Official Acceptance

How successful this administration is depends largely upon how we conduct its affairs. With these words Mayor John E. Barger accepts his official responsibility and with the same breath challenges his co-workers to so conduct city affairs as to bring a portion of progressive advancement for the City of Rahway.

In his address during the re-organization of Common Council on New Year's Day, the new mayor outlined many of the problems facing the newly formed governing body, after first offering "my sincere cooperation and in turn call upon each of you for yours for you must now bear in mind that you also now represent the necessities of the city and the people as a whole. I intend giving the city an honest and businesslike administration and in this I know I shall have your wholehearted support."

The mayor's only mention of finances as a major problem facing the city and its people, saying that "the way is now open for the formations of a financial plan for the city which will adequately protect it for the next 10 years, and that the taxpayers will be able to pay the bills for the city."

From city finances the mayor delved into a problem that is close to his heart—that of industrial advancement for the city. Pointing out that the city is in a "critical financial situation," he stated that the city cannot hope to show much industrial development unless officials and residents display an active interest in that development. He again advocated the formation of public relations committees and urged its appointment, saying that "I believe to encourage the industrial development of our city is one of the permanent solutions to our many problems."

Recognition of the value of the work of the citizens advisory committee and the tax lien committee was manifested when he urged their continuance. While pointing out that he is favorable to restoration of full salaries for all city employees if possible, the mayor said, "I tell you frankly that the taxpayers of the city cannot stand a full restoration" and indicated that developments in the state legislature would largely determine what action can be taken locally.

The mayor also faced the condition for local streets as well as the debris that is allowed to remain on them. Although he did not exactly say so, he clearly indicated that he referred to glass that is allowed to remain on the street and showed that the problem will receive his attention.

Referring to the police department the new mayor said, "There are many problems concerning our police department which will be seriously considered and effective measures taken to remedy the situation by myself and the committee (police) at our first meeting."

Other city problems mentioned by the chief executive indicating much thought on each, included sale of all unused city property; formation of another section district in the Third District, Third Ward and the problems created by automobile parking in the center of the city. With each of these the mayor publicly pledged himself to intelligent consideration of each and openly declared that each would receive its proper amount of official attention.

With such problems as these facing the city every thoughtful person can readily understand the size of the job that the officials have tackled. We believe we express the sentiments of the great majority of people in wishing them strength and Godspeed.

A Clark Project

One of the most active and work while groups in Clark Township is the recreation committee of the Clark Parent-Teacher association. The work of the committee, begun by the child study group of the association, conducts recreational periods in the portable school building in the township. In so doing the committee is making a very real contribution toward the improvement of life of the township residents.

The work of the committee is of such value that it deserves more wholehearted co-operation from the residents of the community than it has thus far received. While the work has been kindly accepted this acceptance can be still further increased so that every person can be reached by the committee's work. This co-operation will be forthcoming, we believe, when every Clark citizen understands and appreciates the value of the program.

The signing of Carl Hubbell by the New York Giants for the '35 baseball season eliminates the rumors that have been whispered through the baseball ranks that Colonel Bill Terry was getting ready to dispose of his star slaban.

Although Carl was overworked last season in inspection of his earned run average would seem to dispel any such supposition. You may have your Dizzy and Paul Deans and your Van Lingle Mungos but when the checks are down we'll still be going along with the Oklahoma pitcher.

Carl's a real money pitcher and given a fair break with the work burden we'd be willing to match him against the best in the loop.

Playing and pitching for the same teams it is no hard matter to figure which of the two would win the most games.

I don't think any of '34 fandom will ever quite forget the little achievement Hubbell entered into the record books in last year's all-star game when he up and fanned five of the junior circuit's bigfishing stars in succession including Ruth, Gehrig, Simmons and Cronin.

Hubbell standing out there amidst the tumult of the crowd... almost a slight, wispy figure... he has a deceiving appearance out there in the gunpit... unassuming that screwball at the enemy batsmen... feeding it to them judiciously... making them like it... making them bite... and hit just across of open air... it was the prettiest picture any sports columnist or any baseball fan could ever dream of dishing on.

And while we're on baseball... and we have an idea we're going to continue rambling on it for the day... word comes from the sunny slopes of the Knickerbocker coast that Cyrus Raymond Cobb, otherwise known as the Georgia Peach and one-time leader of the scrapping Tigers has designated George Mogridge as one of the two pitchers who bothered him most during his career.

Well do we remember Mogridge. He happened to be the first major league pitcher we ever saw in action. It was the initial game of a double-header in which the Yanks were tangling with the Senators, and we remember too... that a fellow by the name of Walter Johnson, of Coffeyville, Kansas, tossed them up in the second game and lost a hard fought 7-6 tilt to Harry Harper the Huggin's pitcher.

To our adolescent eyes, both of the Washington pitchers looked great that day even though they tasted defeat. We don't remember Mogridge's opponent... and we won't chance a guess... But we do recall another historic slinger who was in the bullpen that day. Perhaps you've heard of him too.

The name on the program was Carl Mays, and we watched with interest, the sweeping motion, submarine fashion, he used in getting the apple up to the plate. It was one of Carl's pitches that laid Chapman, the Cleveland shortstop, low with a fatal injury. Mays was never quite the same pitcher after that.

But wait—now that we ponder a bit we do recall the fourth pitcher to appear on the mound that day. And now that we do remember we can't understand how we ever forgot... it was Bob the Gob Shawkey, red flannel sleeves answering to the breeze, who worked easily and mechanically that day to down the Washington batsmen.

Bob the Gob has traveled a long path since... but he still has the old flannel sleeves... He was a smooth worker in his day... and he's doing right well by himself now that he's pinked himself into a managerial position in New York.

Shawkey has turned out to be one of the best developers of young material in the business.

But to get back to Mogridge. We can begin to understand why he designated him one of the most difficult pitchers to hit of his day. Big George had blinding speed and a swell change of pace and we'll never quite understand how the Yanks hit him that day. He smacked and smacked. But even the big fellow, a young fellow named Ruth in his cast in the outfield and a Home Run Baker at third and these fellows were sort of able to hit most anything.

But it was a great day there in the shadows of Coogan Bluff... the Yanks were still cowering in the Polo Grounds at that time... when we saw a red flannel sleeve and a May and a Johnson, and a Baker and a Pippot there on the diamond... play the minor league ball as was major league ball.

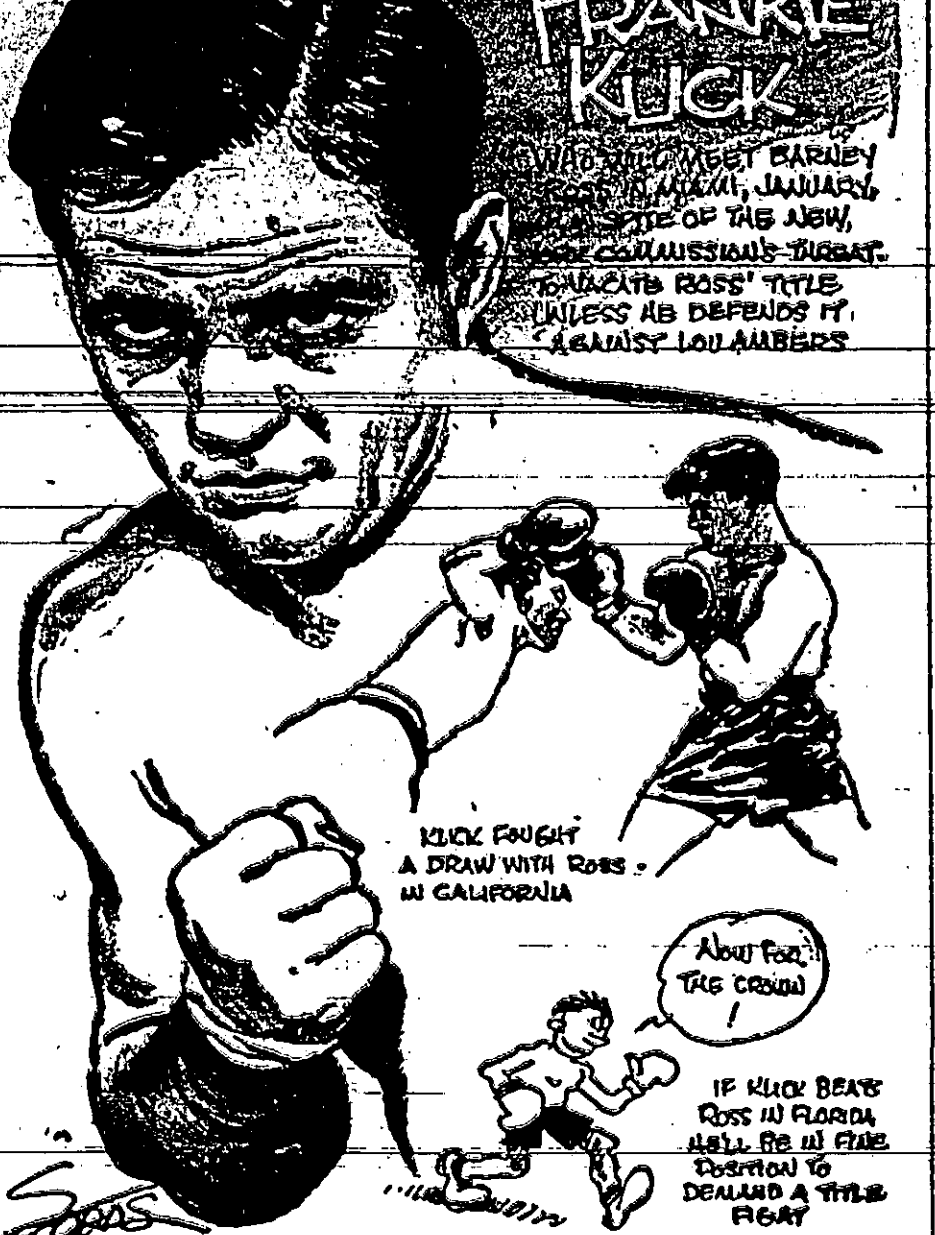

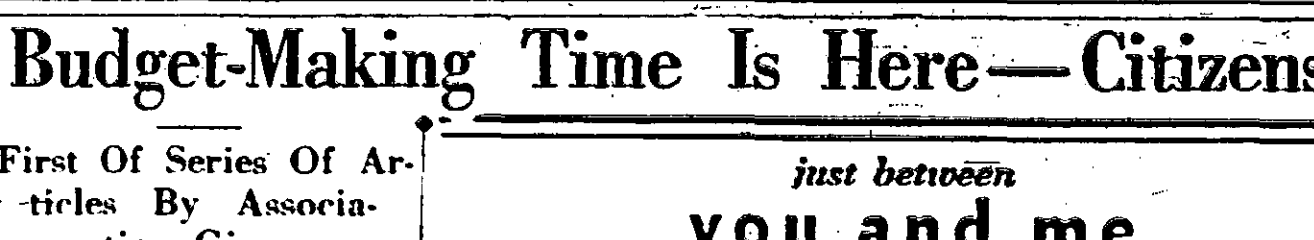
