This is nice and all that -- but

There are a few trash cans provided, which rapidly become filled to overflowing—and not so rapidly emptied. Our visitors then have no choice but to leave their litter on the ground where it blows merrily up and down our beaches. Merrily for it, at any rate. (Ed. Note: In a conversation with BILL KUNKLE of the Disposal Service, he told us that his men check the cans at the two roadside parks, near the fire station and at Blind Pass, and at the beach end of Tarpon Bay Road, but that Turner Park is under the control of the County and they have not, as far as he knows, made any arrangements for trash disposal. Kunkle told us that Kinzie Park is still privately owned and that he does not know what is done with the trash left there. There is the same situation at Bowman's Beach.)

And there's a more pressing problem (and if you've ever been a tourist anywhere, you'll agree). There are no sanitary facilities for the public at any of the parks. Sombody, preferably the County, should do something -- and fast.


If somebody doesn't, an already serious nuisance will become a serious problem -- not in our children's time, but now.

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




#### GLORY OF THE SEA EXPANDS

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
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#### **GUESS WHO?**




