Suffrage

Grover Cleveland (President 1885-89, 1893-97) was probably the last U.S. President to publicly reveal his male chauvinist tendencies. In 1905 he said, "Sensible and responsible women do not want to vote." Winning the right to vote was a major step in the ongoing battle waged women to achieve equal social and economic status with men. How did women achieve their precious goal of suffrage? The origin of this interesting word provides a

Suffrage, "the right or privilege to vote," combines the Latin elements frangere "to break," + sub, "into pieces," suggestive of "the noise made by a crowd frogium, a later word resulting from this merger, means 'voting tablet, assent or shout of approval."

The long and very vocal war waged by women to obtain voting rights paid off in 1920 with the passage of the Cleveland had indeed proved to be a poor judge of the deeply rooted aspirations of women The noise that caused the initial barriers to full soffrege for women to fall like "the walls of Jericho" has subsided, but a quiet battle still rages. 

Make no bones about it, "The Running Man," starr Arnold Schwarzenneger is an action film with a twist. t actually attempts to make some sort of statement on to influence of television on the minds of the masses. This noble venture unfortunately gets lost somewhere in e endless carnage that ensues throughout the course of the film. Okay, so "The Running Man" is not exactl musical comedy. It is a vicious and nasty movie which is

saved only by Richard Dawson's lecherous performance as the game show host and also Schwarzenneger's timely comic quips each time he faces certain death. The year is 2019 and America is a fascist-controlled country run on chaos and fear. "The Running Man" is a tremendously popular T.V. show in which the contestants are convicts given no choice but to run the danger-laden course of the game, all the while being tunted to the death by professional killers. Survival spells freedom, but of course, few have escaped death. That is, until Arnold Schwarzenneger takes to the field. Schwarzenneger is a lot of fun to watch. This time out, the Austrian muscleman plays Ben Richards, a helicopter pilot with the Federal police who runs afoul of


his superiors when he refuses to fire down upon a riotous crowd of starving women and children. The crowd is nevertheless annihilated anyway (much to the gleefu satisfaction of the wanton psychos in the theatre where I saw this film) and Arnie is set up as the murderer. Thus, he is penned the "Butcher of Bakersfield" and sent to prison and soon after, "The Running Man" game show Arnold Schwarzenneger is appropriately stalwart as he locks horns with the comicbook type villains of the deadly game. One of the bad guys, named "Fireball," is actually ex-football great Jim Brown. Initially, Mel Gibson was slated to star in the film over three years ago. But the Australian actor wisely backed out, no doubt sensing the correlation between his "Mad Max" character and the "Ben Richards" character that Schwarzenneger embodies

On the minus side, the script to this film is utterly predictable. And the reason is simple. The screenplay by Richard Bachman (actually Stephen King under a pseudonym) steals openly from the following three films: Richard Connell's novel, "The Most Dangerous Game" which was produced as a film in 1932, "Rollerball," and also "Soylent Green." Nevertheless, "The Running Man" packs a lot of exciting mileage and is solid escapist fare.
