# Rahway High retains certification Brunette: staying certified takes hard work

Frank Brunette, Superintendent of Schools, announced at last week's meting of the Board of Education that Commissioner of the (ACE) Employment Education Saul Cooperman has notified the Rahway School District that it will receive certification.

Rahway recently completed its monitoring process. Brunette also said that the district's Corrective Action Plan was approved by the county superinten-

"We must maintain what we've done," he explained. "Certification is not guaranteed, some district's have lost their certification. We must work hard to see that it doesn't happen. The Corrective Action Plan is a viable plan to keep our district certified."




