





"I have impected 1154 yards in the city and have found general conditions very good; except in a certain few localities, where the condition ere quite bad. The most objectionconditions I found existing among our pourer people, especially among the foreign population and some of the colored people. But before roing further, I wish to say that I do not mention these people because of their nationality or color, or because they happen to be poor. My aim, in this matter is to be impartial, and to state onditions just as I found them. Being poor or coming from a foreign iand is no excuse for uncleaning I only mention these people becau they appear to be very careless in re gard to their habits, seeming to have o respect for cleanliness or to unsanitary conditions surroundin them.
