## Handicapped access work temporarily closes hospital main entrance

Rahway Hospital's main entrance is temporarily closed for approximately two weeks while the driveway and entry area are prepared for handicapped access. Visitors can enter the hospital through a door that time, electrically operated sliding glass doors will be installed. ## HISTORY OF THE FLAG

The United States Flag is the third oldest of the national standards of the world; older than the Union Jack of Britain or the Tricolor of France. The Flag was first authorized by Congress June 14, 1777. This date is now observed as Flag Day throughout

The Flag was first flown from Fort Stanwix, on the site of the present city of Rome, New York, on August 3, 1777. It was first under fire three days later in the Battle of Oriskany, August 6, 1777. It was decreed that there should be a star and a stripe

for each state, making 13 of both, for the states at that time had just been erected from the original 13 colonies. The colors of the Flag may be thus explained: The red is for valor, zeal and fervency; the white for hope, purity, cleanliness of life and rectitude of conduct; the blue, the color of heaven, for reverence to God, loyalty, sincerity, justice and truth.

The star (an ancient symbol of India, Persia and Egypt) symbolizes dominion and sovereignty, as well as lofty aspirations. The constellation of the stars within the union-one star for each state-is emblematic of our federal Constitution, which reserves to the states their individual sovereignty, except as to rights delegated by them to the Federal government

The symbolism of the Flag was thus interpreted by Washington: "We take the stars from heaven, the red from our mother country, separating it by white stripes, thus showing that we have separated from her, and the white stripes shall go down to posterity representing liber-

In 1791, Vermont, and in 1792, Kentucky were admitted to the Union and the number of stars and stripes was raised to 15 in correspondence. As other states came into the Union, it became evident there would be too many stripes. So in 1818, Congress enacted that the number of stripes be reduced and restricted henceforth to 13, representing the 13 original states, while a star should be added for each succeeding state. It symbolizes national independence and popular sovereignty. It is not the flag of a reigning family or royal house, but of over two hundred million free people weld. tle. ed into a Nation, one and inseparable, united not only by community of interest, but by vital unity of sentiment and purpose, a Nation distinguished for the clear individual conception of its citizens alike of their duties and their privileges, their obligations and their rights.




