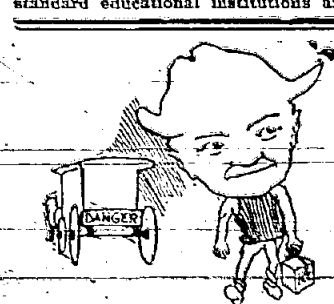


Forty-two Pupils Receive Diplomas
