Westfield's Garden Clubs Offer Gardening Enthusiasts A Variety of Opportunites

The Garden Club of Westfield

The Garden Club of Westfield, established in 1922, is approaching 100 years of dedication to the beautification of and service to our town, as well as our local veterans. The extra benefit of this dedication is increased knowledge and pride and new friendships.

The Club currently has 10 continuing projects that bring our mission to Westfield. We maintain seven gorgeous planters in the town center, changing the plantings to provide seasonal displays. We also decorate evergreen wreaths for the town's municipal buildings, and plant and maintain two gardens in Mindowaskin Park. We also maintain gardens at the historical Reeves House every year. Our veterans are honored by our Blue Star Garden in Tamaques Park, a 70-year tradition locally, which is part of a national effort to

plant and maintain gardens all across the country that are dedicated to fallen and living veterans. Our volunteers travel to the VA Hospital in Lyons, NJ four times a year to arrange and distribute flowers to residents of that facility. And every week a flower arrangement is placed in the library, a tradition started in 1947, to honor WWII veterans.

Members participate in the Garden Club of New Jersey Flower Show behind the scenes, and as participants, attendees and judges. It is a chance for members of all different talents to bring beauty to the Garden State. The show takes place at the end of February every year and will really lift your spirits.

We meet monthly to hear a great variety of speakers on topics related to the environment, gardening in general, flower arranging, geology, famous gardens all over the world - new and fascinating topics every year. We take field trips to interesting gardens in NJ and nearby states. This year we walked the High Line in New York City and will be going to Long Island to visit the Westbury Gardens and Sagamore Hill, Oyster Bay, NY. This is our annual fundraiser and nonmembers are welcome to join us.

We also integrate artistic opportunities into our busy schedule by having workshops that teach us, for example, how to make our own beautiful floral paintings and to craft a kissing ball for Christmas and perhaps a terrarium.

Rake and Hoe Garden Club

When you think of Westfield, many great things come to mind - among them community, caring, contributing. One organization that represents all of these is the Rake and Hoe Garden Club of Westfield. Established in 1952, its mission is to educate its membership and the public in horticulture, floral design, nature and wildlife. Rake and Hoe hosts workshops, field trips and plant exchanges. Some of its very talented members are also more than willing to share their expertise with the group.

Rake & Hoe currently has a membership of approximately 82 and is comprised of many committees that directly serve the community. The garden club members volunteer at Lyons Hospital serving veterans, the Jardine Academy of the Cerebral Palsy League, Mobile Meals, and four community gardens in Westfield located at the northside of Westfield Train Station, the Miller-Cory House Museum, the Shadowlawn Pocket Park and the Claire Brownell Wildflower Garden at the Reeve History and Cultural Resource Center of the Westfield Historical Society.

The Rake and Hoe organize events to support service projects and operations of the club. This April it held a flower show, "A Victorian Spring," which included tutorials, a boutique, and a Victorian tea.

Every four years, the club hosts a Holiday House Tour where select homes in Westfield are decorated for the holidays, each with its own theme and adorned with natural materials arranged by the members of the club. The next tour is 2018.
