

## Board of Ed seeks revision of school election date; changes voting hours

Rahway's Board of Education approved a resolution asking the New Jersey State Board of Education to revise the date for the annual school election from April 5 to April 12.

A copy of the resolution will be sent to Governor Thomas Kean, all area state legislatures, the New Jersey Department of Education and the New Jersey School Boards Association.

"It is advantageous to maximize participation in the school election," stated the resolution. "Scheduling the election during a period of time when school is not in session will, in effect, reduce the opportunity for members of the community to express themselves."

The annual school election, whereby residents vote for board candidates and the school budget, is scheduled for April 5 which falls during spring recess when schools are closed.

The board will be notified if the change in dates will be acceptable.

The board also approved the change of hours that the polls will be opened from 8 a.m. - 9 p.m. to 12:00 noon - 9 p.m.

Election workers also will receive an increase for working the polls on election day. The board approved an increase for workers from \$3.50 to \$4 an hour.

Everyone is unique in some way. Gospel artist Mark Fox has no exception. His uniqueness is the live-animated character of Lil' Markie.

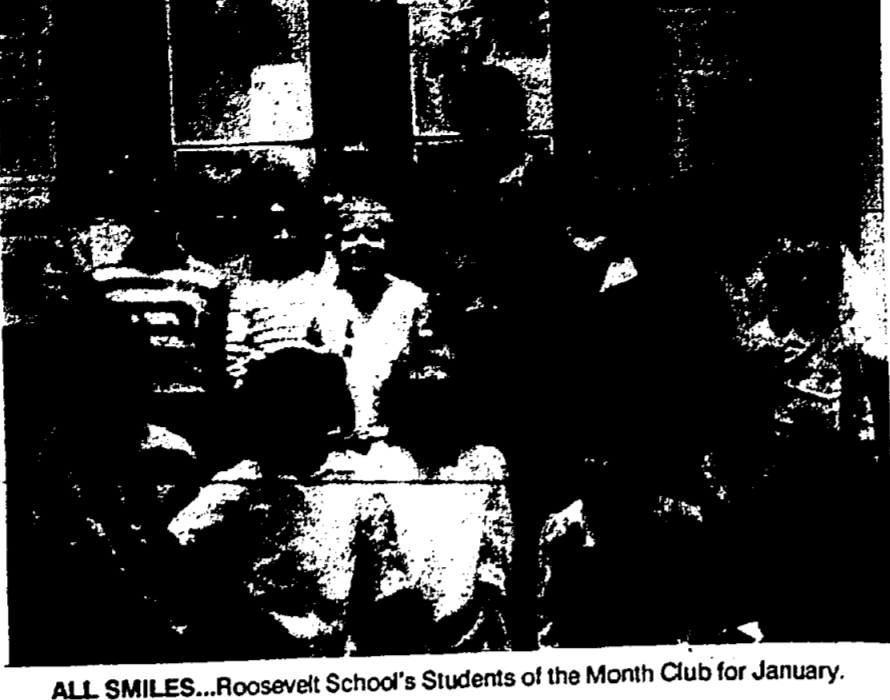

Through the eyes of Lil' Markie, Fox helps his audience experience what it is like for a young child to feel lonely and rejected or to feel the pain of divorce. The facts presented are frightening. Fox shares from many sources, among them the HBO Special "American Undercover" which appeared in 1986. According to the special, over 1,500 adolescent psychiatric wards exist in America to help children whose problems stem from divorce and parental selfishness, from having no self-esteem, from severe family conflicts, anger, and distorted discipline.

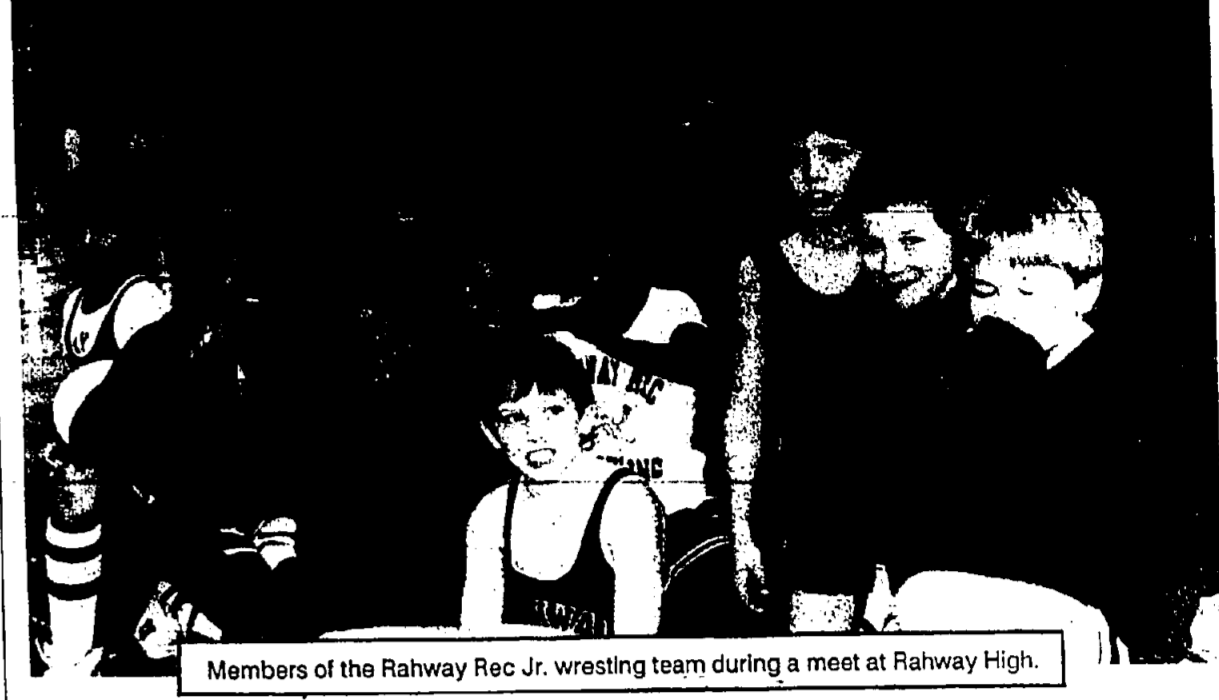

Social Security update

John H. McCutcheon, Social Security Manager for the Elizabeth office of the Department of Health & Human Services, has issued several reminders regarding social security benefits.

Applicants - Social security recipients who wish to appeal a decision by a review process should be aware of the time limits on such action. Failure to request appropriate action before the time limit ends may result in loss of the right to that action.

Representative Payees - Representative payees are appointed to handle the affairs of social security beneficiaries unable to handle their own funds. The representative payee's responsibility is to ensure that the person's day-to-day essential needs are met.

Employer Responsibility - When an employer is responsible for recording his or her social security number and home address. At the close of the calendar year, the employer is responsible for submitting Form W-2 (wage & tax statement) to the social security administration (SSA).

Benefit Statement - All social security beneficiaries should receive a Social Security Benefit Statement (Form SSA-1099) at year's end. The form shows the amount of social security benefits the beneficiary received or repaid during the year.

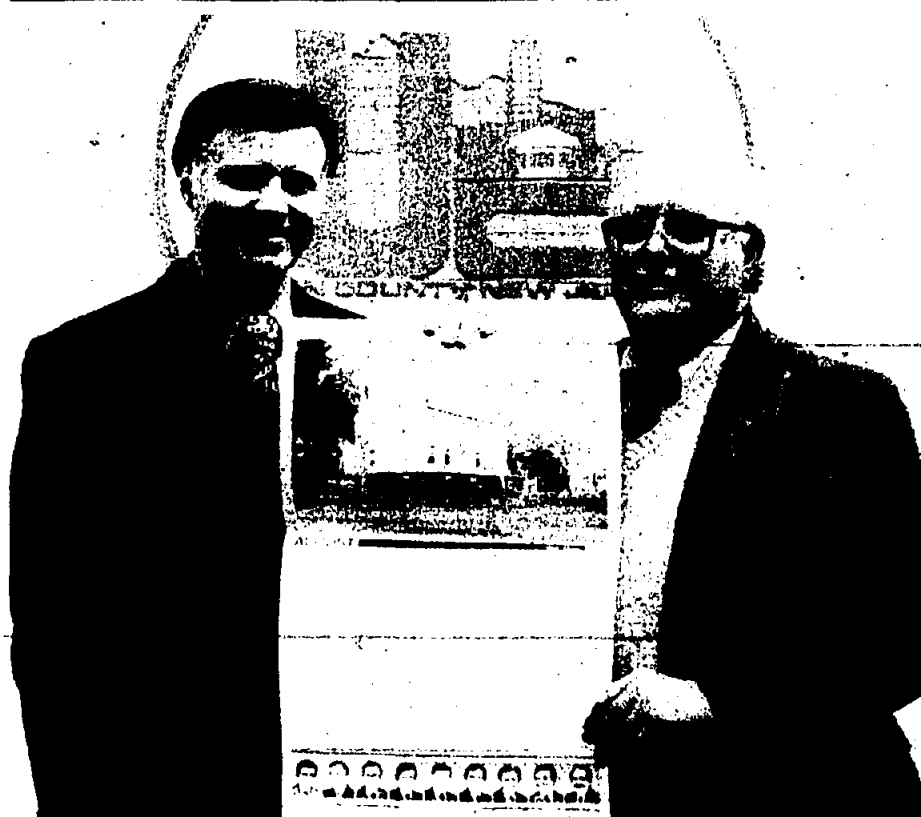

Advocacy and friendship are two important components by which volunteers ease the loneliness and isolation of their elderly clients and provide an important link with the community and its services.

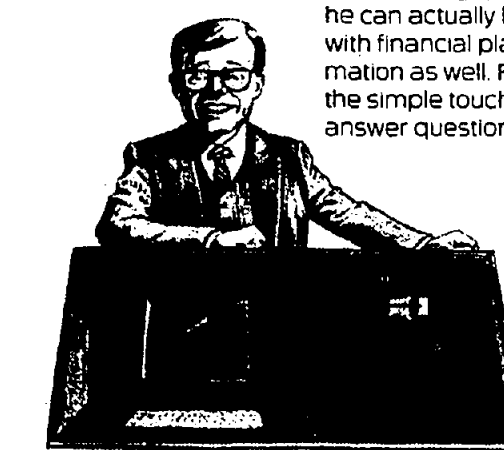
