General Rules:

1. All classes open to public except Design Division, Class 1-4.
2. Judging based on NGC Standard System of Awarding by NGC Accredited Flower Show Judges; to begin at 10:30AM on Friday, April 20, 2012. Show will open at completion of judging. Decision of judges final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
3. All entries received on Thursday, April 19th between 1-5pm. Designs can also be entered on Friday, April 20th between 8:30am and 9:30am.

4. All tabletops covered with white cloth and colored skirting to the floor by Committee.
5. All properties must be removed at the show closing on Friday, April 20, 2012 at 7pm but **not before**.
6. Each entry to be judged must be the work of one exhibitor, except where noted. NO artificial plant material allowed. If exhibitor cannot fulfill assignment, it is their responsibility to find a replacement.
7. Exhibitors may enter more than one class or subclass, but only one exhibit per class or sub-class. **Exception:** See rule #2 under Horticulture.
8. Plant material on the NJ Conservation Guide List is NOT permitted unless grown by the exhibitor or legally acquired and must be so stated on a 3"x5" card.
9. Plant material on the Category 1 Invasive Plant List of the Nature Conservancy is NOT permitted except in Educational Exhibits in the Special Exhibits Division. **Limited space prohibits more detailed information. Please consult Handbook for Flower Shows, edition 2007 or Class Consultant.**

Design Rules:

1. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables.
2. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner.
3. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit
4. All plant material must be listed on a 3"x 5" card.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their designs in good condition.
6. Landscapes or scenes not permitted in Design Division.
7. Living members of the Animal Kingdom are not permitted in the Design Division.
8. Consult Handbook, 2007 edition for further information.

Horticulture Rules:

1. Specimens must be fresh plant material grown by the exhibitor and **must** be NAMED, giving genus and species; variety/cultivar provided when available. Common name may be added. Entry cards available at time of check-in.
2. Exhibitor may make more than one entry per class or sub-class, if each is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, type, form, size, or color.
3. Committee may subdivide classes.
4. Container-grown plants must be in exhibitor's possession at least 90 days.
5. Containers for cut specimens to be provided by the Committee.
6. Cut specimens should have no foliage below the water line.
7. Wedging material of bubble wrap will be used.

SCALE OF POINTS

Judging will be based on the Scales of Points in the Handbook for Flower Shows, edition 2007. See page numbers for each category.

Horticulture judging will be based on the Horticulture Scale of Points, found on pgs. 298-300.

Design judging will be based on the Design Scale of Points, found on pg. 303.

Educational Exhibit judging will be based on the Education Scale of Points, found on pg. 304.

Tables judging will be based on the Tables and Vignettes, Exhibiting Tables - Type I and Vignettes Scale of Points, found on pg. 303.

Artistic Craft Exhibit and Photography judging will be based on the Artistic Craft Exhibits Scale of Points, found on pg. 304.

Youth Exhibits judging will be based on the above scales however, a 90 instead of a 95 is required to receive a Youth Top Exhibitor Award.

NGC STANDARD SYSTEM OF AWARDING

- *Only one first place (blue) ribbon per class or subclass; must score 90 or above.
- *Only one second place (red) ribbon per class or subclass; must score 85 or above.
- *Only one third place (yellow) ribbon per class or subclass; must score 80 or above.
- *One or more honorable mention (white) ribbons as merited; must score 75 or above.

NATIONAL GARDEN CLUB TOP EXHIBITOR AWARDS

Award of Design Excellence may be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner 95 or above, judged to be the finest in the Design Division, Class 1,2,3,4. Only one may be awarded. Rosette of gold ribbons.

Award of Horticultural Excellence may be awarded to the highest scoring NAMED blue ribbon winner 95 or above, judged to be the finest in the entire Horticulture Division. Only one may be awarded. Rosette of green, orange and blue ribbons.

Arboreal Award may be awarded to the highest scoring NAMED blue ribbon winner 95 or above, in Division II, Section A. Rosette of two shades of green.

Award of Merit may be awarded to the highest scoring NAMED blue ribbon winner 95 or above, in Division II, Sections B and E. Three may be awarded - only one in each Section. Rosette of orange ribbons.

Educational Top Exhibitor Award may be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above, with the exhibit a minimum of 18 sq. ft. in Division III, Section A - Exhibits 1, 2 and 3. Only one may be awarded. Rosette of brown and white ribbons.

Grower's Choice Award may be awarded to a NAMED blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Division II, Section C and D. Only one per section may be awarded.

Youth Top Exhibitor Award (3) may be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 90 or above in Division III, Section E-1 Design - Class 8. One each per three age categories subdivided at placement. Rosette of red, white and blue ribbons.

Award of Appreciation (3) may be awarded to an Invitational exhibit, Division III, Section B - Exhibit 1, 2 and 3. Rosette of orchid ribbons.

ADDITIONAL NGC AWARD(S)

Artistic Craft Award may be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Division III, Section C - Classes 1, 2, 3, and 4. Only one may be awarded. Exhibit must contain plant material. Rosette of navy ribbons.

THE RAKE AND HOE GARDEN CLUB AWARDS

The Nancy Wallace Trophy may be awarded to the highest rated blue ribbon winner in the Horticulture Division.

The Judy Campe Award may be awarded to the highest rated blue ribbon winner in the Design Division.

Youth Rake and Hoe Artistic Crafts Award (6) may be awarded to the highest rated blue ribbon winner in Division III, Section E-2, Class 9 and Division III, Section E-3, Class 10. One each per three age categories subdivided at placement. Rosette of teal and green ribbons.

Photography Award may be awarded to the highest rated blue ribbon winner in Division III, Section D, Classes 5,6, and 7. Rosette of black and white.

LA FLEUR COUTURE

A small, standard flower show

The show was presented on April 20, 2012 a Friday, with set up the day before at the Presbyterian Church on Mountain Ave. in Westfield. Diana Kazazis and Nancy Smith were co-chairs. The theme was fashion and flowers in French. All schedule classes were written in English and translated to French on the schedule for the public. Each class title was fashion themed. The artistic crafts contributed tremendously to the theme with decorated purses, shoes and jewelry. Vintage dresses displayed to the public depicted how fashions changed over the decades. There were 3 educational exhibits pertaining to those projects in which Rake and Hoe is involved: Blue Star Memorial, which was dedicated in November of 2011, the Miller-Cory museum and the Clare Brownell garden. There were 3 invitational exhibits: Liberty Hall Museum with period dressed docents, the Lyons greenhouse and Westlake school's scout troop. Additionally, we had a fabulous boutique and tea room. This allowed all members to participate in an activity in which they were most interested. A new section for us in flower shows was the photography, which was a hit with club members and the public.

All went smoothly for the most part. The boutique indicated that they made approximately \$600 while the tea room made \$334 charging only \$3 for served tea and lovely sandwiches. They decided that they could have charged more, perhaps \$5 and still had the same attendance. Being able to sit down and enjoy the show enabled folks to linger longer and view the displays leisurely. The boutique sold out many items within an hour and half into the show as the items were so popular with attendees. We did not sell tickets however, we received a one thousand dollar grant from the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders, which was applied for prior to the show by Diana and Nancy. Donations contributed only \$35. The club budgeted \$2000 and with the grant we ran a deficit of \$573.13.

The show was extremely well attended by the public and evaluated by 3 panels, or 9 judges. The judges' luncheon continued the theme of fashion and was superb. Barbara Mullin won best in design and horticulture and captured the Nancy Wallace and Judy Camp awards by doing so. The show was not evaluated for award by the State however, subsequent discussion at the Board indicated that the decision to have a show evaluated should be voted on in the future by the general membership. A floral design was contributed to the show by the downtown florist on Prospect Street and then raffled off to members at the termination of the show.

The only glitch in my mind seemed to be the length of the tablecloths this time. In the past, the tablecloths were shorter and therefore we required 3 to cover a table to the floor with a topper. Because of the tremendous expense of renting tablecloths I would suggest in the future to determine if you could get away with one tablecloth per table and not skirt to the floor. I don't think that it's worth the cost. Properties were picked up at the State show and stored until our use in April. While it made it easier to have them here and contributed nicely to the look of the show, hauling properties from New Brunswick is a huge chore and perhaps somehow we can do without or at least minimize the amount. The show has garnered many compliments by the public and members alike. I believe all enjoyed participating in the event!

I. Final Report Narrative

1. Briefly describe project - The Rake and Hoe Garden Club, Inc. is sponsoring a fashion-themed, small standard flower show with boutique and refreshments on April 20, 2012. The objective is to teach club members and the public about floral design and seasonal horticulture. There will be several "classes" of design ranging from more traditional to creative design, which is more contemporary. Members will bring in well-groomed indoor or outdoor plants which they have grown themselves. The artistic crafts section will depict fashions from the 19th and 20th centuries embellished with flowers. The flower show will be judged by State Flower Show Judges who will write their evaluating comments for the public to read. The Club will also focus on its' community involvement with veterans and community gardens as well as promote other non-profit agencies by inviting them to participate. The public will be invited to shop in the boutique, (revenue to defray the expense of the show) and relax with a hot cup of tea in the café with assorted tasty treats. This show will be open to the public at no charge from 1:00 to 7:00pm that Friday.
2. Explain how grant funds spent – The funds were used to offset the cost of the show. Since tickets were not sold, but it was open free to the public for their enjoyment and education, our revenue was minimal. We budgeted \$2000 of our own money to pay for the event. Between the tea and boutique we made some money but even with the \$1000 grant, we still paid out over \$500 to benefit the public.
3. Describe how it benefited public – The public was able to view floral designs and learn from the judges comments which were posted by each design. They learned about fashion through times as we had a vintage dress artistic class craft. The public was introduced to well over 100 species of plants in the horticulture section. The schedule (a program for the show) was available to the public so they could identify each entry they were looking at and also learn the French words for each phrase used. It was important to our Club to introduce the public to some oft unknown organizations in our community such as Lyons Greenhouse in Basking Ridge and Westlake Academy in Scotch Plains. Westlake has a group of scouts who learned much from their instructors while putting together their display and then all of them visited the show when it opened. We also had a boutique and a tea which the public enjoyed immensely. It gave people a break from viewing the show so that they could stay longer and enjoy more of the displays. It was a wonderful show, very, very well attended!!

Notes for R&H Photo Contest,

'Photographie au Naturel'

Summary, 10/3/11

The Club photo contest (in lieu our annual Club backyard bird count) will be incorporated into our small Flower Show this spring.

Photo categories will follow standard Flower Show guidelines: digital, conventional film color and b&w. Judging will be by the Flower Show judges; also by a popular vote (attendees can drop their votes into a ballot box by the display).

Four themes for the show schedule are as follows: "Birds in Your Garden", "Flowers in Your Garden", "Insects in Your Garden", and "Nature's Designs in Your Garden". In keeping with the prior bird count rules, all photos must be taken in own garden (overflies OK; also vacation home gardens).

All club members are encouraged to participate; juniors also, with entries separate for their part of the show. Entries are limited to 4 (3?) per member, which can be submitted to one, or divided between all of the 4 schedule categories. Pre-registration prior to Show to determine space needed.

Format for entries is borderless prints not to exceed 8" x 10". Photos to be flush mounted (no border) on foam board (or similar material). Photos will be exhibited on a white background.

A workshop will be held approx. one month prior to the Flower Show to help members prepare, i.e. mount their entries. If needed, short vignettes with tips on taking good/interesting pictures will be offered at the beginning of the January (?) and March (?) meetings.

Amended, 10/11/11 (call w/Diana)

There are no standard Flower Show guidelines; we will follow those used for the State Show, incorporate the Photo exhibit into the show schedule, and have it judged by the show judges. In addition, there will be a popular vote by show attendees via a ballot box on site; the winners of the popular vote will be announced at our June luncheon.

We'll keep the 4 themes for the schedule and break down entries into color and b&w, irrespective of digital or conventional processing.

The Claire Brownell Memorial Wildflower Garden

The garden, located behind the Beers, Henry home of the Westfield Historical Society, had not been tilled for over 50 years and the plantings, path and stone wall were covered in English ivy. The stone steps were not stable under the growth. One of the new wooden benches had been vandalized. A survey showing that many native wildflower seed plantings could be started, Matthew Cross agreed to take on the work as an Eagle Scout project. The project would involve clearing out the ivy, laying two concrete platforms to form bases for two new metal benches, building an additional retaining wall and leveling out a path to be laid with gravel. Once this work was done, the Rake and the Garden Club would be able to repopulate the garden with native plants.

The project planning and physical work extended over a period of eleven months, from August 2010 to July 2011 and involved the officers of the high school and two adult volunteers who worked under Matthew's direction for a total of 254 hours. The group pulled up approximately 50 39-gallon bags of ivy and then laid the concrete platform for the benches, built the six-foot wall and laid the path. Matthew found a craftsman to fabricate and install the two metal benches. In addition, Matthew raised \$2,015 of the total cost of \$4,855 from local businesses, foundations and private donors. The remaining amount was funded from the Claire Brownell Memorial Fund. With everyone's combined efforts, the garden is now ready for planting.

The Rake and the Garden Club will plant the garden with native plants and maintain the garden going forward. Committee members are in the process of choosing plantings that are appropriate to the site and to the presence of deer in the area.




The Westlake School Gardens



SQUARE FOOT GARDENING is the practice of planting small but frequently planted garden in 1-foot beds. It makes it easy to manage one plant at a time. We used heavy plastic mulch beds from the Bank State Company in Mahoning State. The employees at Bank State made the garden beds from recycled old milk jugs.

The garden area was divided with a grid of planting sections. Each 1-foot x 1-foot garden bed is raised up from the ground. To encourage a variety of different crops and sizes, plants were planted with a different kind of soil. The main garden was planted with a different kind of soil. Westlake School wanted to help the struggling butterfly population. With the efforts of students and staff an outdoor butterfly garden was created to make an organic butterfly garden from the ground up. Materials included grass clippings, coffee grounds, apple, dryer lint and newspaper which were layered into soil to create four planting beds. A raised bed was used as a model for the garden and covered with black plastic to keep the soil warm and moist.




Students grew a variety of annual flowers and several different plants from seed. The plants were chosen to make the garden a good habitat for butterflies. We purchased additional plants during a field trip to an established butterfly habitat.

Over the winter we were enough staff and parents started the garden. Throughout the spring and summer months, students and staff worked and watered the garden to ensure its growth.

The Westlake School Butterfly Garden is a great example of a school's commitment to environmental education and a great place for visiting butterflies and other insects since 2005.
