School board votes to "unrif" three positions

The Rahway Board of Education voted at a special meeting held on April 28, to "unrif" three positions. An elementary nurse, an elementary physical education teacher and a secondary guidance counselor were removed from the Reduction in Force (RIF) list for the 1986-87 school year.

In November, the board sent out RIF notices to 12 staff members in response to an anticipated budget deficit.

Rahway Education Association members called these notices retaliation for the teacher's strong position in contract negotiations and have maintained that money could be found in the budget to "resign" these positions.

A music teacher, a teacher for the Gifted and Talented program, an elementary art teacher, two physical education teachers, an intermediate guidance counselor, a business education teacher, an economics teacher and two nurses were "offered" the positions of an elementary teacher and a High School Industrial Arts teacher were eliminated by attrition. The restoration of one nurse leaves the school system with a total of five nurses for six schools.

Board President Ronald Mattiavoli, in explaining the cuts, said, "It was never our intention to cut positions that would harm education in Rahway. It took a

lot of hard work between the board and the administration to come up with the dollars to restore these positions. I can guarantee that the children of Rahway will receive the treatment and education they need."

Mattiavoli asked for parent and community support for the board. "I can't speak for next year," said Mattiavoli, "but as I sit here tonight, I promise better communication between the board and the public."

Board Secretary/Business Administrator Anthony Rocco explained the position of the board. "As of June 30, 1986 we don't expect any surplus," said Rocco. "We don't have the money for restoration of staff. But we do have a line item budget and the board has agreed to have faith that we will have sufficient funds in 1986-87 to cover these three positions." Rocco noted that three areas of the budget are not set

finalized: transportation, tuition and insurance.

Robert Munsey, Board Vice President, said, "The board would not vote for these positions if we didn't have a high degree of confidence that the money will be there. Any money found through the year will go directly back into the classroom. After twenty years of budget cuts it takes more than one right to build the programs back up to where people like them to be."

Milk and honey distribution set

The City of Rahway will be distributing powdered milk and honey on Friday, May 23, at 10 a.m. at the City Hall Complex on Main Street.

Persons qualified can register weekdays, at the Welfare Department, City Hall, May 14 to May 22 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Proof of eligibility will be required. Those

eligible will be those receiving Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC), Food Stamps, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), General Assistance, Women, Infant & Children (WIC) and Medicaid.

Those receiving Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (WILL NOT) be eligible.

Council honors Roy Valentine

A resolution, honoring High School Principal Roy Valentine was approved by the Rahway City Council at the regular meeting held on May 12.

Mr. Valentine, principal at the Junior High for ten years before serving as principal at the High School for the past 10 years, will be

retiring this summer after serving 36 years as an educator in Rahway.

"By his service to the community, Roy Valentine has influenced the lives of thousands of Rahway youth and helped prepare them for their futures," read the resolution. "Roy Valentine has always served the community with dignity, distinction and dedication. Therefore, the City of Rahway does hereby extend its congratulations and best wishes on the occasion of his retirement and honors him for a lifetime of service to the community."

The council also approved for first reading an ordinance designating Charlotte Place, from the intersection of Central Ave. to the intersection of Stone St., as one-way.

The ordinance will also prohibit parking for the entire length on the west side of Charlotte Place. Public hearing and second reading is scheduled for June 6.

A resolution was approved authorizing the Police Department to sell bicycles and parts of bicycles at a public auction on Saturday, June 5, 1 p.m. at City Hall.

In other business the council:

—Approved a resolution for a refund of overpayment of a water bill.

—Approved a resolution for refund of water service permits.

—Approved a resolution authorizing the acceptance of bids for "Reconstruction of Bond Street."

—Approved a resolution for acceptance of bids for the site of used ex-police cars and one obsolete home made trailer.

200 Club to hold Valor Awards luncheon

Last year, the 200 Club of Union County chose as recipients for their Valor Award two Rahway Police officers, Louis Garry and Paul Meo. Along with fifteen other winners from among Union County's police and fire departments, these two officers were praised for their "uncommon valor."

Officer Louis Garry was honored by the 200 Club for his quick and professional actions in preventing serious injury and possibly preventing a homicide.

Garry, while off duty, saw individuals leave two cars in the middle of the street and begin to argue and assault each other. Garry identified himself, placed all under arrest and requested a resident to call the police for assistance. The participants were armed with clubs, belts, and knives and one person was stabbed. For his quick actions, Garry received the 1985 Valor Award.

Officer Paul Meo was also recommended by his commanding officers for effecting a capture without unnecessary deadly force. While on duty, Meo responded to a call at a gas station in Rahway. He observed two armed men attempting to rob the station, and when approached, one

of the suspects surrendered while the other armed suspect attempted to flee. When confronted by Police, he turned and aimed his weapon at them, and Officer Meo discharged a single shot from his weapon, wounding the suspect in the leg. For his courage in the line of duty, Meo received the 1985 Valor Award.

Football in 1968, the 200 Club has been saluting uniformed men and women who show unusual courage and dedication in their achievements. Consisting of residents and business people, the 200 Club includes over 300 members and provides financial assistance to the widows and families of those who have given their lives in the line of duty.

Anne Moore, president of The 200 Club, pointed to three scholarship programs made possible by the non-profit organization: The Union County 200 Club Memorial Scholarship, available to the dependents of deceased officers who gave their lives while in the line of duty; the Union County 200 Club Scholarship for Academic Excellence awarded to academically deserving children of living uniformed officers; the Union County 200 Club Grant for Continuing Education established to aid those uniformed officers wishing to study advanced subjects pertinent to their field of endeavor. "The success of these programs assures us that we have responded to the need of our uniformed officers in Union County," said Moore.

The Rahway Health Department will hold their free 1986 Annual Anti-Rabies Clinic on Tuesday, May 20, Main Street Firehouse; Wednesday, May 21, Main Street Firehouse; Thursday, May 22, Maple Avenue Firehouse, from 6 to 7 p.m.

Dogs vaccinated in 1984 and 1985 should not attend this clinic. Cats should be vaccinated yearly. Carriers are required for cats. The fee is \$1 for cats.

Dog licenses may be obtained at each clinic site for \$7.20, plus an additional \$3 state fee if the dog has not been neutered.

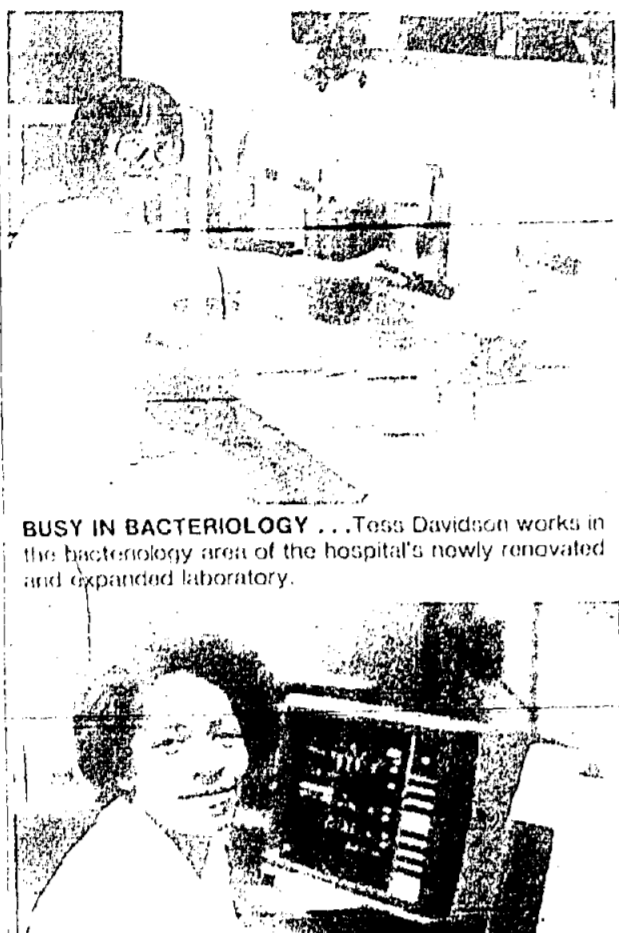

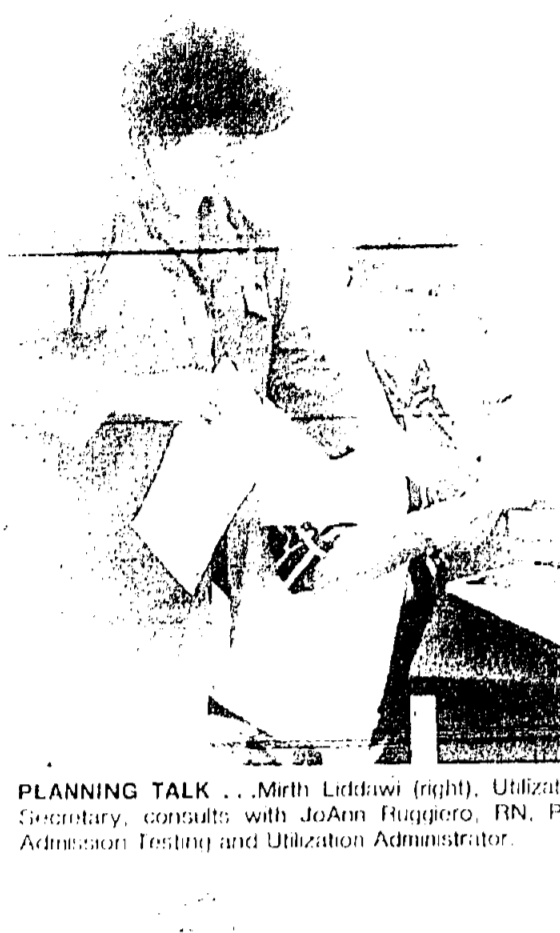

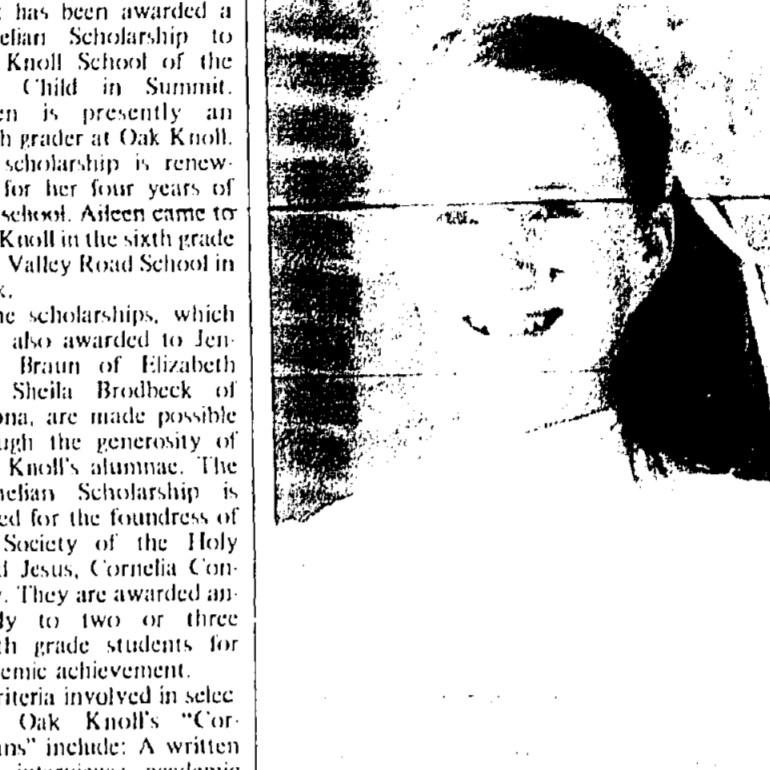

Volunteer discusses Living Will at hospital program

Mrs. Goldberg advised people to openly discuss their feelings and wishes about medical care during a terminal illness with their family and health care providers. The time to uphold the right to make personal decisions about treatment, based on a stipulated right to privacy.

Three out of four sudden deaths are witnessed by bystanders, few of whom know what could be done to save the victim's life. It is estimated that more than 100,000 lives a year could be saved if more people became certified in CPR techniques. Space in the class is limited and advance registration is required. 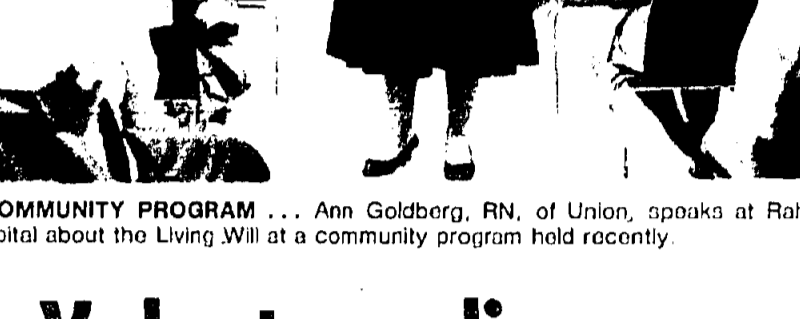

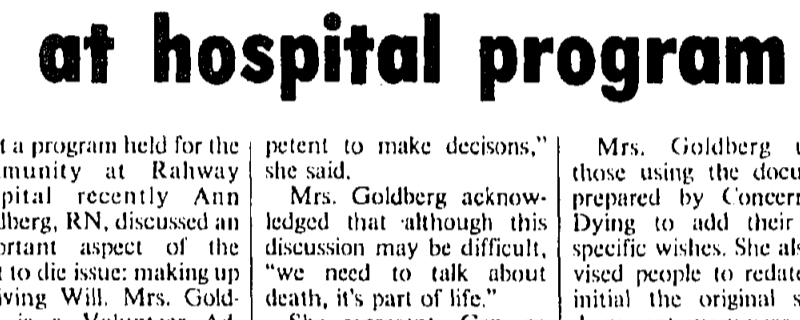

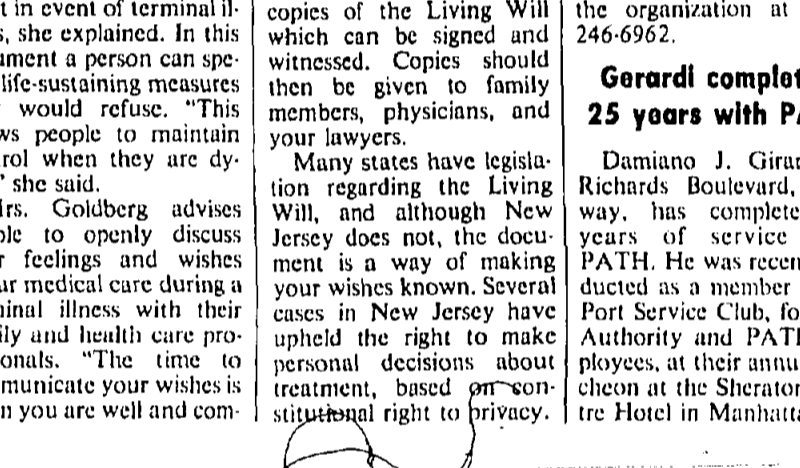
