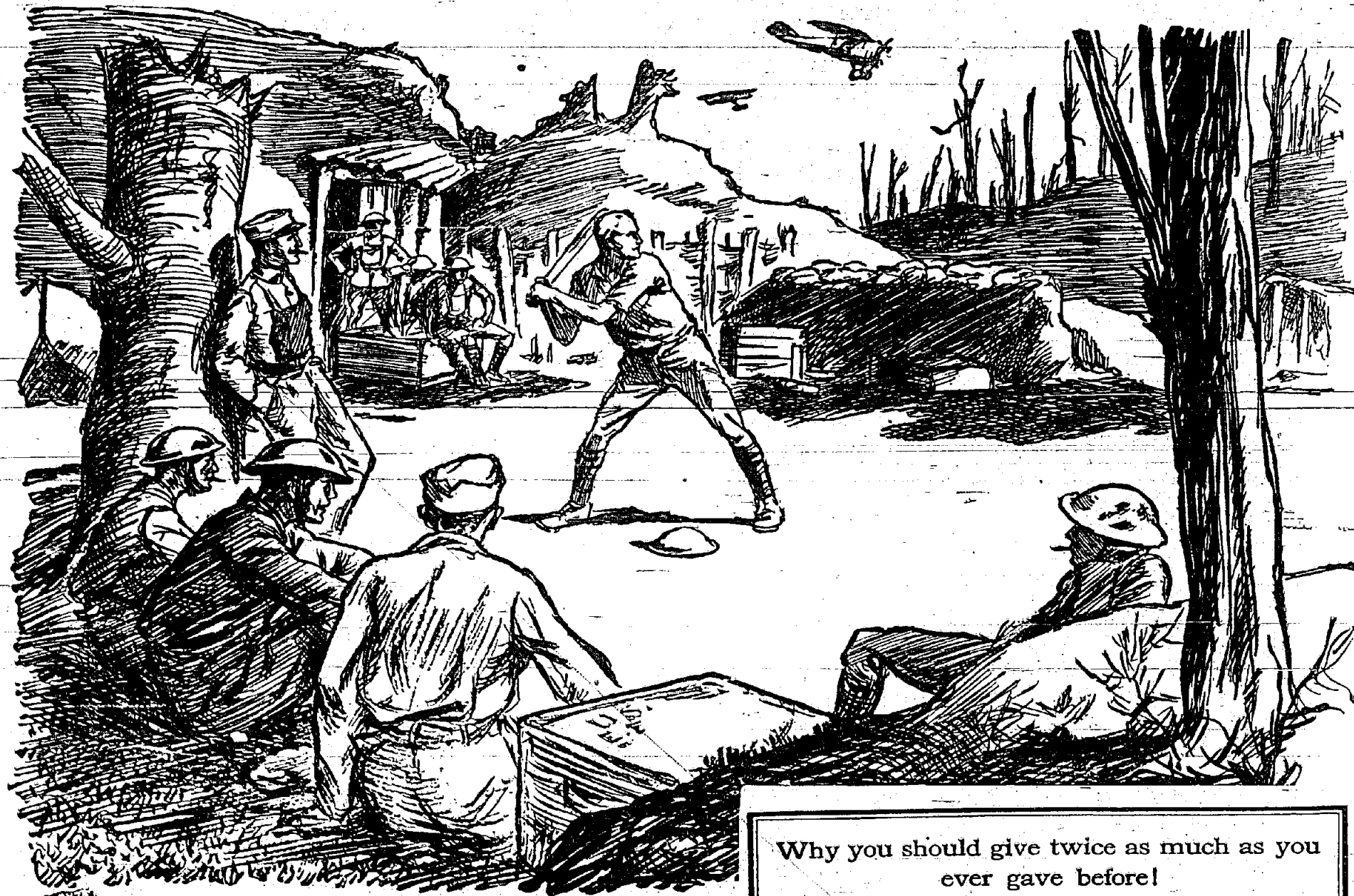

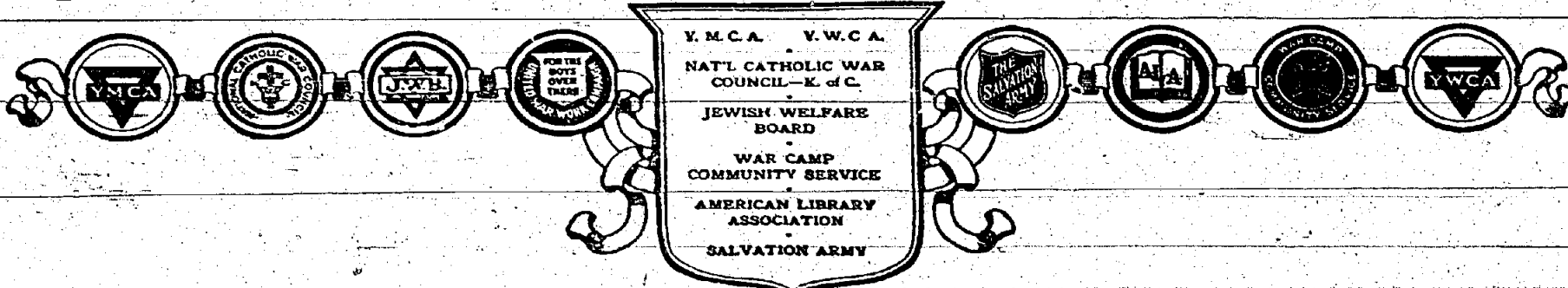
"Come on, buddies! Put it over the pan!" he yells, and the pan is the tin hat which he wore a few hours ago when he went over the top to find the Hun.
