

# Council passes 500G budget boost despite public plea for fat-trimming

## Fulcomer tax-cut resolution defeated

The Rahway Municipal Council's attempt to amend the 1988 budget drew criticism for residents who complained of high salaries for City employees and increased taxes.

The council held a public hearing on an amendment to the budget which increased the total budget from \$17.8 million to \$18.3 million. The amendment also included \$1,400,000 in distressed cities aid which will be used in the police and fire depart-

ment salaries and wages account. The amendment was approved in a partisan vote. The budget includes 60 tax points for City purposes which will result in an additional tax burden of \$240 on a home assessed at \$40,000.

Kathy Cummings, Campbell Street, criticized the budget for increased administrative salaries and increases in union wages, including longevity benefits. "Cranford eliminated longevity a decade ago because

they couldn't afford it," said Cummings. Mark Nebbia, Campbell Street, said Rahway has the highest paid mayor, business administrator, clerk and judge in the surrounding area. He said fire and police department employees and public works employees are also in the top ranges in salaries.

"Then when you add longevity and benefits, we exceed every municipality in this region," said Nebbia.

"We are in a crisis situation and we require a crisis solution. It is time for some cuts in pay and the elimination of some of the fat."

"Rahway currently has the highest paid salaries for many positions," said Carol Kemmler, Campbell Street. "This is this year, now you are talking about increases for next year."

Kemmler said Cranford's mayor is paid \$3,000, Westfield's mayor \$1,000 and Rahway's mayor \$14,000. She also compared the salary of Rahway's municipal judge at more than \$34,000 to Cranford's at \$19,000 and Westfield's at \$18,000.

"Help these poor people out there," said William

Wnuck, West Inman Avenue, "reconsider this budget."

"The budget is an insult to the people of Rahway," said Michael Esposito, Upton Place.

Republican Councilman James Fulcomer introduced a resolution that would cut property taxes by \$805,053, reduce tax points by 22.3 and

cut the water utility account by \$76,300 by eliminating almost 10 jobs.

"People cannot afford the tax increase this council is voting," said Fulcomer. "Appropriations should be going down, not up." Fulcomer said the \$1.4 million in distressed cities aid

should have been applied to alleviate garbage costs and not for police and fire department salaries and wages. "We should plug this money into the garbage account," he said. "We have an obligation when we get more money to give the people dollar-for-dollar tax relief."

Fulcomer's resolution was defeated with three in favor and Council members Vincent Addona, James Callaghan, Harvey Williams, Max Shield and Walter McLeod opposed. Councilman Jerry Coleman abstained from voting.

## Recycling pickup costs unchanged for coming year

The Union County Utilities Authority (UCUA) has agreed to hold the cost of residential recycling pickups during the coming year and increase the number of curbside pickups beginning September 1, UCUA Chairman Louis A. Santagata announced. The decisions came during a regular meeting of the Utilities Authority on June 8.

The current annual cost of \$18.20 per housing unit for recycling pickups will be held from September 1, 1988 to August 31, 1989, Santagata said. Curbside pickups will be made on an every-other-week basis during that same period, increasing the annual number of pickups to 26.

Currently, recyclables are collected 24 times a year in the ten municipalities participating in the regional recycling program.

"Due to the efficient management of the program, we are able to hold the cost of recycling pickups," Santagata said. "We hope that this will encourage additional towns to join the UCUA program."

The UCUA also authorized the purchase of five specialized recycling vehicles at the meeting. Joan Buhendorf, district vehicles coordinator, explained that the purchase of the vehicles will reduce the number of trucks the Utilities Authority leases to 12, thereby lowering program expenditures.

The UCUA recently took over full management of the regional recycling program. Albert DiGiulio was hired as operations manager for the program, and an office was opened at P.M. Recycling in Plainfield, where the recycling program.

vehicles are sorted and processed for resale. The program currently serves residents in Berkeley Heights, Cranford, New Providence, Plainfield, Rahway, Scotch Plains, Springfield, Summit, Westfield and Winfield.

Activities for the Children's and Read-To-Me Clubs will begin on Tuesday, July 5. Teen activities will start on Tuesday, June 28. From 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., teens may play "Rock 'N' Roll Trivia."

Activities are open to all in each age group, not just Reading Club members. The Library has handicapped access to all public service areas.

## Front door delivery ordinance being readied for adoption

Advertisers will have to think twice before they deliver unsolicited circulars to residents in Rahway. On June 15, the Municipal Council approved for first reading an ordinance that would require all deliveries to be made to the front entrance of recipients' premises.

"I've gotten many calls from people," said Councilman Max Shield, "who say that some advertisers are just making packages and are throwing them on their property."

Shield said residents have complained of circulars left lying on their driveways, in their bushes, even on top of

their roofs. Some residents have complained that even though they sign a register delivery of their newspapers when they are on vacation, old circulars left in their driveways signal that the house is vacant.

"It's reached the point where it is a hazard," said Shield. The ordinance states that unsolicited circulars must be delivered to the front entrance of homes and that violators will be subject to a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$100 for the first offense, not less than \$25 or more than \$200 for the second offense and not less than \$50 or more than \$300 for the third offense.

## Street restructuring plan draws fire

The reconstruction of City streets drew fire at Rahway's Municipal Council meeting held last week from residents who complained of conditions on residential roadways.

The council approved, for first reading, ordinances authorizing the reconstruction of Johnson Street, the reconstruction of West Emerson Avenue from West Milton Avenue to Bryant Street and the reconstruction of Rutherford Street from East Milton Avenue to State Highway 1. These ordinances will come before the council for a second reading and possible final adoption at the July 11 public hearing and meeting.

The council also approved for final adoption the paving of Midwood Drive from the north side of Milton Boulevard to Madison Avenue.

Josephine and Frank Rivera, Barnett Street, presented a petition to the council asking the City to provide complete funding for reconstruction of Barnett Street. Rivera, who identified him-

self as a transplant patient, said it was impossible for him to maneuver his wheelchair on the road because of the conditions. "Try sitting in this chair," Frank Rivera challenged the council.

Residents are assessed to have their streets repaved in Rahway, with the City paying one-third of the cost and each side of the street paying one-third. Rivera said that many of the residents, especially senior citizens, could not afford the assessments for street improvements.

In other business the council: --Approved a resolution authorizing the Police Department to sell bicycles and related parts at a public auction to be held on Saturday, June 26.

--Approved for first reading an ordinance executing an agreement with the County of Union to modify the Interlocal Services Agreement. --Approved a resolution authorizing the City to act as host for the Union County Regional Environmental Health Commission.

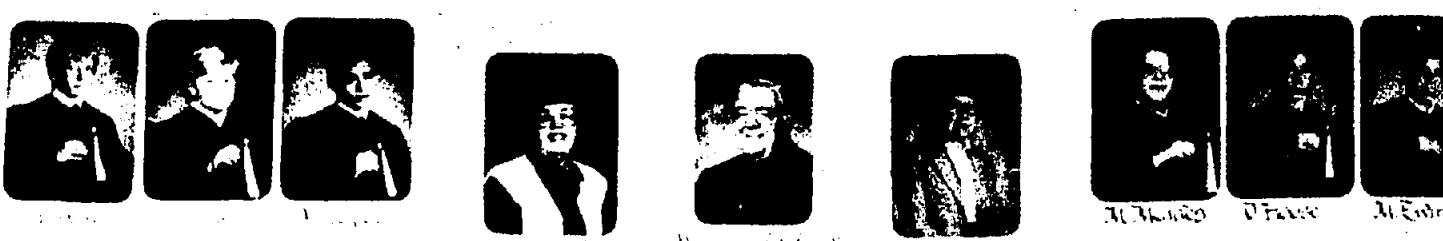

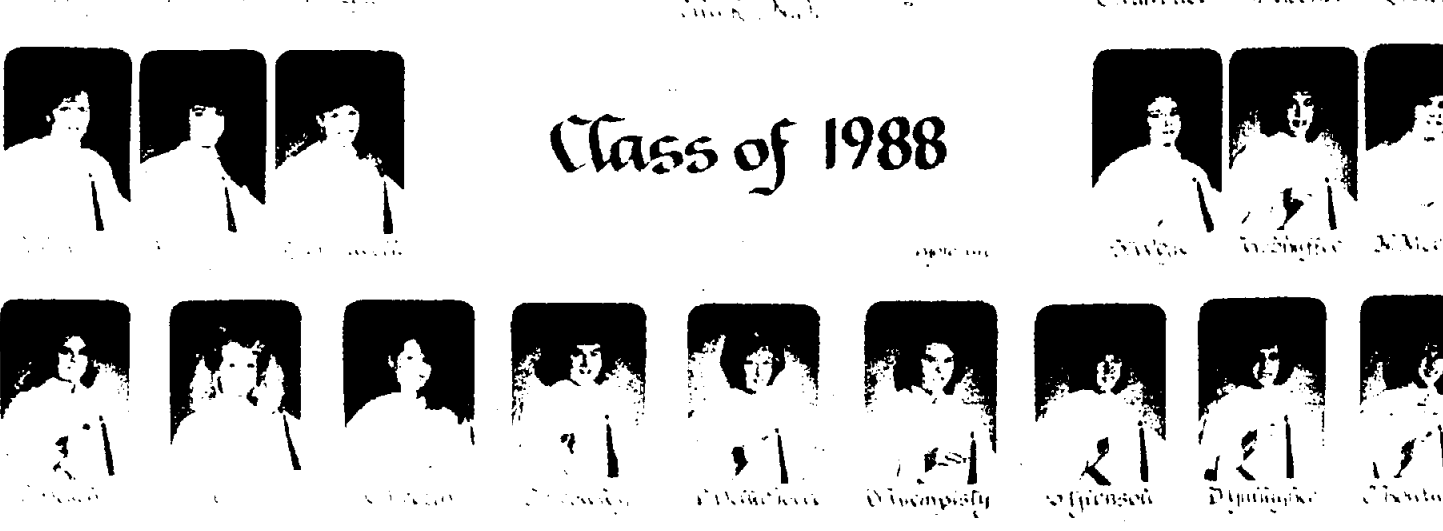

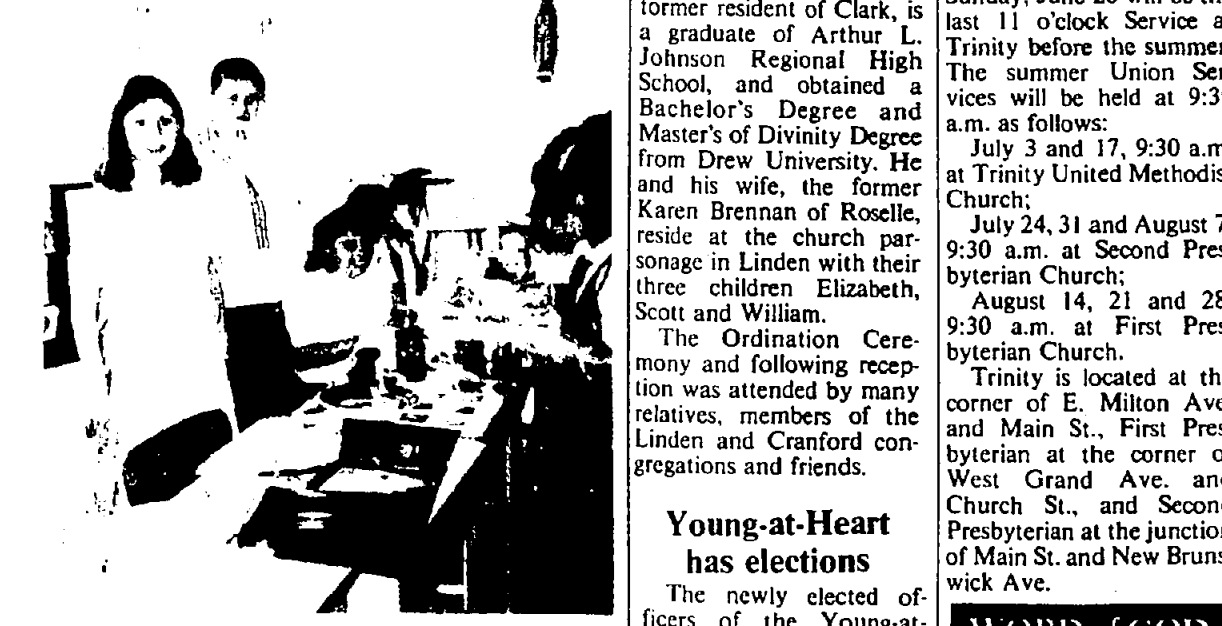

## Why Scientists Smoke

You must have heard this, too: a couple of weeks ago, on the 7 o'clock news, it was reported that it's okay to eat beef again. Yes, it has cholesterol, as previous scientific reports said - but two kinds, friendly and unfriendly. [Hopefully, in the hamburger you are eating as you read this, there is more of the former than the latter.] And do you recall how scientific studies a few years ago had convinced that vegetable oils were far safer than those made from animal fats? Remember?

But, although a whole new world seems to have been opened up for diabetes victims by this simple solution, the scientific community doesn't accept the colored spectacle procedure because they say, there are "insufficient documented scientific results" (or words to that effect).

So first we have all these scientific studies convincing us we should shift from beef and pork to fish and fowl and from animal fats to vegetable fats for cooking, if we want to stay healthy. Then, new scientific studies tell us to move or less saturated fat in our diets and go back to consuming pretty much what we were doing before they told us not to do it (though maybe in moderation).

In short, we are being told to eat what we eat, but in an enormous brainpower and extravagant testing apparatus, can't seem to make up its mind.

Yes, a cure for diabetes, for the effectiveness of which there is abundant proof, is rejected by this same mixed-up bunch - for a lack of scientific validity.

I'm beginning to wonder if the Surgeon-General's warning on cigarette packages won't soon be modified to read something like this:

"While there is reason to believe that, for some smokers, cigarettes may be addictive and otherwise harmful, nine out of ten doctors prefer them to carrot sticks." Should I start smoking now and beat the scientists at their own sinister gaming game?

P.S. Ned often resorts to satire to make a point. In truth, he does not advocate that anyone take up smoking - not even if a whole gaggle of scientists were to say it is okay.

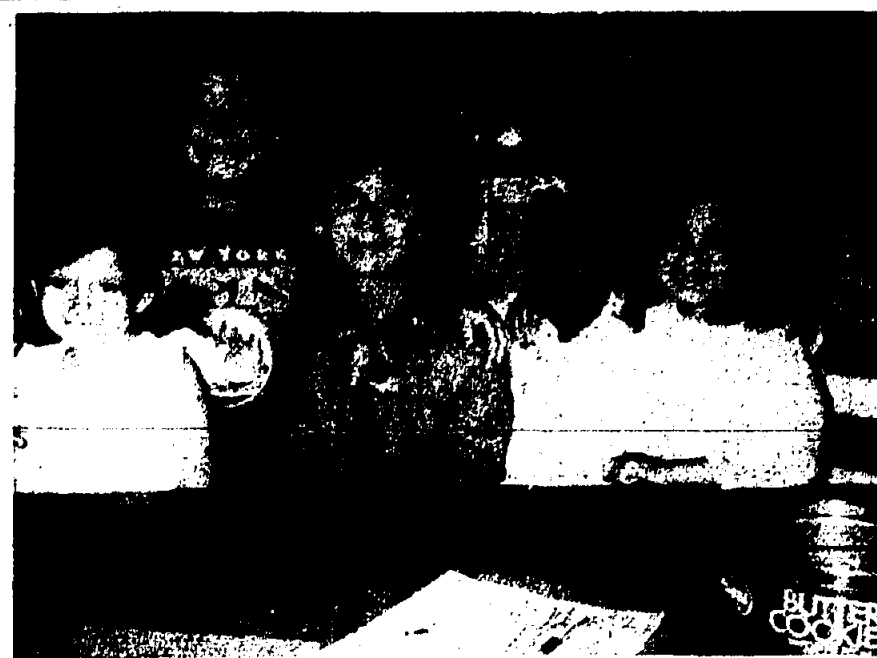
