The Rambler have tried football, basketball and of the lot football has been about the most successful. The club tried track last year but had it not been for the colored boys from the Ebenezer club, the Rambler would have had a chance in that county meet held in Riverside.

When some Railway runner makes a good showing at an outside meet, he is signed up by some other club. Right now there are a number of fair track athletes in the city but many of them are affiliated with outside clubs. Old timers will tell you that you can't have a really successful meet here without bringing in outsiders and they aren't far from wrong. What Railway needs is a couple strong athletic clubs that cannot only compete in sports here but can also bring in outsiders. With the Board of Recreation Commissioners leading the way, clubs now have a good chance to get into things and work with a co-ordinated program. Mayor Barger selected the best qualified men in this city on his recreation group and we feel that things are in good hands. If a few promoters will show half as much interest in athletics as the men on the commission, there should be a sharp and sudden upturn in local recreational affairs. Right now, we are handicapped by not having a fully equipped athletic field but that is an aim that will be accomplished in due time if things continue along as they now are.
