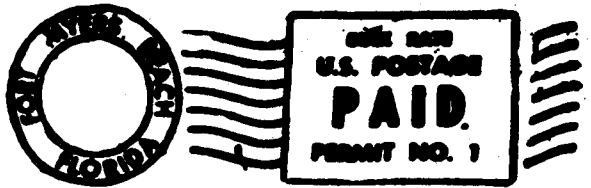

WHO NEEDS A SWIMMIN' POOL WHEN THEY HAVE A BAY?

VOTE!

It is now that time of the season when predictions and recommendations should be made. Election season, that is. The Islander is a newspaper "devoted to the interests of Sanibel and Captiva Islands," and as such, will make no recommendation for our highest office--- except that "no matter who you vote for - VOTE!"

In the upcoming Democratic Primary on May 5 the Islander believes that the many years of seniority and experience have proven that Spessard Holland should be re-elected to the U. S. Senate. Paul Rogers is unopposed in the Primary for the House of Representatives.

The Islander staff individually has picked Burns, Mathews, High, and maybe one or two others in the Democratic race for the Governor's chair. This is the democratic principle in action! For our Lee County State Representative we believe that either Ted Randell or Travis Gresham would give us excellent representation in the State Capitol. Businessman Donald Graf (Cape Coral Man of the Year in 1962) has shown by his business experience that he is exceptionally qualified to represent District #1 on the Board of the Lee County Commissioners. Commissioner Herman Hastings has shown by his waiting until just before election to place the main road at Fort Myers Beach on the State list of roads that need to be fixed "right now" (the same list that the Captiva road was put on two years ago) that Inlo Swope is the logical Democratic candidate for District #3. District #5 and all of Lee County has been excellently and ably represented by Commissioner Julian Hudson and the Islander believes that he should be returned to his post. Many years of personal knowledge and friendship (in both his classrooms and his home) make us believe that Ray L. Williams will make an excellent Lee County School Superintendent. Lee County Sheriff Flanders (Snag) Thompson is unopposed in the Democratic Primary on May 5.

We realize that it is late in the campaign to pose this question--- however, many Islanders would like to know where the incumbents and candidates stand on the issue of Turner Park. Many feel that putting any more tax money into a piece of land which not only lacks all facilities for comfort but keeps shifting around the Gulf is downright foolishness, and have said they would not vote for any County Commissioner who is in favor of keeping Turner Park rather than looking for a more suitable recreation spot. County Commissioners or candidates for office would definitely influence the Sanibel-Captiva vote if they will tell Islanders where they stand before next Tuesday. By the way, the League of Women Voters is holding a "Meet Your Candidates" forum tonight at 8 p.m. at the Civic Center in Fort Myers. Interested Islanders would be welcome to attend and to ask the candidates themselves where they stand.

The Islander urges all to vote in this Primary--remember, if you don't vote--don't gripe!
