



City officials cannot be blamed for not havpassed the law which they believed enerchants wanted, and they are now doing their best There is not a merchant in Rahway who does not earnestly wish that we had an ordi-

working here. The question remains whether or not they want the ordinance badly enough to petition Common Council to pass it. If members of our governing body are assured that Rahway merchants are sincere in their wish-for a prohibitive ordinance, such an ordinance will be passed. But Rahway merchants and business men cannot expect Councilmen to try to guess what the merchants want.
Why should not the merchants forget local

competition long enough to get together and petition Council to pass an ordinance calling for a yearly license fee of at least \$500? Make every house-to-house vandor of any article pay the heavy fee, and the merchants would thereby be protecting themselves and citizens as well.
