and that of the majority of board members, such a deal is an improper, unconscionable violation of the public trust. I can only wonder how the board members and officials who supported this settlement will explain to the citizens

how they sold their support for the price to be paid - i.e. a labor union's written promise to attempt to influence a public election. "Any settlement of a labor dispute should stand or fall on its own merits and should not involve deals for anything outside the area of labor-management relations. The state and local teachers unions should be free to support or oppose any school budget they like, not be forced to do anything because they made a deal to do so to win settlement of a lawsuit. I do not question the union's right to participate in an

election, but the giving or withholding of this right should never be part of any deal. Likewise, no elected official should ever violate his or her public trust by dealing away free will participation in the electoral process in return for labor union support. The school budget must always be decided based on its overall merit in meeting educational requirements and must never be sold to any bidder for any price."

"Board of Education members and school officials should hold themselves to the highest standards of public trust. This includes operating always with credibility and in good faith. When we achieve these principles in our school system, then and only then can we work with our many dedicated teachers to restore harmonious relations in Rahway."

"Those officials who were so willing to forget about the integrity of the system and the ideals of public trust, should remember the words of the wise man who said, 'We have seen the enemy and it is us'."

Board reinstates physical education teacher

A motion to rescind a 60 day notice given to a tenured teaching staff member was approved by the Rahway Board of Education at a special meeting held on Feb. 6.

Mr. Fred Stueber, a Physical Education/Health teacher at the High School will not be affected by the previous Reduction In Force.

Superintendent of Schools Frank Brunette explained that the rescinding of the notice was due to Mr. Stueber's inadvertent giving the wrong date of employment on the seniority list.

Mrs. Berta Jacobs, Board of Education President, said the board felt that it was inappropriate to give a RIF notice so late in the year and pointed to this example of the problems in record keeping faced by the board.

Board Member Ronald Matusitis said that in the past, because of litigation filed by the Rahway Education Association and the New Jersey Education Association, he felt "like I had a gun to my head. Tonight, I feel the board is dealing fair and square with an employee."

NJEA President Pat Haynie called for more employees to be reinstated. She said she was very pleased by Mr. Stueber's rehiring and said the board "showed compassion. At the same time I wish they had that compassion for all their employees."

Brown noted that the new office building will include more than 4,000 square feet of space that Commercial Trust will share with one or two other tenants. Construction has begun, with the opening scheduled for June 1, 1986.

"Prior to undertaking the move, we made a careful examination of the situation in Rahway," Brown said. "We found that the center of town has been moving over a period of years to the St. Georges Avenue area. Furthermore, we found that our bank customers preferred doing their banking near where they live."

Brown said that all bank records would be automatically transferred with no disruption in customer service. Furthermore, he emphasized that no bank employees would lose their jobs as a result of the move. The new Rahway branch manager will be Barbara Buss.

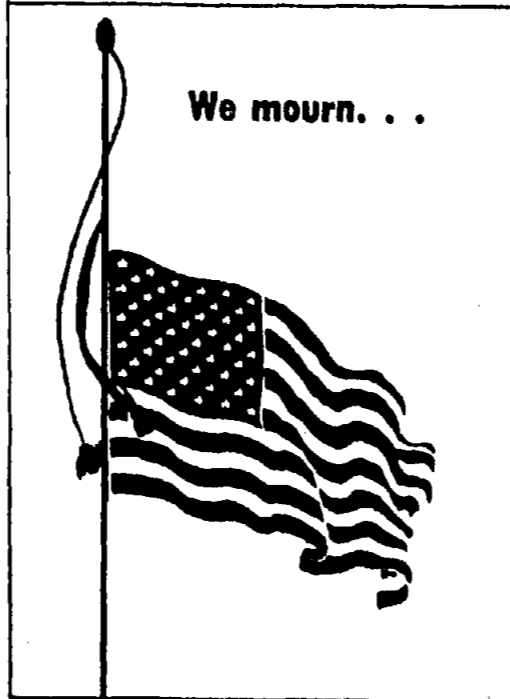
"The Mayor and City Council of the City of Rahway, representing all of the people of our community,

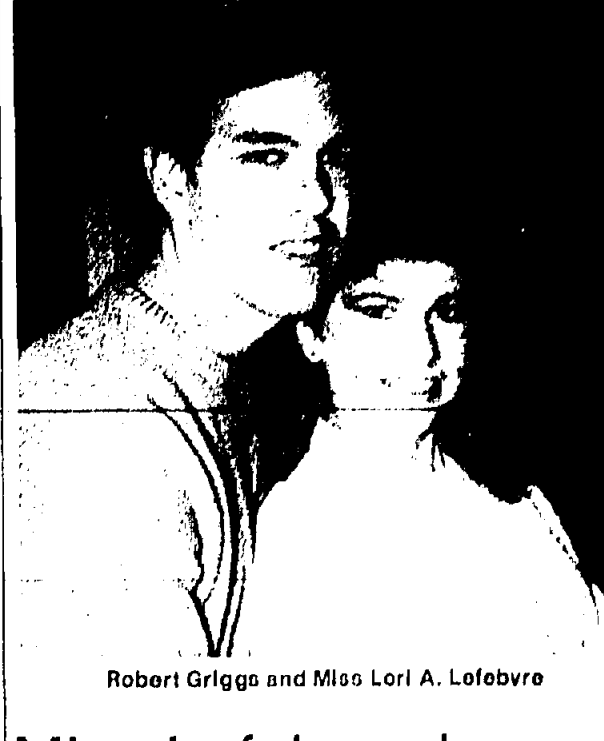

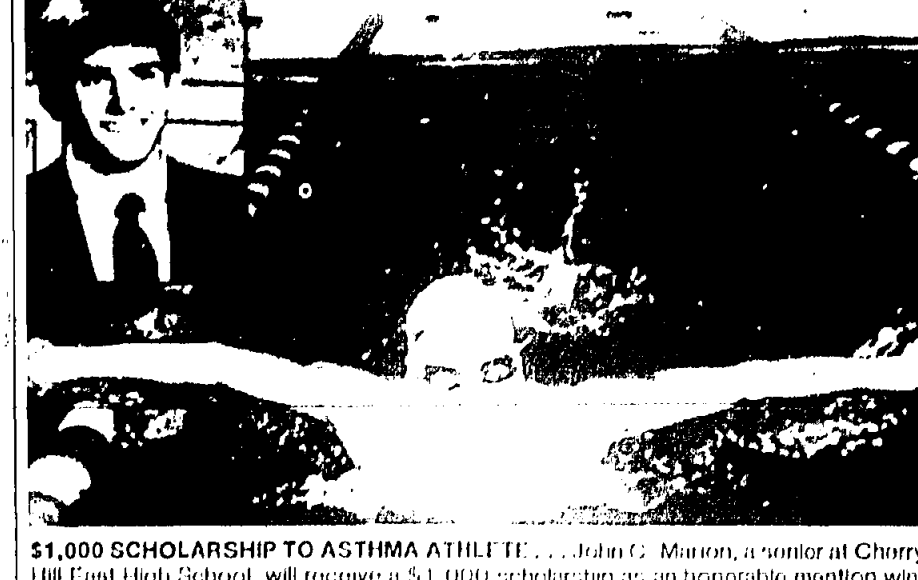

"Nutrition and Fitness Express" course offered by hospital

Do you want to learn how to feel your best and stay well through good nutrition? You can find out how diet can help you lead a healthy lifestyle at Rahway Hospital's new four-week course, "Nutrition and Fitness Express." For convenience, two sessions will be offered: Tuesday evenings, March 4, 11, 18, and 25, and Thursday evenings, March 6, 13, 20, and 27. Both will be held from 7-9:30 p.m. in the hospital's 1E Classroom. The course will be taught by two nutritionists on the hospital staff: Mary Beth Muller, Registered Dietitian (R.D.) and Cardiac Nutrition Specialist, and Geri Dedrick, R.D., Chief Clinical Dietitian. As part of the hospital's wellness programming, this new nutrition series takes the preventative approach to good health. "There is so much misinformation about nutrition given to the public. We are going to show people the right way to eat taking into account their total lifestyle," said Mrs. Dedrick. Participants will each have a personal computerized nutritional analysis done and their ideal body weight calculated. The dietitians will provide a nutritional assessment for each person and recommend how their diets can be improved.
