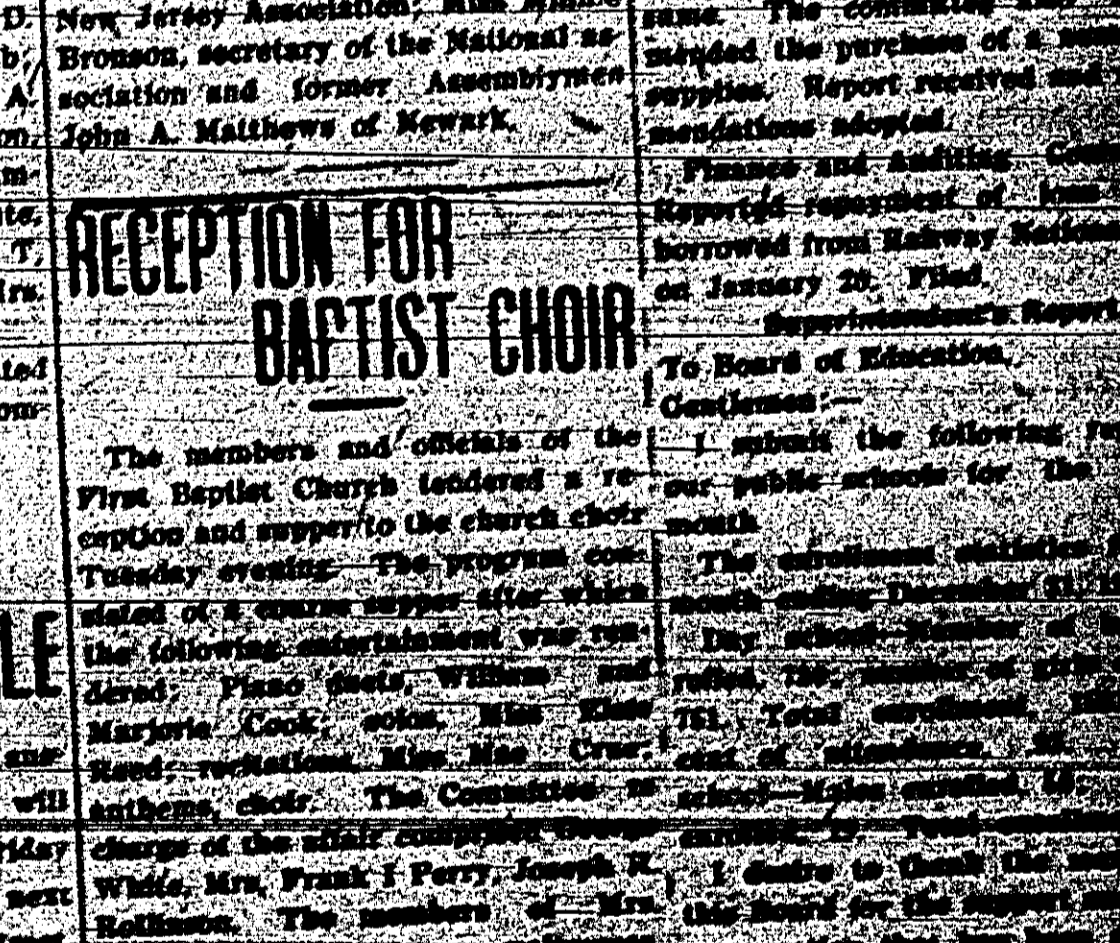

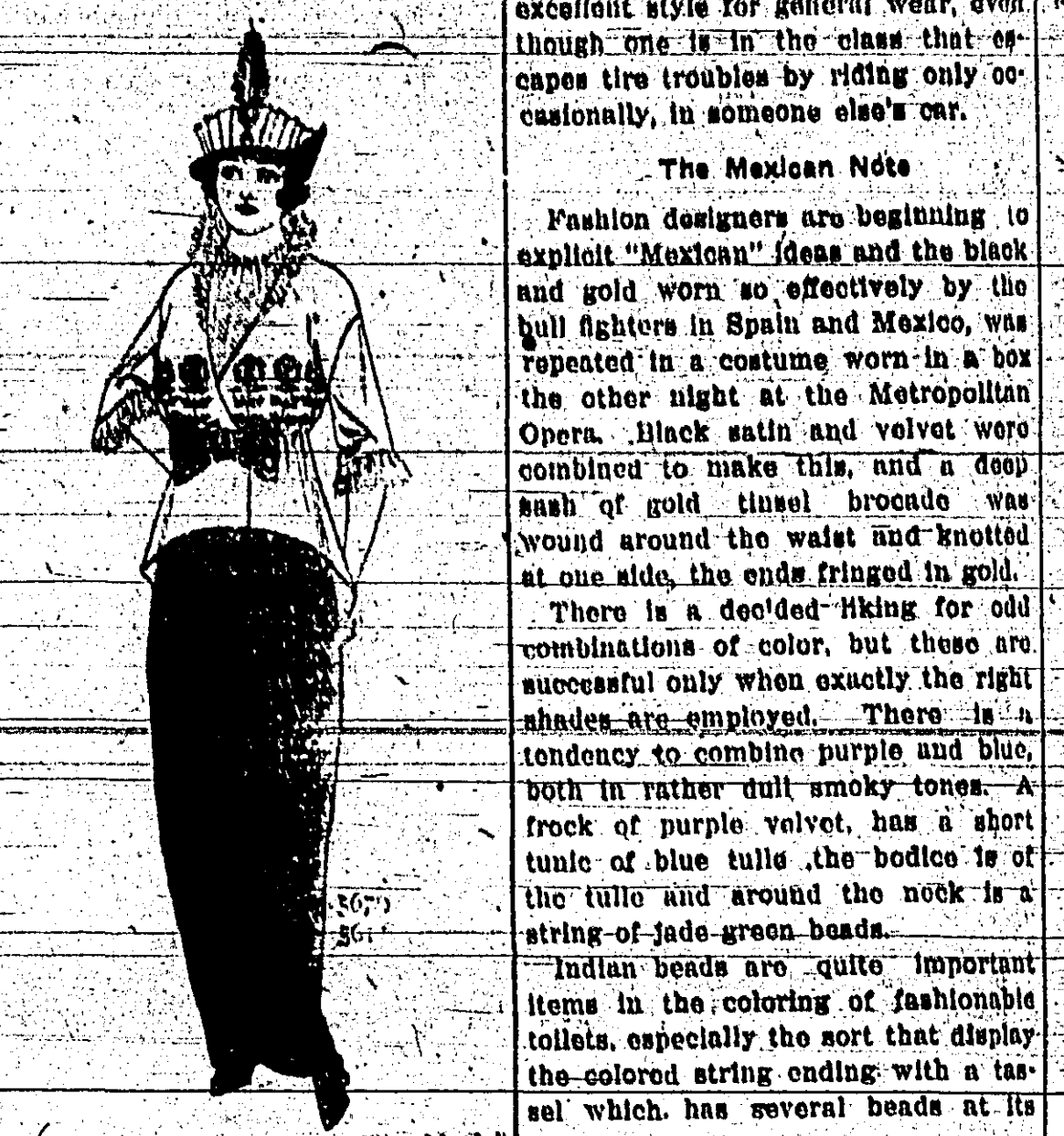

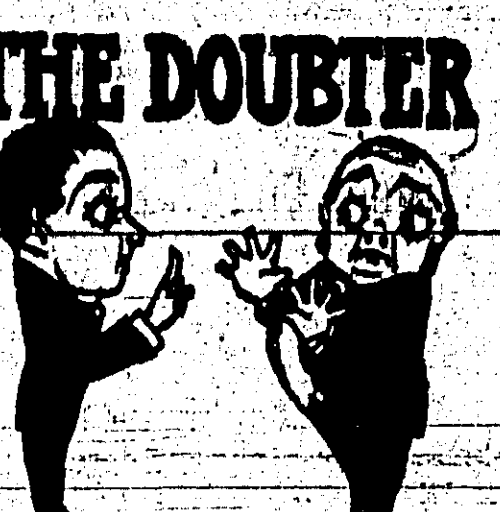

### WEEKLY LETTER TO FARMERS

The subject of a preservative treatment for lumber is of great importance to millmen, telegraph and telephone companies and to farmers.

It concerns the farmer especially in the matter of posts for farm fences. In this section chestnut, and locust are chiefly used and are as good timbers for the purpose as are found anywhere, but the chestnut blight and the increasing number of posts used for wire fences are rapidly exhausting the supply.

If other woods can be treated so that they will be as durable as those and, if these can be rendered as enduring throughout as they are above the ground, they would be valued timber kept dry, as in the frames of barns and houses, last indefinitely, so as to last in water. The posts above ground where it is dry and below the surface, where most of the time it is saturated with water do not soon rot. But just at the surface where it is neither wet nor dry is the post is short-lived because here is the right condition for growth of the fungus which causes decay.

It is not so treated that fungi cannot enter at this point. They may be slightly charred upon the surface, they may be painted with ordinary paint or with creosote or with creosote. Each of these methods of treatment will do some good, but none of them is effective for any great time because they do not go deep enough. The following suggestions show how we may prolong the life of posts.

- 1.—It is a good plan to have the top of the posts cut obliquely across so as to shed water. When posts are driven this must be done after they are in the ground.
- 2.—Have the posts seasoned thoroughly and free from all bark. When the post is very dry, place the leaves and in a tank of creosote, so arranged that it can be kept at a temperature above the boiling point of water and deep enough so that the creosote will cover the post to a point that will be five or six inches above the ground when the post is set. If posts are to be treated, they should be sharpened before treatment, but, if feasible, they should be set instead of driven. The tank should be kept hot for several hours and then allowed to cool; the posts remaining in the tank. Or, when posts are not readily treated, they may be placed in a similar position in a tank of cool creosote. If two tanks are used, the hot tank may contain creosote or other heavy oil. Heating the posts drives out the sap and as the posts settle, other slowly in the cooling hot tank, or quickly in the cool tank, the creosote fills the pores near the surface of the post.
