It is believed that some scheme may be worked out whereby all airplanes leaving the country will be registered at the nearest custom house on the border, where a certificate will be issued to be presented at any custom unse in returning, as is done now in the case of automobiles. This would in most cases be a mere formality, but would permit search in suspicious cases and would tend to keep down smuggling. "Will be registered" is rec-ognized as putting it strongly, as it is admitted it would be impossible to ompel such registrution of a machine miles above the clouds.
