

SCHOOL BOND ELECTION COMING SOON

The third anniversary of Hurricane Donna, September 10, 1963, is the date of the Lee County School Bond Election. The bond issue, a total of \$2,990,000, will, if accepted, be parceled out over the county for both new construction and remodeling of existing buildings.

The amount to be spent on the Islands is not much, \$1,200 for playgrounds and equipment, but that is still \$1,200 that we would not have if there were no election or if the issue is defeated. The money will also be spent to improve the schools on the mainland that our Island youngsters attend. Cypress Lake Junior High will receive \$260,500, Fort Myers Senior High will receive \$50,000 and Dunbar High School and Elementary School a total of \$461,845. These figures include new construction and revamping of old ones -- making our schools better for our children.

According to members of the Lee County School Board, this bond issue will not increase our present taxes. They say that the previous bond issue will be retired this year and so the new one will only extend the present tax rate.

All free holders are eligible to vote in this election -- but you must re-register BEFORE August 26. If you have not done so -- do so at once. The only other way you can vote in this important issue is to sign an affidavit at the polling place on the day of the election, Clerks at the polling places are FRANCIS BAILEY for Sanibel and MARY BALLINGER for Captiva. Inspectors are KEN HAVOURD and TOM BILLHEIMER for Sanibel and SUSAN KARR and PAULINE BONE for Captiva.







Modern Central Office dial equipment is now being installed in this new GReenleaf Exchange building on Sanibel Island (the 29th Inter-County Exchange) to bring improved and expanded telephone service to the area.

The new facilities will be placed in service on September 30, 1963, and all existing telephone numbers will be changed. A new telephone directory supplement will be distributed prior to the cut-over date to reflect all new telephone numbers in the Sanibel-Captiva Islands exchange.

Through the establishment of these facilities Nation-wide Customer Direct Distance Dialing and Extended Area Service between Fort Myers Beach and Sanibel-Captiva Islands will be available.

These new facilities clearly indicate Inter-County Telephone System's faith in the future growth and development of Sanibel-Captiva Islands and Lee County.


PERSONALS
