Emergency funds needed for garbage

Rahway's Municipal Council approved a resolution creating an emergency appropriation of \$268,356 to cover the costs of increased tipping fees for solid waste disposal at their regular meeting held last week.

"This resolution is to provide additional appropriations to pay the increased tipping fees at the Edgeboro Landfill," said Business Administrator Joseph Hartnett.

Tipping fees at the landfill in New Brunswick have increased from \$17 per ton to \$57 per ton, he said, and the current balance in the City's Garbage Collection Contractual account is \$3,000.

"Under state law, if there is no money in the budget and an emergency comes up, the law provides that you pass an emergency appropriation that goes against next year's taxes," said Hartnett.

Hartnett said that after careful review his recommendation, based on the past two months' increase in tipping fees, estimates a needed \$60,000 per month for the balance of the year. Tipping fees for September amounted to \$61,270 and October's fees totalled \$53,946, he said.

The emergency appropriation includes a \$10,000 contingency amount to cover costs incurred by the recycling program, increased costs for dumpsters which went from \$275 to between \$750-1,100 depending on weight and costs that might be incurred with respect to the Department of Environmental Protection's determination for leave collection.

"It is a prudent and conservative approach at this time," said Hartnett. "Next year we will have a full blown budget to deal with this garbage crisis."

Three percent home loans are available in Rahway

Mayor Daniel L. Martin has announced funds are still available from the City for eligible citizens wanting to undertake repairs to their homes.

The program provides eligible residents the opportunity to make needed repairs with a loan of only three percent interest.

The Mayor, indicating that "this is the best interest rate available in today's market" urged citizens to make application for the loans immediately, since loans are given generally on a "first come, first served basis."

Police raises near approval

Police officers will get a raise if an ordinance is given final approval by the Municipal Council at their next meeting in December.

An ordinance was amended and approved for first reading at a meeting held on November 9 by the council which raises police salaries.

Effective October 1, 1987, a police captain will go from \$46,559 to \$47,490; a police lieutenant will go from \$41,210 to \$42,034; police sergeant from \$36,477 to \$37,207; and police officers, grade 1, from \$32,233 to \$32,878; grade 2, from \$26,017 to \$26,537; grade 3 from \$24,826 to \$25,323; and grade 4, from \$22,515 to \$22,515.

School traffic crossing guards will be compensated at a range of \$16.63 to \$21.87 per day.

The council also approved an amended ordinance adding commercial, industrial and institutional businesses to the recycling program. The original ordinance only pertained to residential items.

Included in the recycling program for commercial, industrial and institutional solid waste separation are uncontaminated, clean, corrugated cardboard (non-food containers), office paper (computer print-out), computer tabular cards and white ledger.

Glass, aluminum cans, used newspaper and leaves must be kept separate from trash and commercial solid waste.

All of these ordinances will come before the council for final adoption at a public hearing on December 14 in council chambers.

Suffrage

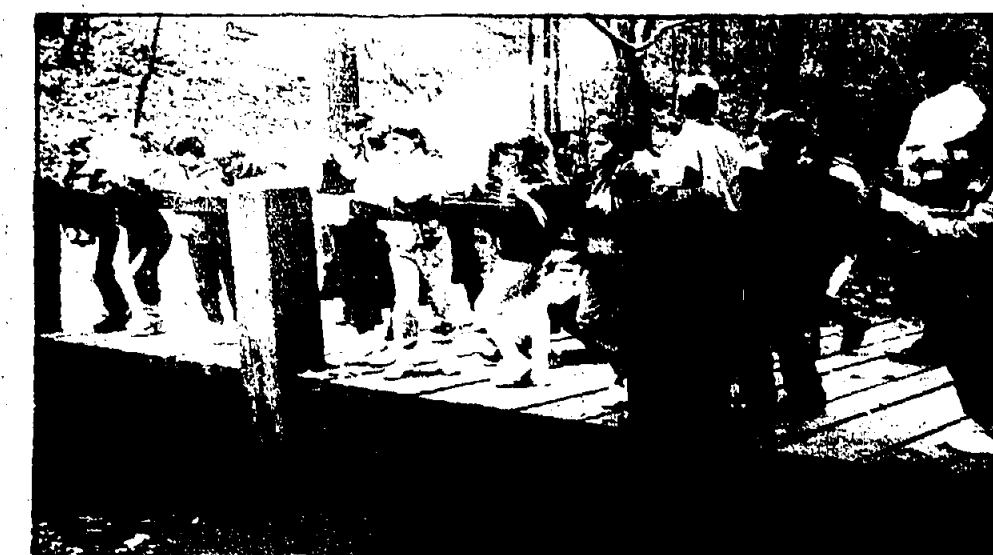
Grover Cleveland (President 1885-89, 1893-97) was probably the last U.S. President to publicly reveal his male chauvinist tendencies. In 1905 he said, "Sensible and responsible women do not want to vote. Warming the right to vote was a major step in the ongoing battle waged by women to achieve equal social and economic status with men. How did women achieve their precious goal of suffrage? The origin of this interesting word provides a clue."

Suffrage, "the right or privilege to vote," combines the Latin elements *frangere* ("to break," a verb "into pieces," suggestive of "the noise made by a crowd shouting its collective approval or disapproval," *suffix*), a later word resulting from this merger, means "sounding a bell, avert or shout of approval."

The long and very vocal war waged by women to obtain voting rights paid off in 1920 with the passage of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution. President Cleveland had indeed proved to be a poor judge of the deeply held aspirations of women.

The noise that caused the initial barriers to full suffrage for women to fall like "the walls of Jericho" has subsided, but a quiet battle still rages. The next walls to be shattered are those to the executive suites and boardrooms. In time, they shall certainly come tumbling down as well.

by movies that portray sailors as hard drinkers with a girl or wife in every port. I must say that we have never met any man on the ship who we traveled on who fits the description Hollywood portrays. With very few exceptions, they are professionals that lead a good life — married or single. All passengers on this cruise feel the same way.

Dietrich Karau, our Chief Officer who boarded the Otter in Montreal for a familiarization trip to Antwerp, took over his duties when we left Antwerp for our return trip to Montreal and this was his first trip where the flag he was sailing under was not the Belgian flag. This is a most unusual situation as he has been a Master for 28 years practicing between Antwerp, Aarhus, North and South America. His present contract with the new manager is six months on the sea and three months on shore.

himself at the helm of a new four-masted sailing ship. We have often been asked, "Who takes their vacations on freighters?" Freighters passengers are a different breed in my judgment. We are no longer in need of purring and planned activities from morning to night as on a conventional cruise ship. Most of us thoroughly enjoyed those cruises but we are quite content to relax and enjoy freighter travel.

We have no time schedule so that the length of the cruise is not important. People from all walks of life are aboard — retired policemen, firemen, school teachers, tool makers, business men, postmen, librarians, etc.

Costs vary dependent upon the length of the voyage and the flag the ship sails under, but on a per day basis it can cost about one-half of a luxury line cruise.

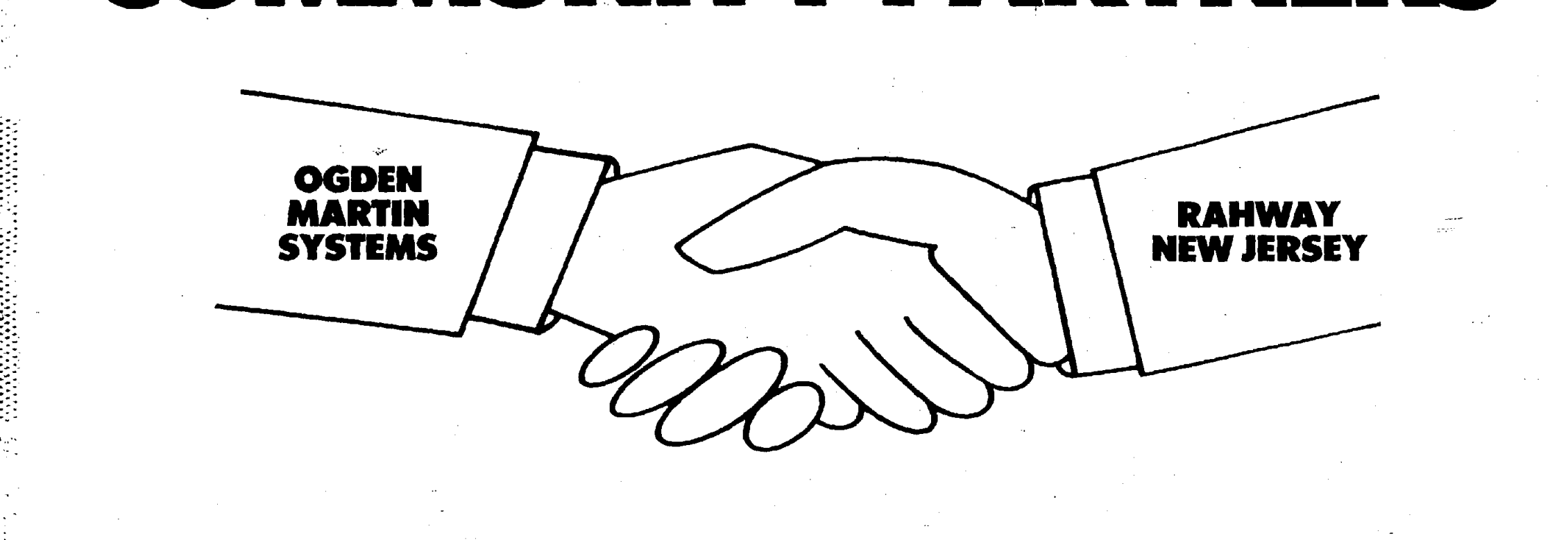
Washers and dryers are aboard for the use of the passengers. The Otter cruise costs about \$100 per day per person. Three years ago we took a freighter cruise from California to the Far East and we were gone for 42 days at a cost of about \$55 per day per person. There is no additional cost if you are a few days late. The ship goes wherever it has to to deliver or pick up cargo.

We have been gone a total of 34 days even though it was supposed to be a 31-day trip. Such is freighter cruising. It was great. As we prepare to dock, we have mixed emotions. You sometimes wish you were just leaving the dock for unknown adventures. On the other hand, you can't wait to get home to see your children and grandchildren.

Not every travel agency handles freighter cruises. One can understand why as they carry only twelve passengers and you have to book them about one year in advance which gives you time to obtain visas, where necessary, and get any "shots" that are required.

We have used Clark Travel in setting up our freighter cruises with great success.

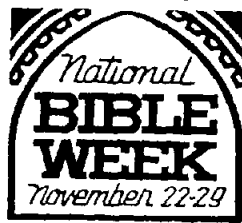
