LUST isn't only in the heart

Before Jimmy Carter fold the world about the inner-

feelings of his heart, LUST was more commonly found in criminal or lainly law cases, ft was known as the classic wrongful motive that compelled defendants to commit their crimes. In the decade of the 80's, however, LUST as taken on a whole new meaning. L.U.S. L., as environmental lawyers know it, means a major health problem of Leaking Underground Storage Tank leaking gasoline or oil, which pollutes the land, and more importantly contaminates groundwater. Ground water is the source of drinking water for approximately half of the population of the United States. During the Post WW II era, the massive construction of chemical manufacturing and processing facilities, gasoline stations, airports, and other hazardous storage areas led to the inallations of thousands of underground storage tanks. The Department of Environmental Protection estimates that between 75,000 to 100,000 underground storage tanks are currently leaking in the United States, and an estimated 350,000 tanks may develop leaks within the next five years. Discharges of hazardous substances

occur in three main ways. It spills due to overflow or poor housekeeping, 2) leaks caused by corrosion of tank or pipes, 3) ruptures due to tank weakness, Since groundwater may flow, pollution from 1.4.8.1. problems may either affect residents close to leaking tanks, or as far away as another state, depending on the size of the leak, soil conditions, and water flow. While the problems of L.U.S. L. cases are new in our modern world, the legal remedies protecting victims' rights were established in the earliest laws from England. These Amendments will aid Federal and State agencies to better identify what tank businesses have in the ground and their contents, ibies outbreaks from the records of county health Manufacturers of underground tanks must now comply with new performance standards. Since most older tanks were merely made of steel, their useful lifetime is now at an end. The American Petrofeum Institute estimates that over 90 percent of leaks in steel tanks are from corrosion. These tanks are like underground time bombs with overworked government agencies trying to control each disaster.

Classic signs of L.U.S. L. problems include odors of gasoline or oi', especially after a rainy period, oily tastes in water, and shinanery colors in water. A property owner or resident should immediately call the local Fire Department, Board of Health, or, best of all, the State Department of Environmental Protection Action Line (609) 292 7172. Keep a diary of all events that happen. Take down the names and titles of all persons you speak with. and what they tell you. Ask for copies of all reports, and under no circumstances ignore a persistent problem. Consult an attorney experienced in environmental
