## Rep. Rinaldo to sponsor energy standards bill

A senior Republican member of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, Rep. Matthew J. Rinaldo, R-N.J., recently said he will reintroduce the home appliance energy standards bill when the new Congress convenes in January.

"The President was all in favor of rejecting the bill which had the backing of an unlikely coalition of appliance makers, consumer advocates and utilities," Rinaldo said. "It would have cut consumer energy costs, deflected the need for up to 10 new power plants, and replaced a patchwork of state codes with a single national standard."

President Reagan pocket vetoed the bill, the National Energy Conservation Act of 1986, after the 99th Congress completed its business and adjourned for the November 4 elections. He opposed it on the grounds that it interfered with the marketplace, consumer choice and the prerogatives of the states to set their own standards.

"I hope the President's veto is simply an opportunity deferred and not lost," Rinaldo said in announcing that he will sponsor the bill in the new Congress and press for its approval early in the session. "It's a good measure that would conserve energy, save money, and it has the support of the Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers, the American Council for an Energy Efficient Economy, which is a non-profit conservation organization, and the Edison Electric Institute, an association representing investor-owned utilities."

The proposed standards would have required most new home appliances, such as refrigerators, freezers, ranges and dishwashers, to use from 15 to 25 percent less electricity or natural gas. To reduce the economic impact on the appliance industry, the new standards

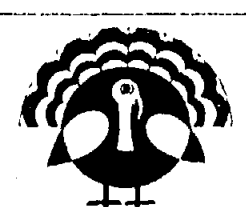
would have been phased in over a four year period to allow manufacturers sufficient time to retool their assembly lines.

The American Council for an Energy Efficient Economy calculated that based on the current cost of electricity, the bill would have saved consumers \$78 billion—or about \$400 per household—by the year 2000. It further estimated that the more efficient appliances would have obviated the need for 10 new power plants, capable of generating 22,000 megawatts of electricity. Household appliances account for about 30 percent of all residential energy consumption and nearly 25 percent of total U.S. energy consumption.

Rinaldo said the appliance industry backed the bill because it pre-empted a position of state appliance standards that make it costly and difficult to plan for appliance production, and utility companies liked the measure because it would have improved their ability to forecast future electrical requirements. U.S. utility companies have tacked over \$20 billion, according to the Department of Energy data, to generate energy for demand that has not materialized. The cost of the unused capacity is being passed along to consumers.

In rejecting the administration's position of non-interference in the marketplace, Rinaldo said, "It's better to have a little bit of regulation in the form of standards to which all concerned have agreed than to have much more regulation in the form of conflicting state standards or an arbitrary and costly federal title that may be issued by the Department of Energy in the absence of company consent. A costly federal consumer choice argument is not compelling because a large percentage of home appliances are purchased by

builders, contractors, and landlords who have no incentive to buy energy efficient products, because they generally do not pay the operating costs.

## Proposed "downtown management" draws protest from business owners

Over 40 business and property owners met to discuss a proposed Special Improvement District and management corporation for the downtown area last week at an informational meeting held on Nov. 19 at City Hall.

Business Administrator Joseph Hartnett explained that the administration had been approached by a group of business men, led by Mike Freda, former owner of Soundarama on Main St., to start a centralized promotional and marketing corporation and to hire a manager to oversee advertising and promotional work.

Funding would be by an ordinance creating a special assessment in the downtown area, the cost to be shared on a fair basis among properties. The actual dollars would be determined by the assessed value of the property.

With a proposed budget of \$30,000 and a proposed rate of .00589, a building assessed at \$40,000 would be taxed an additional \$233.60, to be "paid through the regular tax bill. A building assessed at \$100,000 would pay an additional \$589 in taxes.

Richard Horling, President of Anthony's Key Shop on Irving Street, one of the opponents of the plan, "I'm totally against this," said Horling. "I won't bring anyone business into town. I pay enough taxes now. Horling said he is presently paying almost \$7,000 in taxes on his property. "You could park as it is," continued Horling. "Our customers, pet junkies right away. Anytime anything is done for the downtown area, it is always for Main and Cherry Streets."

Bruce Schwartz, Vice President of Cliff Hardware on Irving Street was also against the plan. "We at Cliff Hardware are opposed for many reasons. We shouldn't bear the brunt of the burden of taxes to support Main Street. People don't realize that the cen-

tral committee has focus on Irving Street," said Schwartz. He said the City would not be involved in the corporation other than to approve an ordinance creating the special improvement district.

"There is no way the City can force this program. Our philosophy is not to impose our plans as to what should be done. Whether downtown Rahway lives or dies is in your hands," said Hartnett.

There are no vacant stores and it has the bulk of taxable income. We shouldn't be responsible for carrying the rest of the town," Ken Clebak, owner of Ken's Beauty Shop on Cherry Street complained of letterers and "hums" in the back of his property. "I think there are other priorities," said Clebak. "Money should be spent to clean up the downtown area." He said that he had called the police on several occasions but was told they could do nothing.

Thomas Graybill, President of The Rahway Savings Institution on Irving Street, said he understood it to be illegal to spot tax areas and that his attorneys would be advised to look in to litigation if the plan went through. "Our major concern is not to deprive business people the opportunity

to make a living," said Graybill. "But we can assure you that when an increase goes on your tax bill, it will not come off."

Simon Kabilas of MacArthur's Pub on Main St. asked why only 149 letters advising of the meeting were sent out to businesses in the downtown area. "Why not the entire business district?" asked Kabilas. "If the businesses on St. Georges Avenue and Grand Avenue were in it too it might be more successful."

"Everyone agrees. Rahway is going down," said James Bigelow of Wood's Fish Hut on Cherry Street. "Everyone wants to do something about it, but we're going about it the wrong way. Money is not the important thing here

tonight. People would spend money if they knew they'd get results. Call everyone know they can add their input. There are alternatives, not just yes and no answers."

Mike Freda, who recently sold Soundarama on Main Street after 19 years of ownership, directed the questions and comments from businessmen.

"Rahway needs help," said Freda. "The town has a lot of possibilities. Property owners are worried about the dollar but others are also worried about business. If the people in Rahway, if they are property owners or not, can't see past their nose they have a problem. Some people only care about the almighty dollar."

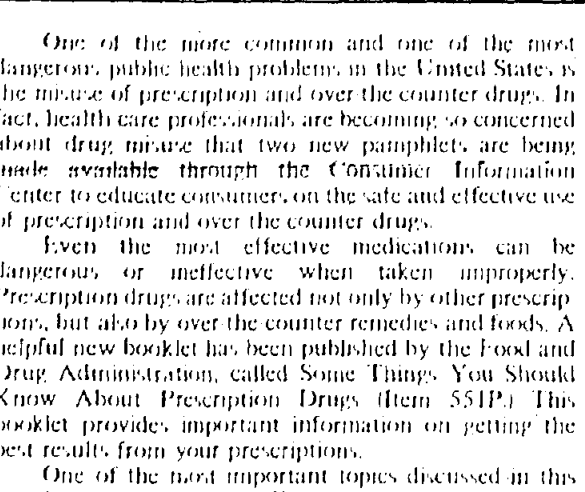

One of the more common and one of the most dangerous public health problems in the United States is the misuse of prescription and over-the-counter drugs. In fact, health care professionals are becoming concerned about drug misuse that two new pamphlets are being made available through the Consumer Information Center to educate consumers on the safe and effective use of prescription and over-the-counter drugs.

Even the most effective medications can be dangerous or ineffective when taken improperly. Prescription drugs are affected not only by other prescription drugs, but also by over-the-counter remedies and foods. A helpful new booklet has been published by the Food and Drug Administration, called "Some Things You Should Know About Prescription Drugs." It is 52 pp. The booklet provides important information on getting the best results from your prescription.

Some drugs, such as those discussed in this booklet, are drug interactions. When your doctor gives you a prescription be sure to let the doctor know about any other prescription medications you are taking. Some drugs interact with other drugs, with a variety of results. Sometimes two drugs taken in combination will decrease each other's effectiveness, others will increase potency, still others will cause side effects like nausea, dizziness, or headache. Non-prescription drugs, alcohol, and smoking can also affect how other drugs work.

Some drugs also are affected by food intake. If your doctor prescribes a prescription be sure to ask when to take it. Some drugs should be taken before meals and other with meals. Also, certain foods can negatively interact with drugs.

Does Your Medicine Chest Need First Aid? Item 54579 is another helpful new booklet recently published by the Food and Drug Administration. This booklet offers suggestions on what should be kept in the average family medicine cabinet and for how long. This guide of helpful hints on drug storage and disposal as well as how to organize your medicine chest so that it contains only those drugs which your family needs. Some many drugs lose their potency after they have been opened, a six-month to one year supply is adequate for most families. Expired prescription medications should be flushed down the toilet and their containers disposed of so that children cannot get to them. All current medications should be clearly labeled and dated, to avoid accidentally taking the wrong medication.

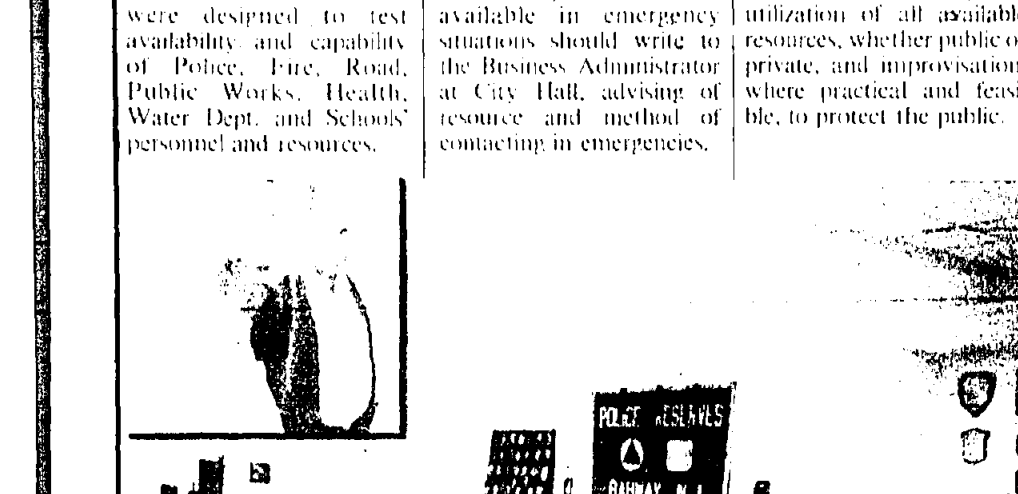

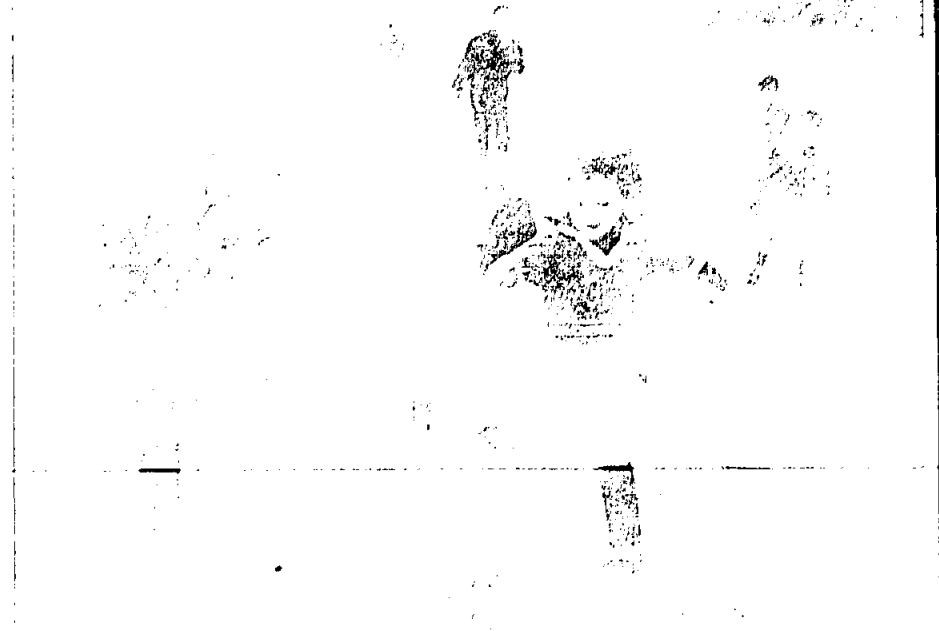

### Forfeiture acts against criminals benefit county

As a result of Prosecutor John H. Stamler's aggressive forfeiture policy, the County of Union now holds title to a luxury boat, a \$12,000 sports car and \$59,627 in cash.

The civil action judgment, announced by Stamler as the latest in a series of forfeiture acts against criminals, was signed by Superior Court Judge Alfred M. Wolm against Herman Orozco.

Orozco was sentenced by Wolm in connection with his role in a major cocaine distribution deal, a network uncovered by the Narcotics Strike Force when its members executed a search warrant and seized 517.8 grams, over a pound, of 78.4 per cent pure cocaine.

Described by authorities as "a major dealer who sold only to a select group of high-level dealers in bulk quantities," Orozco was the subject of an intensive investigation.

The boat, a 1984 Sea Ray purchased in 1984 for \$11,693, was said to be purchased with the proceeds of Orozco's sale operation. "This is a first for the county," Stamler said recently. "We will be exploring the possibility of having it utilized by the scuba team of the Union County Police."

Under the prosecutor's direction, the office files a civil complaint seeking title to cars and properties within 90 days of their seizure. The property, which can include all conveyances, property or monies, must be used in furtherance of or a result of the proceeds of criminal activity.

Since the first of the year, she explained, judgments have been secured totaling over \$201,129 to the county treasury. In addition, title to 33 vehicles, seized by law enforcement officers, were also wrested from their owners.

When local police department investigations, the prosecutor's office handles the forfeiture. As a result, for example, Elizabeth has a 1972 Toyota Corolla. Cranford a 1984 Olds Cutler, Plainfield a 1977 Cadillac DeVille, Hillside a 1982 Dodge Van and Westfield a 1983 Olds Toronado.

Pending is a claim for title to a two-story pharmacy in Hillside, but the boat is a first for the county.

"We're hitting the thieves, and dope dealers right where it hurts in the wallets and pocketbooks," Stamler said.

Assistant Prosecutor Susan Scatola, who handles the civil forfeiture complaints, said the county also picked up a 1984 Toyota Supra worth about \$12,000 and the currency.

Orozco was sentenced to a 15-year term in state prison and will not be eligible for parole consideration until 1992, according to Assistant Prosecutor James A. Hart.
