

# **County System Discussed at PTA**


After a short business meeting of the Sanibel-Captiva P.T.A. at the Sanibel Elementary School last Thursday evening, with F.T.A. President Allen Nave presiding, the Lee County School System was discussed.

Mrs. Gertrude Burgan, Elementary Consultant and Textbook Manager for Lee County Schools was guest speaker, and Mrs. Juanita Ellis, Lee County Elementary Supervisor, was a guest.

Mrs. Burgan outlined the County set-up---the personnel and services offered to children by various departments --- supervisory, instructional materials, transportation, attendance, lunchroom, health, music, speech therapy, homebound, teachers of the gifted, and school psychologists.

A question and answer period followed, during which Mrs. Burgan and Mrs. Ellis discussed some of the modern educational trands which have been adopted by the County, such as modern math and TV teaching, as well as some which are not being used, such as teaching a foreign language in the elementary grades. Textbooks and teacher qualifications were examined in relation to the requirements of a good up to date educational program.

Coffee and cake were served by Mrs. Thomas Hines and Mrs.




#### STONECYPHER SAFARI



#### RULES

It is requested that entry blanks be in the hands of the committee by Saturday, February 29th.

2. Entries will be accepted by the committee on Thursday, March 5th, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. ONLY. If you have to set up your exhibit, please be through by noon.

3. Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor or exhibitors and must remain until the close of the fair. No change may be made in any exhibit after entries close,

No exhibit which has won a first prize in this show may be entered 4. again in the same class unless all labeling is renewed and at least 50% of the shells are new.

Exhibitors may enter as many classes as desired but can have only 5. one entry in a class, this may consist of one or more boxes but will be judged as one.

The committee reserves the right to refuse entry to any exhibitor, 6. The judges' decisions in all cases will be final. 7.

8. No person, unless officially authorized, will be allowed in the Community House during the judging.

9-Professional exhibitors may enter any class but the exhibit must be marked 'Professional' and will be judged separately. (Professional defined as those engaged in the sale of mollusks and shell supplies as a business.)


