## School administrators accept salary guides

Guides covering administrative salaries between the Rahway Administrators and Supervisors Association (RASAS) and the Board of Education were approved at a special meeting held on June 16. Salaries for positions not included in the RASAS bargaining unit were also approved for a one-year period. Superintendent of Schools Frank Brunette received an increase of 6.1 percent raising his salary from \$72,095 to \$76,500. Assistant Superintendent of Schools Nicholas Delmonico received a 6.6 percent increase to \$67,000. Board Secretary/Business Administrator Area Supervisors, Principals and Vice Principals, Traditionally, administrators would receive an increase of one quarter percent over that negotiated by the teachers. Contract negotiations last fall gave Rahway Education Association members an increase of 9 and 9.5 per-

cent over two years of a contract. A two-year Letter of Agreement signed granted them less than what was budgeted. "We felt we needed the money in the classrooms," said Munsey, "to apply the dollars to educational programs. I think the administration understood that there was an absolute dollar amount we could spend. Anything above that would be detrimental to the kids."

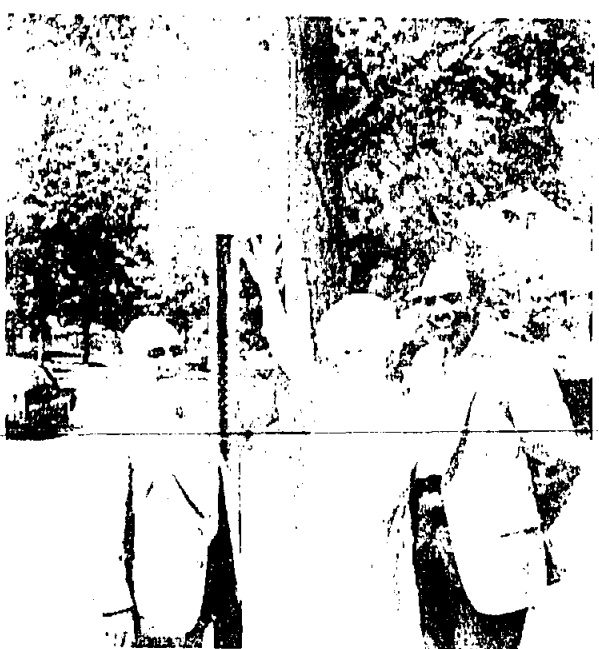

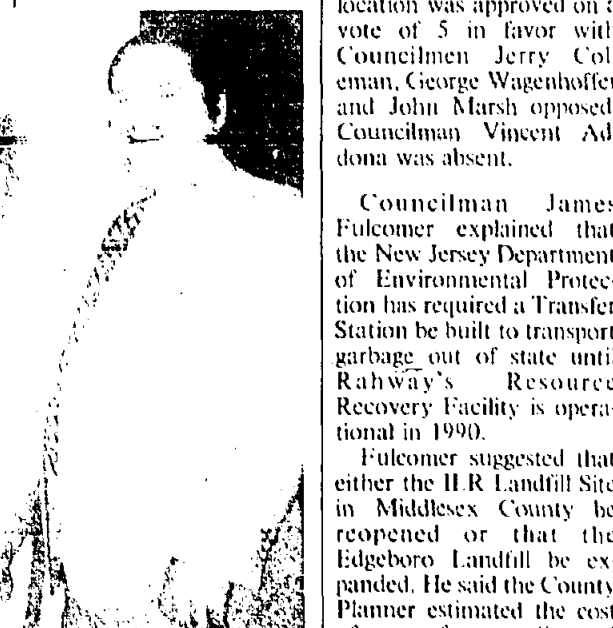

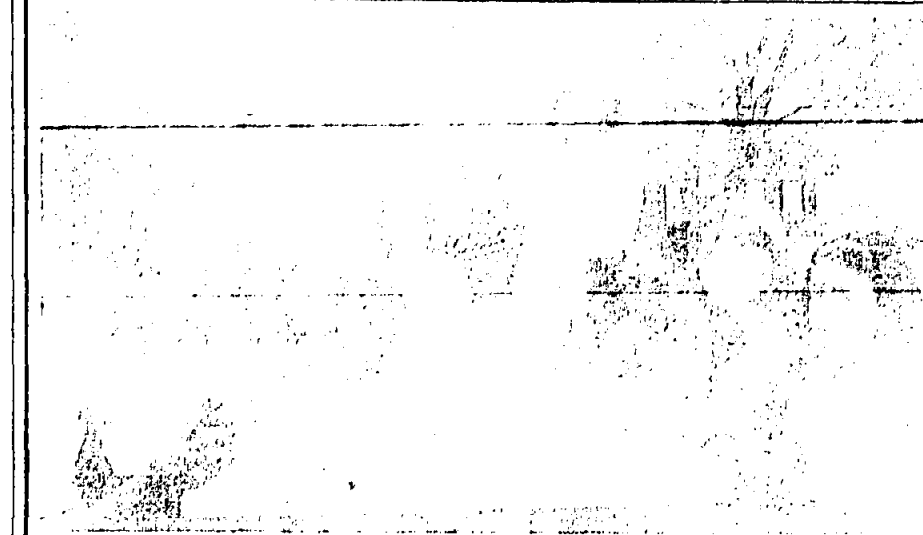

## Council in quandary over City garbage

Amid accusations and arguments and the final departure of the Mayor from his administrative seat to a spectator seat, the Rahway City Council transacted business as usual on June 11. A resolution objecting to the establishment of a Transfer Station for the disposal of Union County garbage to an out-of-state location was approved on a vote of 5 in favor with Councilman Jerry Coleman, George Wagenhoffer and John Marsh opposed. Councilman Vincent Adoma was absent.

Councilman James Fulcomer explained that the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has required a Transfer Station be built to transport garbage out of state until Rahway's Resource Recovery Facility is operational in 1990.

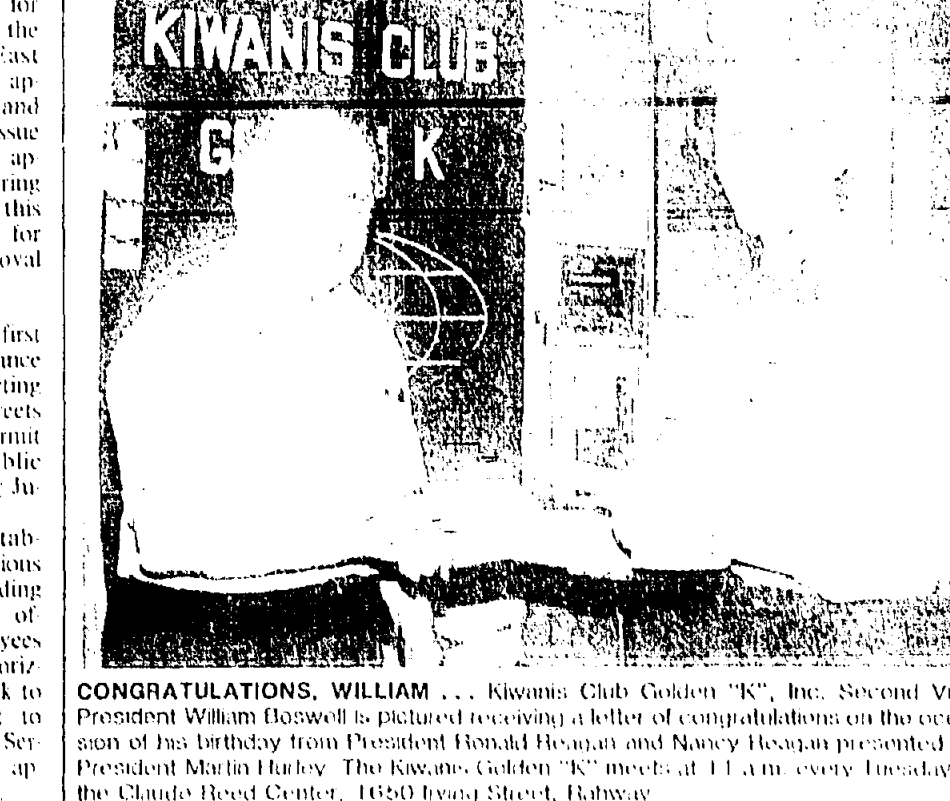
Fulcomer suggested that either the H.R. Landfill Site in Middlesex County be reopened or that the Edgemoor Landfill be expanded. He said the County Planner estimated the cost of out-of-state disposal would be \$100 per household, or \$300,000 for the City.

Brown Ferring, a Union County vendor, has estimated the cost at \$100 per person, or \$2.6 million

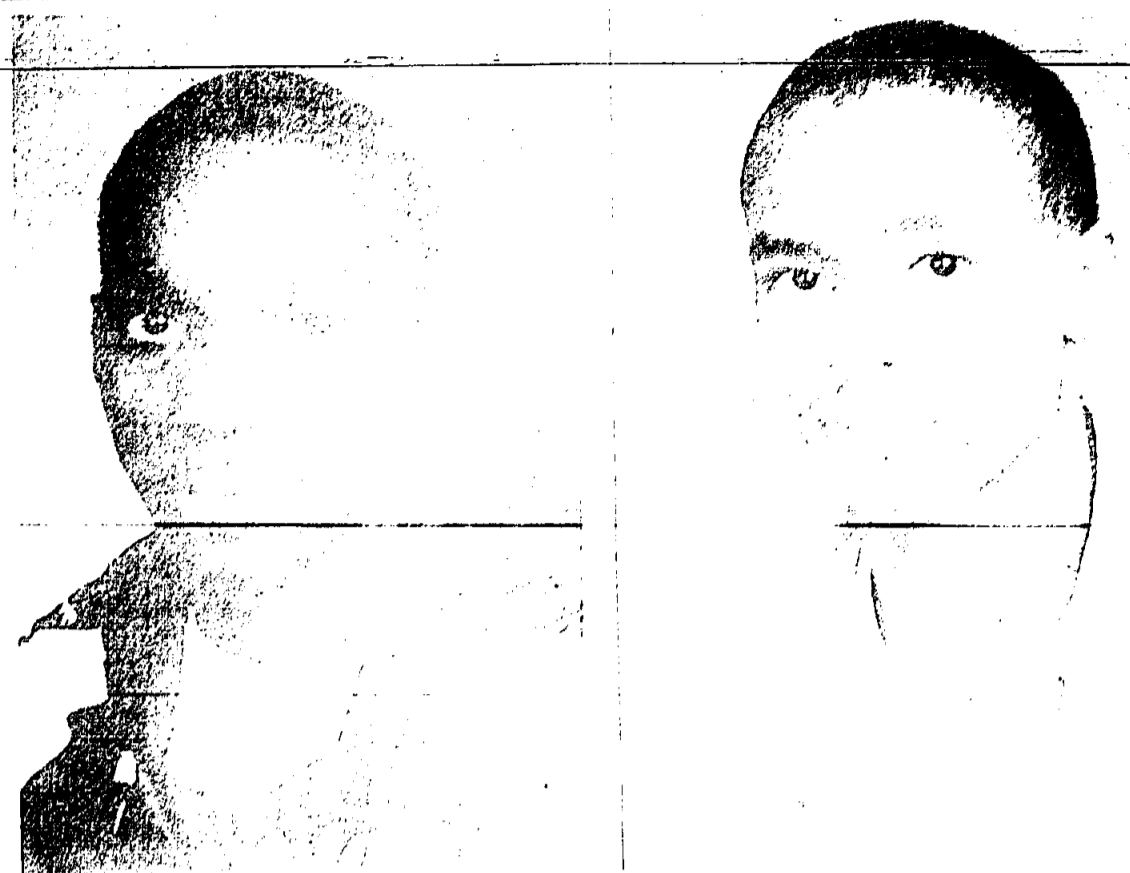

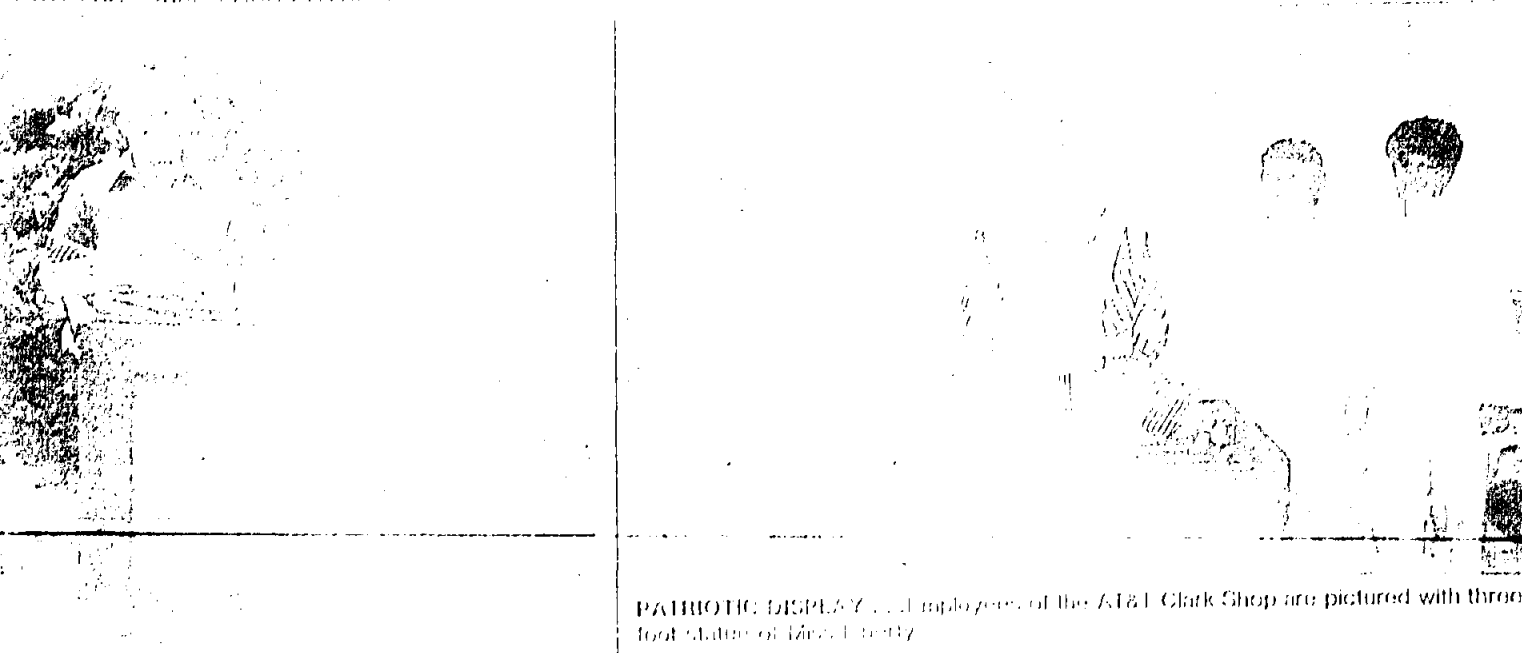

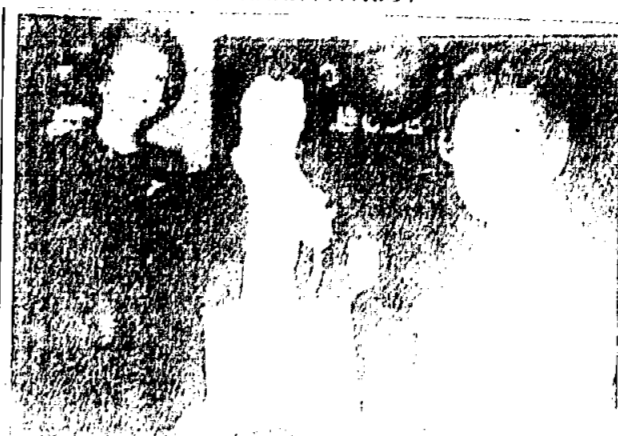

## Statue of Liberty celebration to get strict boat watch by Marine patrols

Colonel Clinton L. Parano, State Police Superintendent, announced that the Marine Law Enforcement Bureau is preparing for the upcoming Statue of Liberty Celebration scheduled for the week of June 29 to July 6. The 100 member Marine Bureau, along with the U.S. Coast Guard and other State and local authorities will be on the waterways to insure the safety of the boating public by strictly enforcing all boating regulations.

Colonel Parano said the spectacular events scheduled for the holiday weekend to honor The Lady are expected to attract to New York Harbor the greatest concentration of pleasure and commercial boats ever. "It has been estimated that as many as 40,000 vessels will be operating on the waters from Sandy Hook Bay to the George Washington Bridge."

Colonel Parano said "The concentration of vessels raises the possibility of accidents occurring through negligence, faulty equipment, lack of knowledge, and the most serious of violations, operating a vessel while under the influence of alcohol or drugs."

Colonel Parano urged boaters not to overload. "With so many people wanting to be aboard a boat in the spectacular Florida, marine police patrols will guard against the potential to overload pleasure and charter crafts heading for the celebration," he said. "There are federal regulations governing the overall loading of commercial vessels and state laws covering the unsafe overloading of pleasure vessels." Most vessels have capacity plates establishing maximum and accumulative persons and poundage.

Violations of overcrowding, resulting in the operation of a vessel in a reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger the life, limb or property of another person may subject the operator to fines or imprisonment. In the event the violation involves a commercial passenger car-

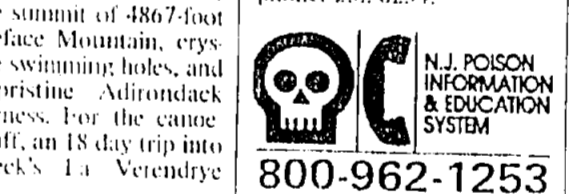
## Camping trips to be conducted for boys, 10-14
