




They'll be open again on November 1 -- be sure to drop in and say hello!





The Gaults came to Sanibel a little over ten years ago, and with a lot of work from all of the family, have developed into one of our leading families and merchants.


#### A NEW HOME



CHARLES JUNIA KNAPP died Saturday, September 21, in Lee Memorial Hospital, just three days before the first anniversary of his wife BESS'S death in 1962.

Knapp, a New Yorker by birth, an Ohioan by adoption and a Floridian by choice, bought Casa Ybel hotel and 360 acres of land, (including a mile and a half of choice beach front) for \$11,000 in 1918. He owned and operated the hotel until

1945 when he retired to a 25 acre farm in Olga.

He "un-retired" himself shortly after, and went into partnership with George D'Alessandro in the Gondola Inn (now the River House) in Fort Myers, and also managed South Seas Plantation during the summer time for a few years.

Knapp was Past President of the Florida State Hotel Association, and was the first President of that Association ever to be re-elected. He took a large part in Sanibel civic affairs, and at one time was clerk of the Sanibel Election Board. That was when there were only seven voters -- and five of them were on the Board.

He had many friends -- Islanders as well as nationally known "names" who started out being Casa Ybel guests and ended up being Charlie's friends.

The funeral was held at the Harvey Funeral Home on Monday, September 23, with the Rev. A.P. MENSHEW, Pastor of the First Baptist Church, Fort Myers, officiating.

Fort Myers Lodge 1288, B.P.O.E., conducted graveside services at Fort Myers Cemetery. Pallbearers were J. WES RUMSEY, JOE W. MAHONEY, TOM G. MATHESON, ERNEST HOL-




Mrs. LYNN BEALS returned to her home at Blind Pass, Captiva, early last week after spending the summer in Lyons, New York, and the New England states.

STORM HITS from Front Page

The late Dr. LUIS BISH's cottage, which had been hard hit by Donna (that storm left just one room which was used for storage) was completely demolished and the house and contents were spread on the Beach.

A new cut, about two hundred feet wide, but reportedly shallow, was cut thru Blind Pass opposite Castaway's, making the tip end of the quarter-million dollar park into an Island (as many residents predicted when the County bought the land). Many trees were lost and as you can see by the photo, it will cost a lot more money to repair and replace the benches and other facilities.

RALPH CIMATO, working on the new addition at Island Inn, was marooned on the Dixie Beach Road when the water swept the road from under his wheels. He said he didn't have any trouble getting out of the car -- he opened one door and the force of the water rushing in swept him out the other side.

CLIFF GRIMARD of the Standard Station was also marooned when he was delivering a load of shell up the same road. He got about halfway up the road and felt his wheels hit "something soft." He turned back and was confronted with a 25 foot wide "river" of rushing water. He stayed put on his own little Island until rescued by RALPH WOOD-RING in a boat.

All we can say is -- if this was just a small "storm" -- hurricane, keep away from our doors.
