She is promp "stolen" from the two baddies by three incompetent yer likable soldiers of fortune played with wit by Wallace Shawn; with strength by Andre the Giant; and with dashing bravado by Mandy Patinkin. When the gallant Wesley returns and finds his beloved Buttercup missing. the search is on and he nobley braves every obstacle im

aginable in his quest to find her. Indeed, the thrilling scale up the seven cliffs of insanity and her plunge into the river of giant, shricking eels are true audience nail biters. But my personal favorites were the continuous swordfights exhibited by the prin cipal actors which will harken audiences back to the glorious age of movie swashbuckling when heroes such as Firol Flynn and Tyrone_Power duelled the heavies for fame, fortune and romance. This romantic spirit is alive and well in "The Princess Bride," making it a nostalgic moviegoing experience. Director Rob Reiner ("Stand by Me") accomplishes

the impossible task of combining old fashioned sentimen-

tality with modern cynicism. Thus, while poking fun at

the outrageous action, he makes it palatable as well. Bravo, Mr. Reiner!
