

\$18.3M City budget OK'd

Rahway's Municipal Council quietly adopted their 1988 budget at a meeting held last week. The meeting, attended by only one resident, was in sharp contrast to a meeting held two weeks ago to

amend the budget during which more than 50 vocal residents voiced their displeasure over increases in City spending. The \$18.3 million budget includes 60 tax points for municipal purposes and an additional \$240 per year on

a home assessed at \$40,000. The 1988 budget shows an increase of \$3,347,831 over last year's \$14.9 million budget. Total tax points for residents of Rahway include 45 for schools purposes, 12 for the County

and 60 for municipal purposes. The tax rate equals \$3.67 for schools purposes, \$1.30 for the County and \$3.09 for the City. The total bill for residents in Rahway will increase \$468 a home assessed at

\$40,000; \$180 for schools, \$48 for the County and \$240 for the City. The budget was approved by a vote of five in favor and Republican Councilmen James Fulcomer, John Marsh and George Wagenhoffer opposed.

Councilman Jerry Coleman did not attend the meeting. "Cuts could have been made," said Wagenhoffer. "We made a legitimate proposal which would have resulted in a tremendous savings to people." At a meeting held two weeks ago, Councilmen Fulcomer and Wagenhoffer proposed a resolution that would have cut the budget by more than \$800,000. The proposal was defeated. In an unusual move, Councilman John Marsh praised Business Administrator Joseph Harinett for his work in reducing tax points by qualifying the City for \$1.4 million in distressed cities aid. "Considerable work was done to get the budget down and I know Joe had a lot to do with it," said Marsh.

Corporate Center on track again

Rahway's Corporate Center took a step closer to reality last week when the Municipal Council approved a resolution authorizing a contract with Chase Manhattan of New York.

The Rahway Corporate Center is a plan to develop a 14-acre site located behind City Hall. The original developer has faced bankruptcy proceedings leaving a half-finished structure on the site.

The contract allows Chase Manhattan to step in and buy out the bankruptcy of the previous developer of the tract of land. The unfinished structure and three acres of land will be finished by Chase Manhattan to be used for their banking facilities. The contract is the result of five months of negotiations between the City and Chase Manhattan, according to Business Administrator Joseph Harinett.

"It is an exciting and thrilling development for the community," said Harinett. "It will be a tremendous asset to the commu-

ty to have such a prestigious operation such as Chase Manhattan locate one of their operations here."

The building, including a parking lot and paving work, is expected to be finished by November, said Harinett.

Eleven acres of the 14-acre site are committed to Ridgeway Development Corporation under an option agreement with the City. Ridgeway has submitted a broad concept plan that would include a mixed-use facility consisting of a hotel and conference center, mid-rise condominiums with commercial space and office buildings for the site.

Ridgeway Development Corporation consists of Marshall Weinerman, president of the Summit Hotel, Summit; John A. Strank, Joseph Gelber and Robert Gelber. Weinerman, a resident of Clark, is also the owner of Marshall's Cleaners on St. Georges Avenue and manages the Drug Fair and the Elizabethtown Gas Company.

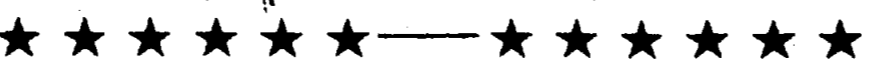

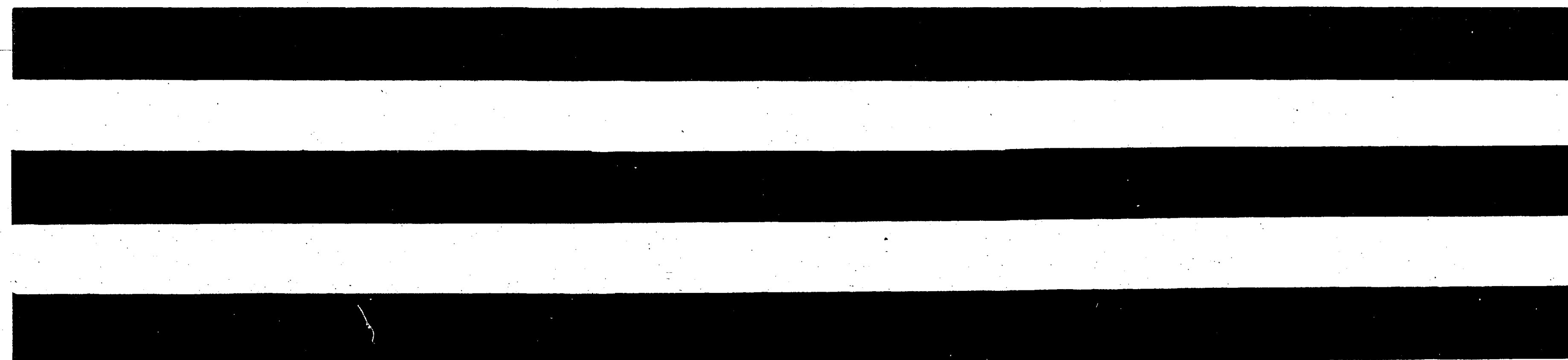
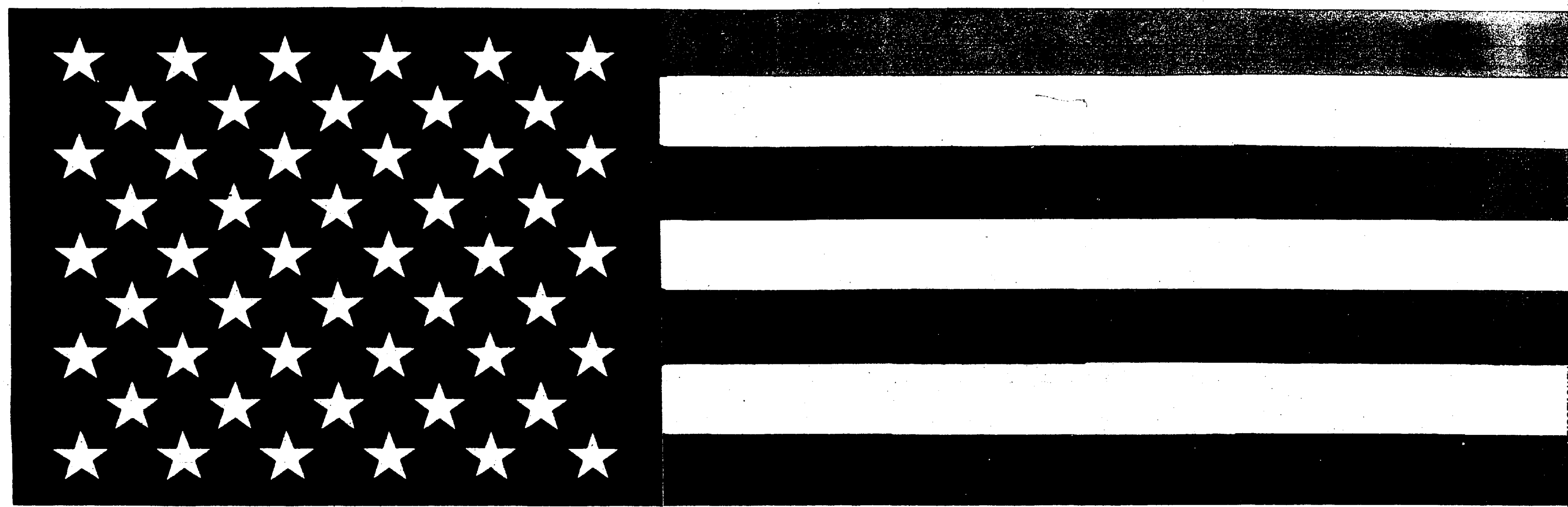
