## NO SHORT CUTS TO REACH HEAVEN

Rev. J. W. Ryder Concludes Series of Sermons--Synopsis of the Discourses

In a powerful series of sermons brought to a close Sunday evening, the Rev. J. W. Ryder, pastor of Trinity Methodist church, showed his congregation that there are no short cuts to heaven. There were three of the sermons and each touched the topic from a different angle. The sermons were all filled with spiritual vitality and practical application and made a deep impression on Pastor Ryder's hearers. A synopsis of the sermons follows:

The last sermon in the course on "The Way to Heaven" was delivered by Pastor Ryder Sunday evening. The sermons were based on the promises of ancient Israel, and the three were from Exodus 13, the Promised Land, which furnished a splendid background for some very helpful thoughts for the listening audience.

The texts in each case were taken from the book of Exodus, the last of the Pentateuch, the last of the five books of the Bible. The text of the first sermon was: "The way to heaven is through the way of the Promised Land." The text of the second sermon was: "The way to heaven is through the way of the Promised Land." In the first of these sermons the pastor called attention to the route that Israel first chose, which lay along the shores of the Mediterranean Sea and would be covered in a few weeks. While it had the advantage of being the shortest route to the Promised Land, it was beset with dangers and difficulties and problems that made it impractical and unwise. The Philistines, the Egyptians, and the Canaanites were all enemies of the Israelites, and they would have to pass through their country without a battle and they were unprepared. Had they ventured, they would have been caught between the Philistines in the front and the Egyptians in the rear and been cut to pieces or reduced to a worse servitude than before.

In the thought of the pastor, the historical symbolism of this way represents the "short cut" to heaven, which the Jews pursued who relied on the law of Moses and the blood of the lamb of sacrifice. John Bunyan refers to this in his allegory "The Pilgrim's Progress." St. Paul speaks of persons of this kind in his Epistle to the Romans, who go about in the flesh, and are not yet citizens of heaven, and have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of Christ.

A very pertinent reference was made to the Jewish Passover meal, which blood God commanded to be sprinkled on the door posts of every house. Without doubt there were many good people among those 2,000,000 slaves that came out of Egypt, but it wasn't their personal goodness that saved them from the sword of the death angel, but the blood of the lamb of sacrifice that had been sprinkled on the door posts.
