## Senator Case memorialized Governor Kean dedicates new senior citizen complex

The late Senator Clifford P. Case, a life-long resident of Rahway, was honored by the residents of Rahway, the Housing Authority, the City Administration, the family of Senator Case and the Governor of New Jersey, Thomas H. Kean, at dedication ceremonies on March 26.

The Clifford P. Case Memorial Apartments, a \$2.5 million senior citizen complex located at 337 West Milton Avenue, was dedicated to "the kind of man we need in government today," said Governor Kean. "I think this is a wonderful project. The Housing Authority, Federal Government, the City and everyone who had anything to do with it really deserves congratulations," continued Kean. "But that is not the reason I came today. I came not just because Mayor Martin and the rest have accomplished something great in putting up this building, but I came particularly because they had the wisdom and good sense to name this building for Clifford Case."

Senator Case began his political career in Rahway as a City Councilman. He was then elected to the State Assembly and served from 1945 through 1953 as a Member of Congress. He spent 24 years as a United States Senator until he was defeated in his bid for the

Republican primary in 1978. During his tenure in public office, Senator Case served as a ranking member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, a member of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, a representative to the Helsinki Commission, and was a delegate to the twenty-first General Assembly of the United Nations. He died in March of 1982.

"Senator Case's honesty and integrity placed him in the forefront of many battles affecting the moral fiber of our country," said Mayor Daniel Martin. "In the dark days of McCarthyism, his was a ringing voice for the ideals on which this nation was founded. He stood up for all Americans and helped make sure we did not waiver from the course of democracy."

"In the days when the civil rights battle gripped our country, Senator Case was once again a champion for freedom and liberty," continued Martin. "He helped guide us through the stormy waters, standing firm in the belief that God put all people on earth as equals and that the United States of America must always stand for equality. In International affairs, Senator Case was a lifelong fighter for human rights and helped give birth to today's human rights struggles all over the globe. Once again, his message was clear

— of all the nations on earth, it is our duty to be the shining beacon of life, liberty and individual freedom.

"Because this facility serves people," said Martin, "it is more than a monument to a great man. It is a living legacy for a human being who, above all else, cared about and for people. Let us never forget the ideals that Senator Case left us — truth, personal integrity, love of country, compassion, freedom from tyranny for all people and justice. We thank God for giving us this great man."

Mrs. Ruth Case accepted a plaque from Mayor Martin saying, "I know he is here with us now. But I think he is saying 'What in the world is all this fuss about?' But he is also saying, 'Don't stop because I find this all very pleasant.'" Mrs. Case said that Senator Case would go to political dinners in Washington and leave early to rush back home to her. "When you've been in love for 60 years," said Mrs. Case, "it's hard to be alone. At home, I feel content because I feel he is still around."

The Clifford P. Case Memorial Apartments opened in December and consists of 40 efficiency units with six apartments designed for the handicapped. Rents are based on a sliding scale and are available to low and moderate income levels.



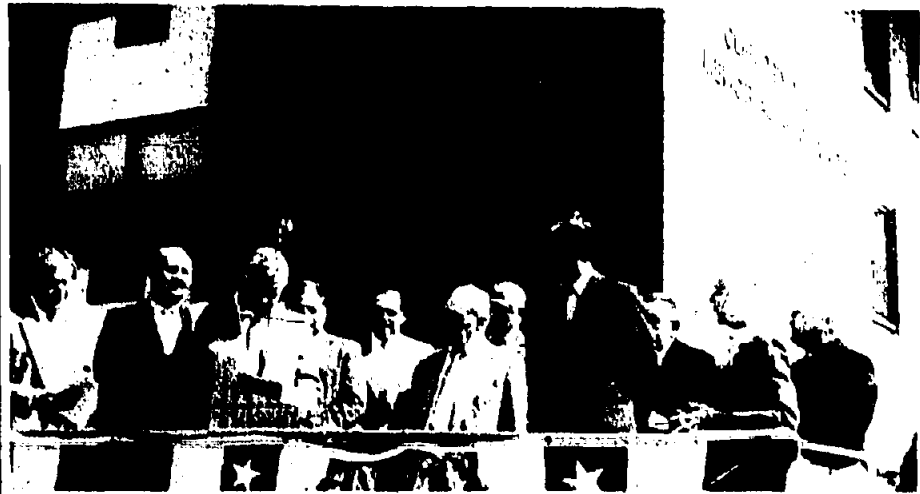

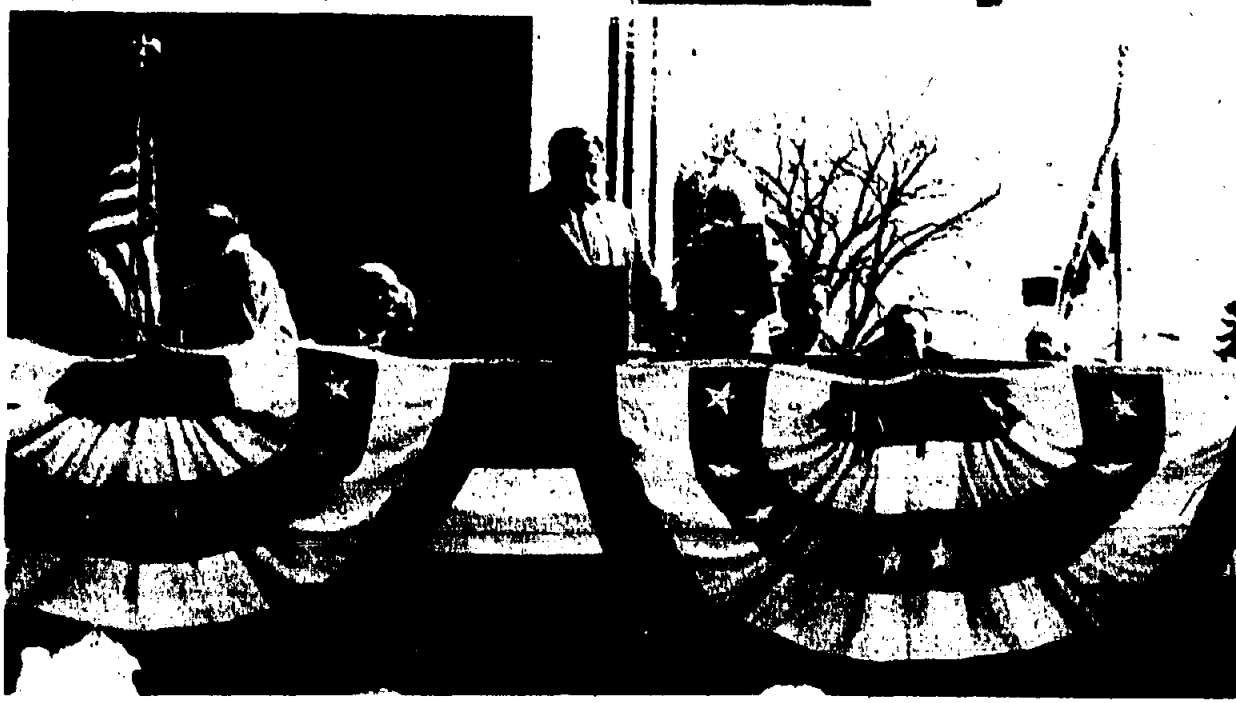
### Board to interview principal candidates

**Initiative and Referendum for New Jersey voters subject of Ogden TV show**

Proposed Initiative and Referendum legislation, which would give New Jersey voters the ability to place issues on the ballot which the Legislature fails to address, will be the topic of "N.J. and YOU with Assemblywoman Maureen Ogden," Sundays, April 6 and April 27 at 5 p.m., on Suburban Cablevision's Channel 3.

Assemblyman Richard Zimmer, sponsor of the legislation, joins Ogden to outline the provisions of the proposed bill to permit voters to propose new laws, repeal or modify existing statutes, and propose constitutional amendments. No subject matter would be excluded from the Initiative and Referendum process under the Zimmer legislation.

Ogden's guests also include proponent of I&R, Marie Curtis, Legislative Vice President of the N.J. League of Women Voters, and James Morford, Vice President for Governmental Relations of the N.J. Chamber of Commerce, which is opposed to the bill.

Curtis discusses the League of Women Voters' five-year study of the 23 states which have I&R. The League's research indicates that of the 16 states responding to their survey, all find I&R effective when appropriate safeguards to the process are ensured. Curtis says: "We believe indirect initiative complements the legislative process in that the citizens petition the Legislature to act on specific proposals. Only when they fail to act within a

given period of time does the measure go to the voters." She adds that "all too frequently citizens become frustrated with what they perceive as government's failure to act on specific measures or issues. Initiative and Referendum offers voters an additional way to participate and become involved in governmental decision-making."

Morford counters that "even though the concept of Initiative and Referendum is supposed to create greater citizen participation, in effect it would hand over law-making to well-financed special interest groups who would wage elaborate media campaigns to influence voters."

**Kowal stresses public awareness needed in Rahway School System**

Peter D. Kowal, of Midwood Drive, one of seven candidates seeking three seats on the Rahway Board of Education would like to see the public become more aware of what is actually going on in the school system.

Mr. Kowal stated, "The lack of public awareness and involvement has reached its lowest point in years. This is the year to take the administration to task and, if elected, I will urge for the creation of parent and taxpayer advisory committees that would allow the community to become better educated on the development and implementation of the school budget and other important and relevant programs within our school system. If these pro-

grams are vital, they need community support and I can promise a link of better communication."

The school board election will be held on Tuesday, April 15 between the hours of 2 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Mr. Kowal has stressed that the first step to help him achieve these goals is through a strong voter turnout. "We cannot afford another apathetic election. Seven candidates with a variety of interests and ideas are challenging each other this year and excellence in education and better accountability can only be achieved by participating in this year's school board election and voting for Peter D. Kowal," the candidate concluded.

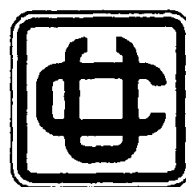
