Here is a statement by Dr. William Bennett Efunro of the executive council of the California Institute of Technology, that hould be firmly implanted in the mind o every American: The untaxed American is a myth. No one

who occupies property, owns a car, smokes three meals a day, rides on a street car or goes through the other motions of daily life gets by untaxed. Yet there are people who inink themselves non-taxpayers when at east 10 percent of their earnings go for taxes. They are victims of the great Amer-ican delusion. Of itself government earns no mony. Every dollar that it gets for its support must come from someone who does e earning. To do this it must tax produ

tion, which means that both producer and consumer share in paying the bills." Dr. Munro might have added that it is the amer who invariably bears the greate share of the burden. Our industries, much they would like to, have no magic means conjuring money from alr. Every expens operation, whether it be materials, labor, t-or-taxes, must be included in the cost of the finished product. The buyer alway

And the important thing is that with the cost of all forms of government soaring as it has in recent years, the consumer now finds limself paying more in taxes for each dolla he earns than he ever did before. This situation has come to be recognized y the people of Rahway and they have refore started to do something-about it.

Rahway voters and taxpayers have starte t-the only vice starting point—they have looted men who are willing to listen to the ismands of the people and, having listened are able to carry out the wishes of those who placed them in office. Already this public Nicy has borne fruit and Rahway peopl themselves paying less for the cost ( their government. The next step, and in many ways more

sation insurance premium rates, which may obviate controversy among employers, insur-. ance companies and state authorities, has ast been approved by the New York State-Superintendent of Insurance, and will be proposed, it is expected, in numerous other

states within the year. If it is accepted and successfully adminis-tered, the plan should do much to solve serious problems. America's outstanding adven-ture in social insurance has been full of struggle. Employers have challed at increasingly high rates. Workmen have fought for more liberal treatment. State compensation ad-ministrators have been under heavy pressure, both from labor and the general public, to construe doubtful points in favor of the injured workman or his dependents. Court nd juries have become more liberal, often awarding settlements on bases not only out-side the some of the compensation act itself, but admittedly, even beyond the intentions of The legislators who drafted it. The upshot has been a constantly rising cost of claims which has left insurance companies with no other alternative but to urge, state supervising officials to authorize higher rates. Sinc 1921, casualty insurance companies entered ate, have suffered national underwriting losse of nearly \$160,000,000 on their compensatio business, according to the National Bureau of Casualty and Surely Underwaiters.

There are many avenues in the proposed plan by which the compensation insurance Business may be improved. Chicf, among these is the elimination of controversy over the rate level on which premiums for vari-out classifications of compensation insurfance are developed. This has been done by fram-ing in the plan itself a formula which firm a specific method for determining such levels.
