LIABILITY LAW HELD TO APPLY

New Jersey's right to apply the workmen's compensation act of 1911, known as the employers' liability act, to contracts made outside of the State, was held to be absolute in an opinion rendered in the Supreme Court by Justice Swartz, in the case of the American Radiator Company.

Rogge was killed at Woodbridge while acting as a traveling salesman for the company. His widow filed a petition for compensation under the act of 1911, through Judge Abe J. Davis, and the company was ordered to pay her \$10 per week for 200 weeks.

The company claimed that the contract for Rogge's services was made in New York and contended that the New Jersey act did not apply. Justice Swartz held that it did—contending was good, New Jersey would be deprived of the right to regulate its own industries.

POPULAR OYSTER RECIPES

With the Oyster Flavour

When the real oysters are not to be obtained mock oysters may be prepared as follows:

Mock Oysters.—Take one cup of corn. Score down the center of each row of corn and press out pulp with dull knife. To a dozen ears add a level teaspoonful of salt, a half-teaspoonful of pepper and three eggs beaten light. Rub grid-iron over drippings. WASH VERY HOT DROP IN THE CORN MIXTURE FROM A TABLESPOON IN OYSTER SHAPE. BROWN ONE SIDE, TURN, BROWN THE OTHER SIDE. SERVE IMMEDIATELY ON HOT PLATE. Tomato ketchup or catsup serve as food with corn oysters.

Peas and Oysters.—Boil thin slices of state bread, butter them and place in an earthenware pan, moisten with cold cream and cover with raw oysters. Season with salt, pepper and small amount of butter. Cover with a tight lid and cook in a hot oven for seven or eight minutes or until they swell and the edges curl.

For Delicate Appetites.

Curried Oysters.—To the liquor drained from a quart of oysters add a mixture of one-half cup of butter, two tablespoons of flour and one tablespoon of curry powder. Boil, add oysters and cook until they rattle.

A still more popular curry is made by boiling oysters in their liquor until the liquor is reduced to one-half. Add a level teaspoonful of curry and one level teaspoonful of oyster liquor. Stir until the sauce is thick.

Oyster Patties.—Make shells of a very rich paste or buy them from the confectionery store. Fill with oysters, prepared in the following way: Make a white sauce by bringing half a pint of cream to a boil with salt, pepper, and thickening with a tablespoonful of flour made smooth with butter and cold cream. Add oysters and cook for five minutes. Beat in an egg yolk and serve.
