Shady Rest Golf and Country Club in Scotch Plains, NJ



Shady Rest Golf and Country
Club Logo c. 1921

The clubhouse originally was the farmhouse of Ephraim Tucker in the mid-1700s. Many years later in 1897, the building became the George Osborne tavern. Only a few years afterward in 1900, the Westfield Golf Club converted the farmland into a nine-hole golf course.

When Westfield Golf Club merged with Cranford to create the Echo Lake Country Club, they sold the property to a group of black investors who in turn, created the Shady Rest Golf and Country Club for golf and tennis in 1921.

The Club was the first African-American owned and operated country club in the United States and was the home course for the first African-American golf professional to play the US Open, John Shippen. Great female athlete in both tennis and golf, Althea Gibson, played here.

The country club became a center for African-American society and events hosting many of the star musicians of the era such as Duke Ellington and Count Basie. Some of our current members can recount stories of the folks who would listen to music there.

Scotch Plains acquired the facility in 1938 and renamed it Scotch Hills Country Club, a public course, by 1964. The township values its historic significance and is restoring it currently.

"Trees: How They Enhance Your Health and Garden - A Designer's Love Affair with Trees "

Trees are the first thing to be considering when designing a garden. Whether for moderating a microclimate, carbon sequestration, or soothing our souls after a hectic day, trees enhance and add value to our home in ways that we often fail to consider. Bruce Crawford, Director of Rutgers Gardens, will discuss the many ways we benefit from trees, and how best to care for them so that future generations can enjoy.



Notes from the March Program . . .

"The New Shade Garden "



Ken Druse has been called the, "guru of natural gardening" by the *New York Times*. He presented for us a very informative and timely program on the "New Shade Garden". Timely when there is so much discussion about climate change, especially the last decade, and how it potentially may lead to new challenges for gardeners. Ken suggested we plant more trees in our gardens to provide shade and shelter from the sun. When working outside, try to avoid sun exposure from 10am to 4pm. [Editor's note: In addition to their shading and cooling effect, trees are a vital means for

sequestering, i.e. removing, CO2 from the atmosphere]. We need to add more native trees to our landscapes, many of which have beautiful bark as well.

Ken cautioned on the overuse of mulch – it can kill delicate plantings and attract rodents. Using your own home-made compost, it's a much better choice and is more "natural." Compost should be used readily around roots to promote growth. He showed us many examples of woodland floors and shrubs for shade (e.g. rhododendrons, acuba, laurel, box wood, viburnum, hydrangea, hostas.). In lieu of grass, he prefers the more natural approach of "cropped meadows." A very comprehensive handout was provided listing many plantings to consider for a "New Shade Garden." As Ken quipped "one never gets the garden done, it's a lifetime event". Thank you Ken for a most interesting discussion as we watch and try to adapt to the earth's ever changing climate.
