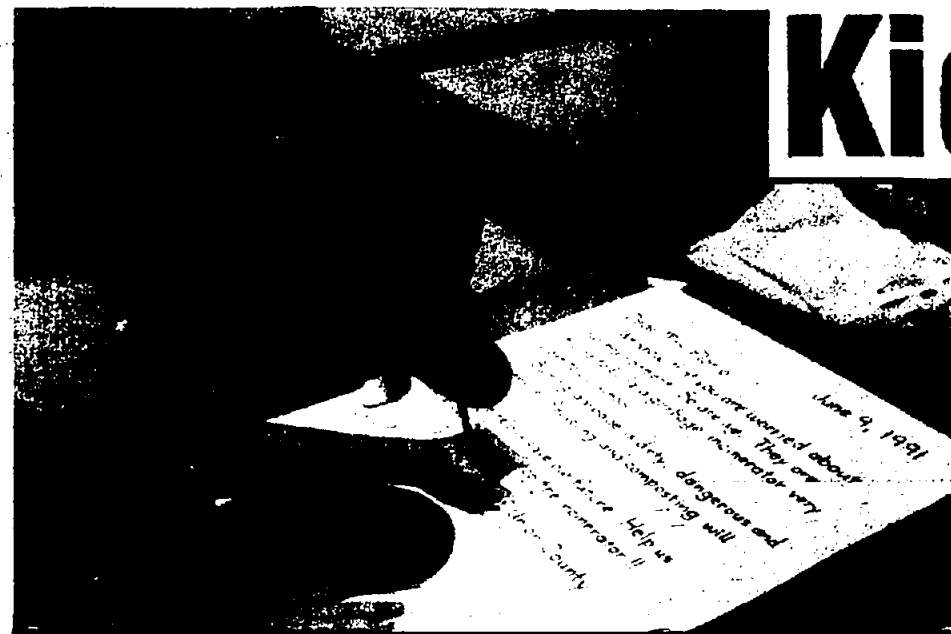

## Kids march vs. burner

Children marched to protest construction of the planned reentry recovery facility Sunday, and signed a letter asking Laciada Florio for her help in cancelling the project.  
Children and their parents began their march at City Hall and ended it with a rally at Grover Cleveland School.  
"Grover Cleveland School will be within 1,500 feet of the incinerator," said Bob Carson, Vice Chairman of the Concerned Citizens of Union County. He explained that the incinerator has been permitted to emit 16 tons of lead per year. "Lead is dangerous to everyone," said Carson. "But it is particularly dangerous to children. The kids in this area will be most at risk." Children also signed a letter to Mrs. Florio, asking her to intercede on their behalf with the Governor in cancelling the regionalized incinerator.

## Bike auction a sure sign of summer

Residents who have been looking forward to the Police Department's next bicycle auction are invited to attend the sale, to be held on Saturday, June 22, at 11 a.m. The open bid auction will be held in the Rahway Police Department's parking lot, located behind City Hall.

Abandoned bicycles acquired by the Police Department will be available for inspection before the sale. Approximately 45 bikes will

be up for bid, according to Sgt. Edward Hannan. "They range from 20 inches to 26 inches, from no speeds to 10 speeds," he explained. Sgt. Hannan said that although many of the bikes are in need of repair, parents can still get a good buy. "With a little handwork, a person can pick up a nice bike for a nominal amount of money."

The last bicycle auction was held six months ago and drew more than 25 people. Several hundred dol-

lars were earned by the department and turned over to the City treasury. In recessionary times, many people look to the auction to purchase bikes for themselves or their children. "Many times people will buy five or six bikes for \$5 each and make one complete bike," said Sgt. Hannan. "This is also an opportunity for parents to save a few dollars. With \$5 or \$10 they can get a good bike instead of paying \$50 to \$60 for a new one at K-Mart."
