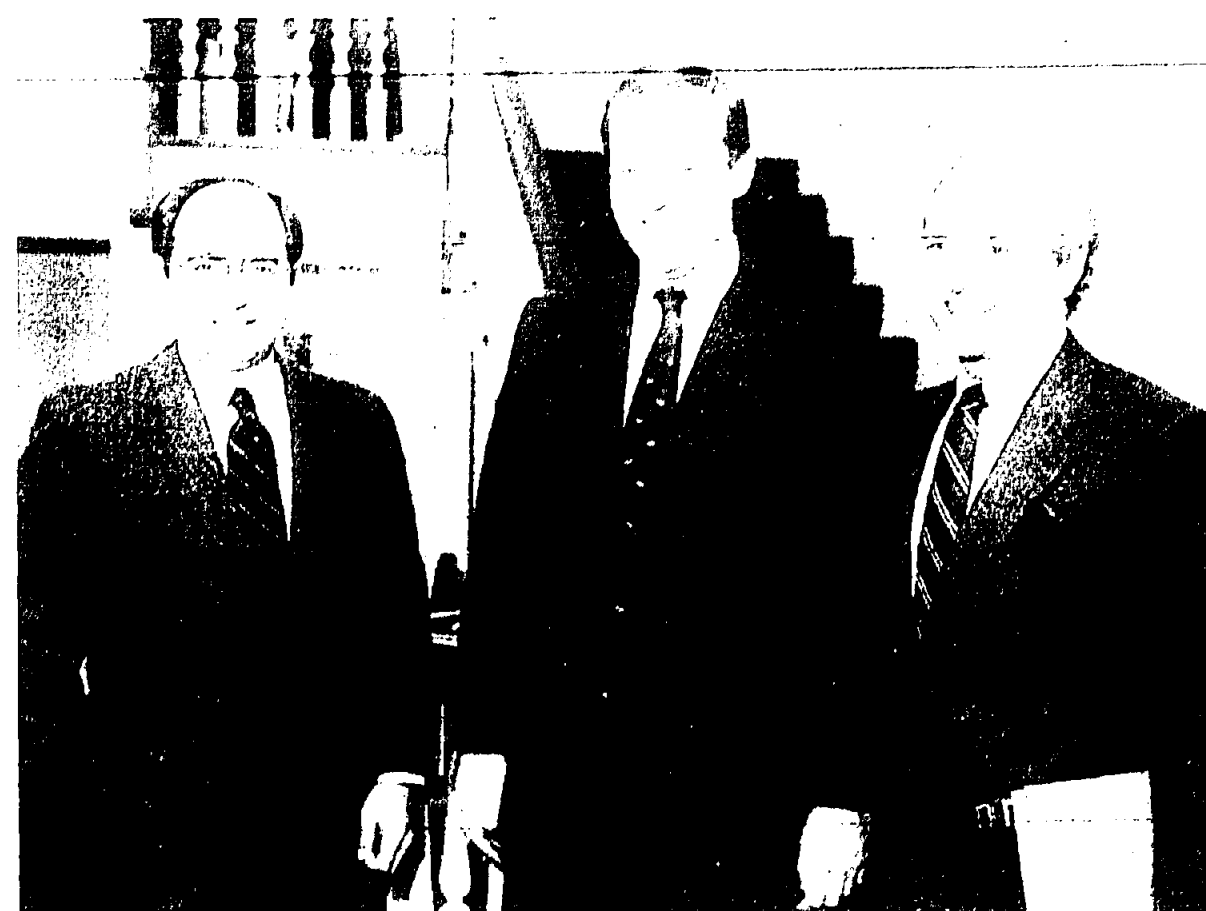

A Public Works crew was dispatched to the site of the "Minnis" tree. It was patient - just right!

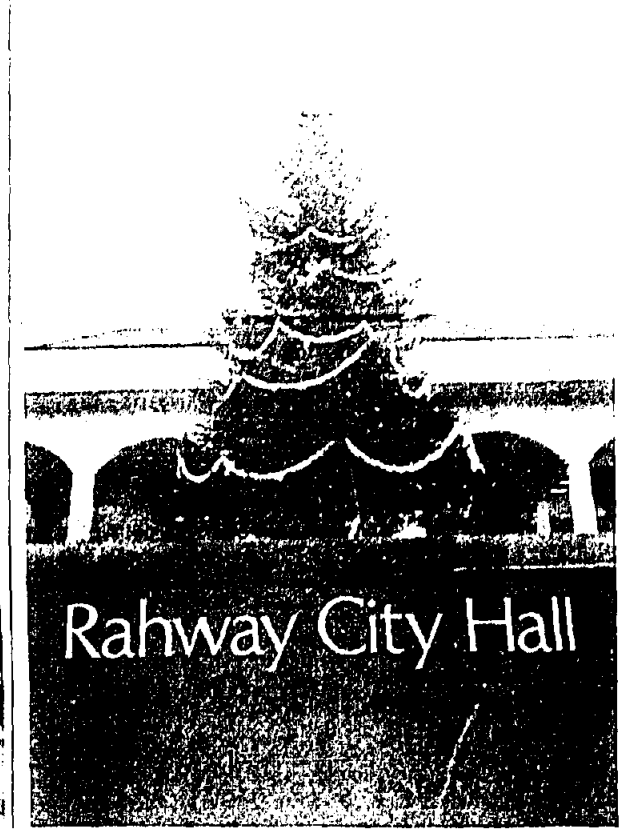
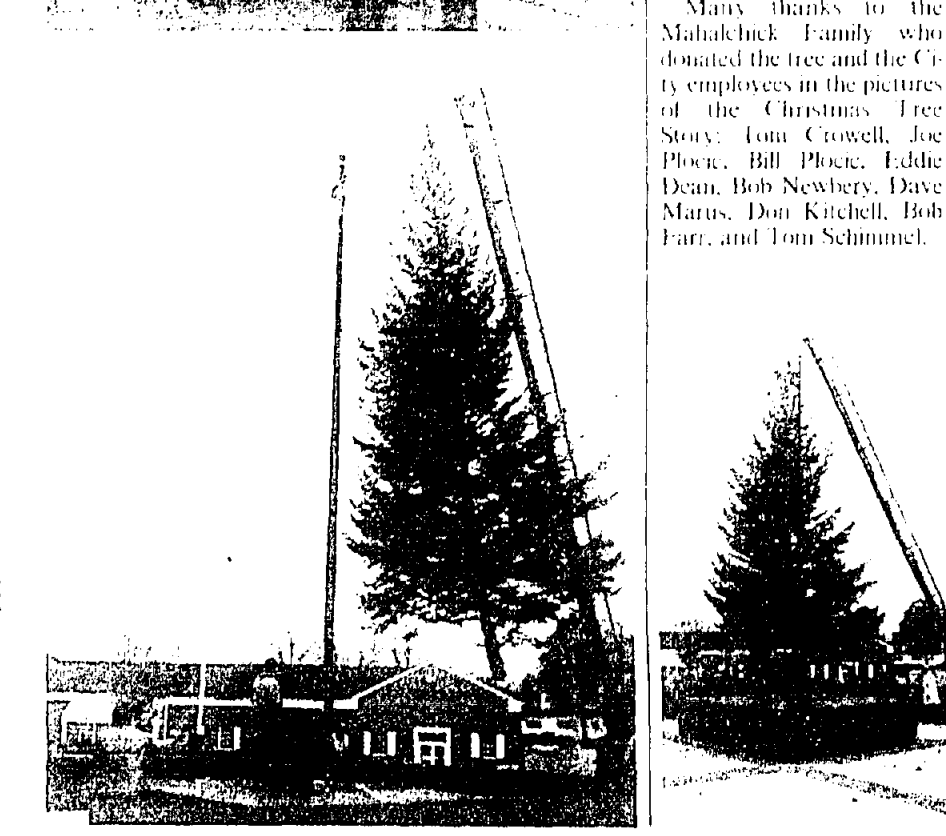
With ropes and a crane the tree was hoisted. On a truck, for the trip to the center of town.

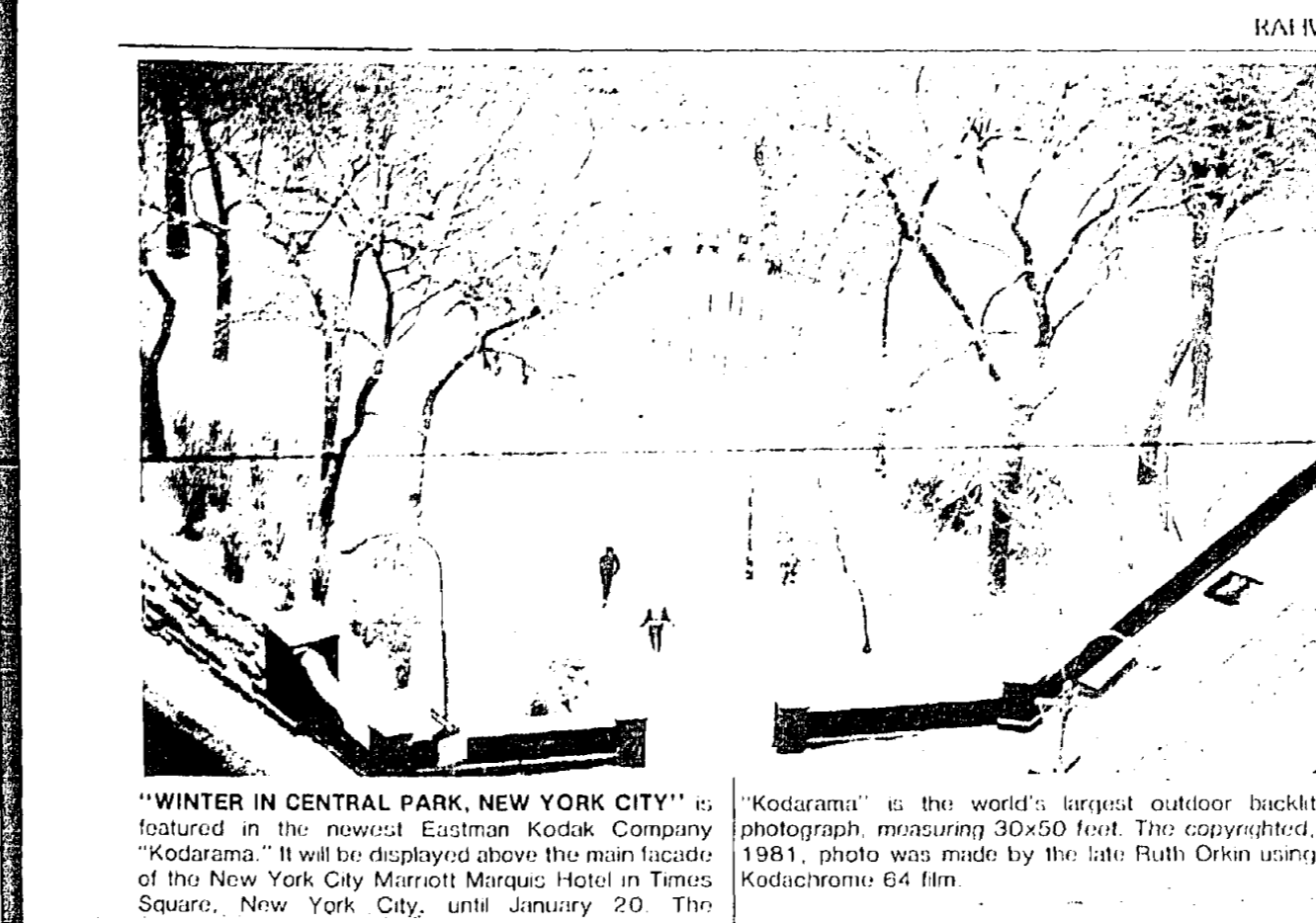
**TAKE MY WORD FOR IT**

We are frequently stopped at crosswalks by common words or expressions that are really quite strange when we examine them carefully. The word **word** is a good example of such words. 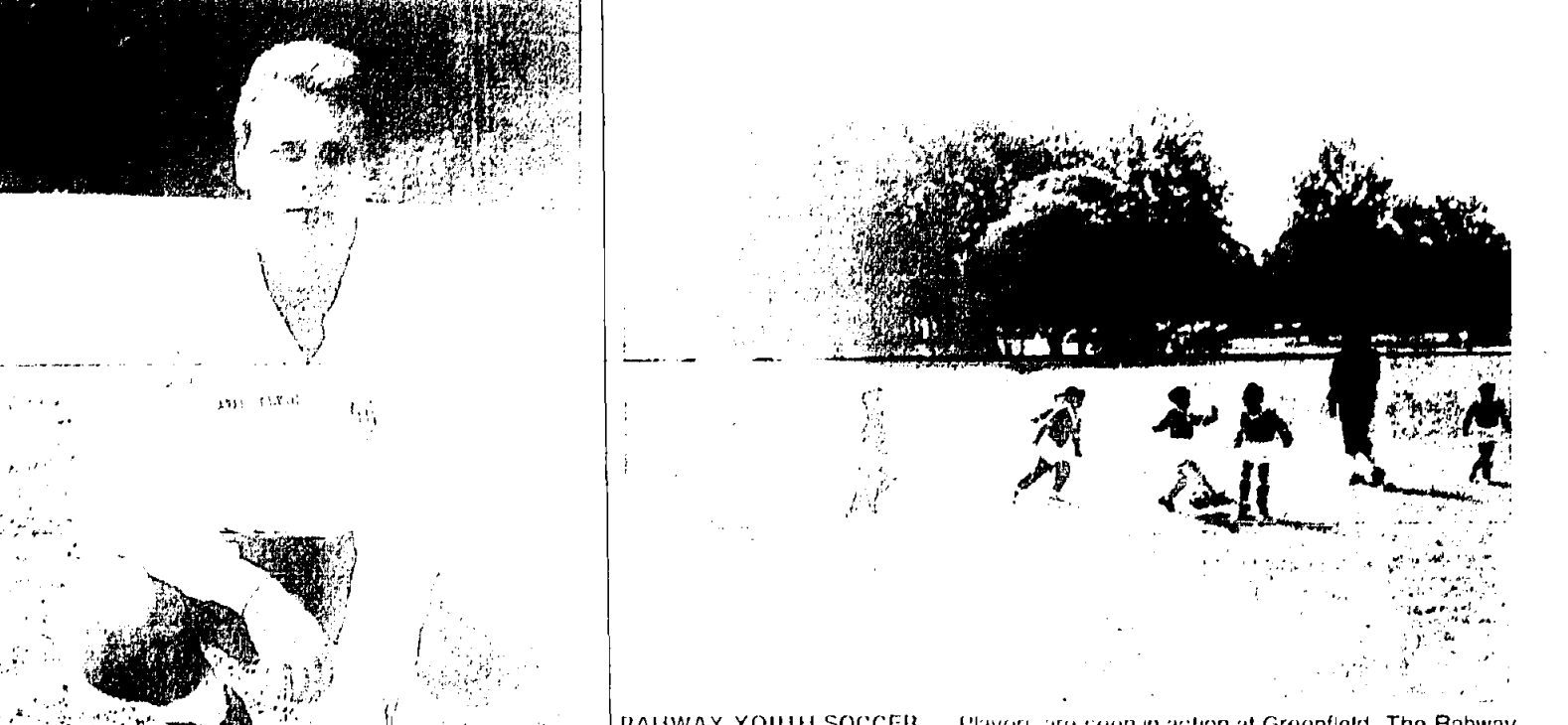

The Union County Division of Consumer Affairs advises mail order shoppers who want the merchandise delivered before the holidays not procrastinate another day.

**What Can I do?**

If your order is not sent when promised? You can cancel your order for a complete refund. The rule requires that the seller mail you an "option notice" if the promised shipping date can't be met. This notice tells you the new shipping date and includes a postage free way for you to cancel your order for a complete refund or to agree to a new shipping date. If the company cannot meet the new shipping date, it must send you a second option notice. Your order will automatically be cancelled unless you sign the second notice and return it to the company.

**If I cancel My Order After Receiving An Option Notice, What Should My Refund Be Sent?**

If your order was paid by cash, check, or money order, the rule states that a refund must be mailed within seven business days. If the sale was by credit, the seller must mail the papers that adjust your account within one billing cycle.

## Merck lists new drug discoveries

Merck & Co., Inc. recently filed a New Drug Application requesting Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approval to market lovastatin, a Merck drug discovery for lowering high levels of cholesterol.

"Lovastatin is a promising cholesterol-lowering agent discovered by Merck scientists. In long-term clinical trials, lovastatin continues to show a high degree of safety and more effectiveness than any known drug in reducing the elevated levels of low-density lipoproteins that are correlated with coronary heart disease," said Dr. P. Roy Vagelos, chairman and chief executive officer of the health products company.

Merck announced it had just received FDA approvals to market Noroxin, an oral antimicrobial for urinary tract infections, and Vasoretic, a cardiovascular drug that combines the company's antihypertensive Vasotec with Merck's long-established diuretic HydroDiuril.

The company will simultaneously introduce in the United States both Noroxin and Pepidol, a recently approved H<sub>2</sub> receptor antagonist for con-

rol of duodenal ulcers. Vasoretic will be introduced in the United States in the first quarter of 1987, followed by introductions abroad later that year. The company expects that physicians will often choose this product for patients whose high blood pressure is difficult to control.

"Merck today is on the crest of an unprecedented wave of new products," Dr. Vagelos told a meeting of the New York Society of Security Analysts this afternoon.

Commenting on two major drugs that Merck introduced in the United States earlier this year, Dr. Vagelos said, "The U.S. expectations, which are very high. We continue to demonstrate to members of the medical community the product's broad spectrum and economic value, as reasons for them to make Primaxin, where indicated, their first choice of therapy," Dr. Vagelos said.

He added that Recombivax HB, Merck's genetically engineered hepatitis B vaccine, was approved this summer for marketing in the United States and Germany. U.S. introduction will take place in January; the product is already on the market in Germany. He noted that this is the first vaccine for human use that is based on recombinant DNA technology.

The angiotensin converting enzyme inhibitor Prinivil is performing well in clinical trials and will broaden Merck's base in the rapidly growing angiotensin converting enzyme inhibitor market, the Merck executive said. In this country, Merck filed a New Drug Application in April.

Ahead, the company plans to introduce the product late next year or early in 1988.

As announced last month, Merck has granted a license on Prinivil to Imperial Chemical Industries PLC; both companies will market the product, under separate trademarks. In return, Merck obtained from Imperial Chemical Industries a license on Stutill, an aldose reductase inhibitor that is in early Phase III clinical trials as a treatment for complications of diabetes. Both companies will market this product, too, under separate trademarks. "We seized this opportunity to gain access to a potentially important product candidate in the diabetes field, where we now have no products," Dr.
