ZONING BOARD MEETING

The Lee County Zoning Board met with Island residents on Monday, Sept 9, to discuss the 1,000 square foot minimum floor space ruling for a single family residence. Islanders proposed that the following amended requirements be adopted:

1,000 sq. ft. requirement for single family residence in RU-1 zone, 750 sq. ft. etc. for RU-2 zone and 1,200 sq. ft. for a duplex.

Board members present representing Lee County Zoning were spokesman Foster Pate, Robert Belcher, Hoke Roberts, Art Hamel, R. D. Taylor and Commissioner P. A. Geraci. Geraci again stressed the fact that all Islanders are welcome to go before the Board with requests for lower footage or any other problems.

Many Islanders attended the meeting and it is hoped that Sanibelites continue to take part in their own zoning as much as possible. The Island proposed "set-back" requirements seem reasonable --- 25 feet in front, 20% of lot depth in back, and 10% of lot width on either side.

The gentlemen from Fort Myers are showing that they are co-operative --- we hope that Islanders and the Lee County Zoning Board will form a mutually agreeable association to keep Sanibel as beautiful as we all want it.

SCHOOL DAYS

The Sanibel Elementary School started off the year with 34 pupils, 15 in Mrs. Carol Gehr's class and 19 in Miss Nancy McCann's room. Three of these are the Reynolds children, who are temporary students, and will be moving to Jacksonville as soon as their parents settle in there. Nickle Wakefield is expected to join the crowd of Sanibelite schoolers around October 1 and Linda Legel will transfer here around Thanksgiving.

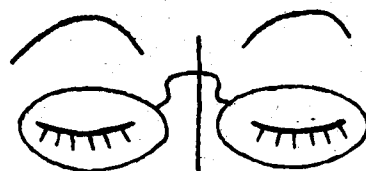
SHALIMAR SIGHTS

At La Belle, Florida, on August 23, PRISCILLA & ORIN O. MURPHY of Sanibel were granted a divorce.

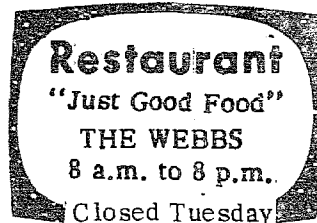
Dr. & Mrs. HOMER HINDMAN returned to their Captiva home last week after spending the summer at Manhasset, L.I., and East Aurora, New York.
