





SECRET GARDEN TOUR - MAY 28, 2014

Take Broad Street through town, under the railroad, around the circle, and continue on South Ave. through Fanwood into Plainfield. Make a left turn onto Woodland Ave. by Netherwood Auto Repair. Stay on Woodland past Watchung and make 3rd right onto Evergreen

1401 Evergreen Ave, Plainfield

I purchased the carriage house with a full screen of lovely landscaping. Lucky me. Will describe what is here...

The property has a wonderful setback from the road and has a bounty of trees, plants and bushes. There is always a seasonal surprise. In the Spring there are red and yellow tulips, fragrant lilacs and sunny daffodils. Early Spring the Hosta plants start to announce their presence.

Early Summer my hydrangeas and roses bloom. There is a deep coral rose bush on the side of my home. There is lovely, lovely yellow rose bush, that blooms and cascades over a white picket fence. This is picturesque!

Early Summer, a small garden of purple coneflowers sprout up outside my front door. This is a garden most seen and appreciated!

The property also has a gorgeous red Crape myrtle, butterfly bushes, Japanese maples and boxwoods. Of course there are Evergreens!!!

The women are welcome to come into my Conservatory room. This space provides a wonderful view of many of the plantings.

Return to Woodland Ave. pass Watchung and then make a right onto E. 7th St. which becomes La Grande Ave. in Fanwood. Veer left onto Laurel Place and then right onto South Ave., left onto Hetfield over the tracks and right onto North Ave. From North make a slight left onto W. Dudley. . .

139 West Dudley Avenue, Westfield

When the restoration and expansion of this 1906 American Foursquare home was complete, the property was landscaped in keeping with its Arts & Crafts style. Many mature trees and shrubs were left in place, such as a beautiful pink Saucer Magnolia, an old Spruce and a White Quince.

The foundation gardens are simple and low in height in order not to obstruct the view of the home's craftsmanship and large porch. Their symmetry and simple use of Boxwood, Hydrangea and Allium reinforce the clean architecture.

A wide serpentine garden border was designed on the left property line. It is 300 feet in length. Plants often found in 1906 gardens, such as Holly, Tree Peony, Herbaceous Peony and hundreds of Narcissus, were planted. Color-show plants, like deer resistant Japanese Forest Grass, Nandina, Red Twig Dogwood, 'Limemound' Spirea, Astilbe and Fern, were also added.

The rear section of the border is adjacent to woodland. A rustic farm fence backs a "meadow" planting of Ornamental Grass, Coneflowers (which attract the New Jersey Goldfinches), Russian Sage, Cardinal Flower, Peonies, English Bluebells and annual Poppies. The property's 300 foot long right side and back borders are framed by a series of Lilacs, Skip Laurels, Arborvitaes and mature Victorian Privets.

Typical of Victorian gardens, some "theme" gardens were added. There is an Iris garden and a Boxwood-lined Herb Garden. A sunny, caged vegetable garden was constructed on the side of the garage.

Throughout the property, there are seven mature Fig trees that yield over 1,000 figs annually. Last year, four American Chestnut trees were planted in protective cages toward the rear of the property. They are part of a nationwide effort organized by the American Chestnut Foundation to restore the almost extinct trees back into our landscape.

Continue on Dudley, make the 1st left onto Prospect and then left on Stanmore by Franklin School. . . .

126 Stanmore Place, Westfield

Gardens are never completely finished nor are their gardeners, for gardens as well as gardeners are works in progress. This is especially true of our shade garden following the devastation left by hurricane Sandy. Those of you who have visited our garden in the past will remember it as a shady 'Symphony in Green' oasis, home to countless shade-loving ferns, hosta and perennials, as well as a growing herd of deer! In 2014, coupled with the removal of all shade trees in a neighboring garden, Sandy removed five 120' oak trees and forever changed and challenged our remaining shade-loving plants.

Once the construction crews departed ... they left behind a pristine garage, a newly graveled driveway and a mud pit which used to be the back lawn. 4,000 pounds of topsoil later, the green is returning. Creating shade for the ferns and Hosta and other perennials has proved to be more of a challenge, as well an enjoyable opportunity to recreate the landscape to our own design. Keep in mind that the spring of 2013 brought us the cicada infestation, a fact that played havoc with trees planted before May. But we have continued planting, and nurturing new trees. Trying to recreate shade has commanded our attention.

To date, we have planted six 'Red Sunset' maple trees, two Japanese lilac 'Ivory Silk' trees, one River Birch, one River Birch shrub, three crape myrtle, two Kousa dogwood (which might not survive the cicada damage), seven 'Winter Gem' boxwood, twelve Ilex crenata, and two Ilex Hoogendorn. Three new Viburnum are establishing their roots, hopefully attracting birds to their shelter and fruits. We might not be here to enjoy the shade which the maple trees will eventually provide in the future, but already we can see the shade plants basking in the newly created afternoon shade.

In addition to our new trees ... our favorite 'golden' Japanese forest grasses, sedges, fall-blooming anemone, variegated Weigela, spring blooming azaleas and Hellebore add touches of color, texture and leaf design to complement the Daylilies and Iris as well as the Leucothoe in the far back garden. Our summer labors will involve a renewal of the far back green lawn and restoring plants prone to deer grazing. Unfortunately, a well-established border of Aucuba, and variegated Aucuba fell victim to our maurauding!! herd of winter-grazing deer. Spraying usually keeps these shrubs untouched. More vigilance will, hopefully, restore the strong roots of these lovely shrubs.

Our front garden, known as 'the Cottage', has garnered the attention and enjoyment of the parents who walk their children to school ... Iris, Daylilies, Peonies, Roses, all thriving in the sun, with a few shade plants, Hellebore and Ilex Winterberry hiding under the tall trees which remain. And so the transformation continues ... a Garden in Process.

Return to Prospect make a left onto Dudley and then left onto Mountain Ave. At the traffic light turn right onto Woodland and continue along to Kimball Ave. (by crosswalk) where you will make a left, and then a right onto Kimball Circle. Veer right onto Golf Edge, then right onto Carol Road and make an immediate left onto Lynn Lane.

When we purchased our house 30 years ago, the former owner was into gardening and color mixtures. She planted many perennials, trees and bushes so there is something always blooming beginning spring right into fall. As you walk up the driveway, there is a large Red Japanese Maple tree on the right. As you continue walking, there is a large lavender azalea, along with old lilac trees (lavender and purple mix) and a White Dogwood Tree. On South side we have a Viburnum Tree and a Mock Orange bush. Also blooming in May are Lily of the Valley, along several other plantings. Planted along the North side of the house, is a 100 foot row of "Rose of Sharon" with several color varieties (red, pink, white). In the front of the house stands a large Nokia Cyprus Tree along with boxwood bushes. Over the years we have updated our garden, by planting ferns, ornamental grasses, Iris, Butterfly Bushes, (several varieties), Holly Bushes, Andromeda, Pachysandra, Hydrangeas, Forsythia and other annuals. In the back yard are rows of Arborvitae and European Mountain Ashe along with two Burning Bushes. Our goal is to make our garden and back yard as inviting and a park-like sitting as much as possible. We enjoy the sounds of nature, feeding birds and photographing them in action while they enjoy splashing in the bird bath. We often see Swallowtail Butterflies on the Butterfly Bushes which we photograph in action. We won several ribbons at the 2012 Rake & Hoe's Flower Show for photos and plant cuttings from our garden. Recently, we entered a photo at the 2014 NJ Flower Show and won Second Place under the category of Flower & Insects. These photos are displayed in our sunroom to remind us all year round of our garden and how it attracts many species of birds and insects.
