LIABILITY LAW HELD TO APPLY New Jersey's right to apply the warkingmen's compensation act of 1311, known as the employers' liability act to contracts made outside of the State, was held to be absolute in an uninion rendered in the Supreme Court by Justice Swayze sustaining the judgement of Judge Connolly of and posthumous child of John F. Rogge, Jr., late of Elizabeth, against

the American Radiator Company. Rogge was killed at Woodbridge while acting as a traveling salesman for the company. His widow filed a petition for compensation under the set of 1911, through Judge Abe J. David, and the company was ordered to pay her \$10 per week for 300 weeks. The company claimed that the contract for Rogge's services was made in New York and contended that the New Jersey act did not apply. Justice Swayre held that, if this contenti was good.
