Pols are allowed to change slogan

A slate of Elizabeth residents who are challenging organization candidates in the June Democratic Primary can run on a line, Superior Court Judge Edward Beglin ruled Monday.

The future of the slate, which includes veteran City Council member Robert Jaspan, had been in question after Beglin previously ruled it The group, which is challenging candidates backed by the Regular

Democratic Organization of Union County in the 20th District state Senate, Assembly and Committee races, as well as the county freeholder race, had filed under the slogan "Regular Union County Democratic Organization." Assemblyman Joe Suliga, D-Union, of Linden — one of the candidates

being challenged — disputed the slate's right to use that name. Attorney Frank Capece, representing Suliga, successfully argued before Beglin that the name had been incorporated by Suliga.

Beglin subsequently granted the slate's request to continue to run on a line and come up with a new slogan, dismissing argument by attorney John Hudak that the slate should be struck from the ballot, The slate, which also includes Assembly candidate Bob Griffith, Senate candidate Stan Moskal and Freeholder candidates Mary Verona Paul Pickton and James Garvin - all of Elizabeth, will appear on the ballot under the slogan "Stop Corruption and Profiteering in Govern-

nent." The group participated in the ballot draw and will appear on line. "C" with the six candidates — three male and three female — it is running for state Democratic Committee. The Regular Democrats have put forward incumbents Suliga and. Riselle resident Neil Cohen for the two Assembly seats, Elizabeth resi-

lent Raymond Lesniak for Senate, and newcomers Deborah Scanlon of Union, Rahway resident Chester Holmes and Roselle Park resident Al Jaspan said his state of candidates is seeking to promote "good, honest


government" and would be presenting a platform shortly. He-added there were issues that he doesn't see the major Democratic candidates talking

"One of the things we think the voters of the 20th District care about is he exorbitant auto insurance rates we pay," Jaspan said. "Our insurance system just has too many lawyers and it needs reform. In the past, legislation has passed that lets the lawyers and the insurance companies make a great deal of money on the backs of the citizens and we want to change

Jaspan said he was also concerned about environmental issues and pointed to construction of the new Elizabeth MetroMall as a possible

"I would like to see some closer monitoring of that site, particularly with the contaminated soil being used," Jaspan said, adding that he was suspicious of the way the issue has been handled and would like full environmental disclosure to the public.

Although Jaspan has previously run with the support of the "We the People" faction of Elizabeth's Democratic Party that is alligned with former Mayor Thomas Dunn Sr.; he explained that the "Stop Corruption" slate is a completely different organization created for this campaign.
