"Drug-free" programs approved for schools

The Rahway Board of Education approved the Chemical Health Education Curriculum in grades Pre-K through 12 at their regular meeting held last week.

The district is required to have a curriculum for the Chemical Health Program, according to Superintendent of Schools Frank Brunette. "The program is to provide activities and instruction on the dangers of chemical substances," said Brunette.

Jackie Torricello is the Chemical Health Counselor for the program. An application under Governor Thomas Kean's "Blueprint For a Drug-Free New Jersey" in the amount of \$36,720 for an elementary Substance Abuse Coordinator was also approved by the board.

The program is in cooperation with the State of New Jersey and is to develop activities that are designed to rid our schools of drugs," said Brunette. The program is yet to be developed and is still on the drawing boards," said Brunette.

The board also accepted the gift of a scoreboard from the Rahway Savings Institution valued at \$2,500 for use in the high school gym and approved payment of \$5,394.24 to Jeffrey and Kallaur, Consulting Engineers for lighting work at Roosevelt School, the intermediate school and the high school.

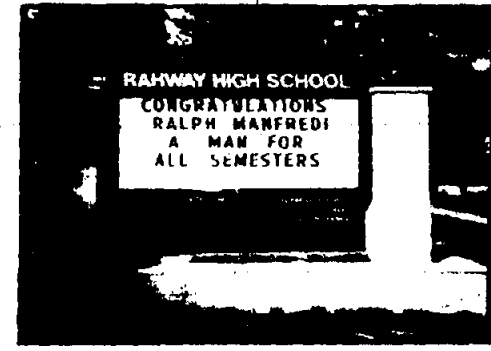
In 1975 he was appointed to serve as vice principal of the junior high school.

'Talking' van visits schools

"Deputy Dan, the Talking Safety Van" was on duty this week providing safety information to students in Rahway's elementary schools.

The New Jersey Automobile Club Foundation for Safety, a non-profit subsidiary of the AAA New Jersey Automobile Club based in Florham Park, introduced "Deputy Dan" in April 1986. Since that time "Dan" has traveled thousands of miles visiting schools, fairs and recreational facilities. This is his first visit to Rahway.

Detective Sergeant Robert Disko of the Police Department said "Deputy Dan" would be providing Halloween safety tips for students this week. "The van is not that old," said Disko. "At the end of the last school year, two elementary schools sent me pictures of schools in New

Jersey where they saw this program. Soon after Triple A sent letters stating its availability. There was a discussion between myself, juvenile officers and the traffic bureau. The chief agreed that it would be a good program."

Police Detective Marc Schwartzback and Police Officer Gary Kostura from the Traffic Bureau presented "Deputy Dan" to students at St. Mary's School, Franklin School, Grover Cleveland Roosevelt School and Madison School in a week long informational campaign.

"Deputy Dan" is a 1985 burgundy Dodge mini van, with multi-colored illustrations of the following safety reminders: One on a bike, bike right; Look all ways before crossing; When you don't know, don't go; Duck away from between parked

cars; Help your safety patrol.

Cartoon characters Mighty Mouse and McGruff, the Dog, appear on the van. In addition, "Deputy Dan" wears eyeglasses, a deputy's hat and a bow tie. "Dan" distributes pamphlets, booklets and safety-related giveaways.

"Deputy Dan" is equipped with a two-way radio, microphone and speakers that allow the van operator to converse with children and hear their questions. "Dan" also has a PA system that produces animal sounds, sirens and wails.

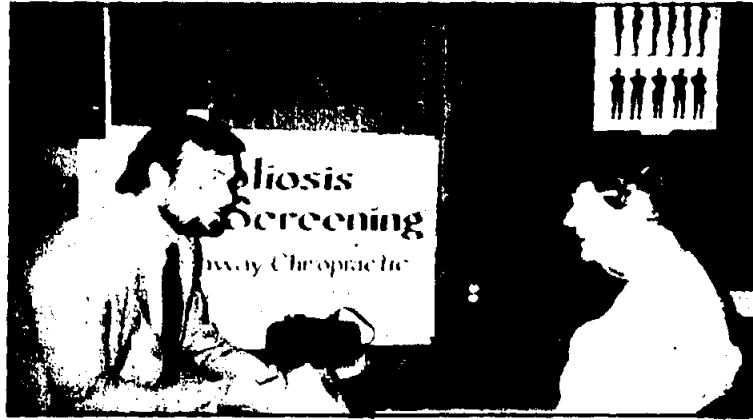
City Hall for residents concerned with their health and well-being. Services included oral screening for cancer, senior

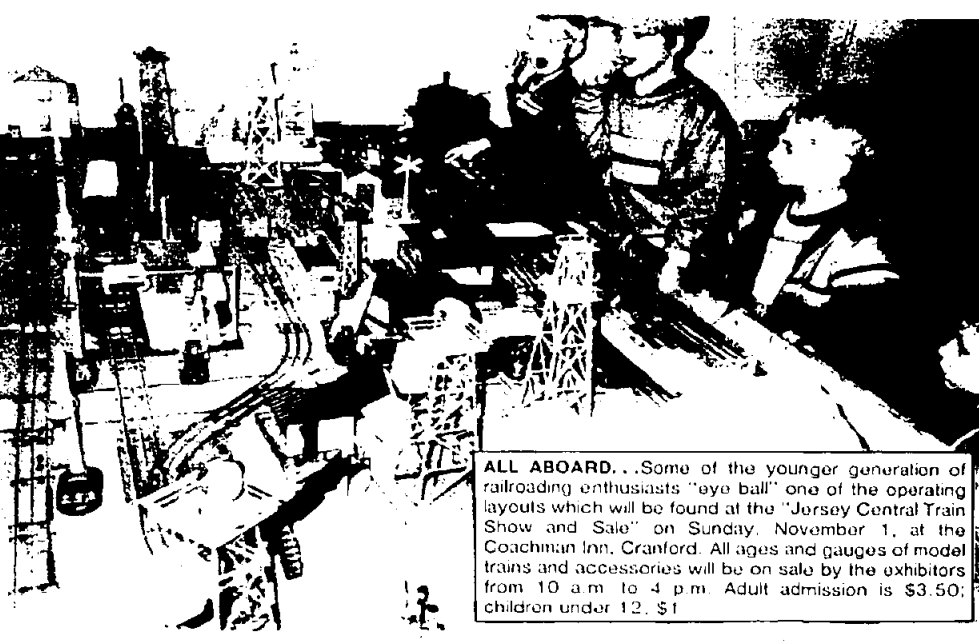
