



GEORGE E. GREEN



The new system, in which the calls are billed mechanically instead of manually, will also help the telephone company to obtain information easily for engineering projects, service requirements and research and marketing operations. The increased efficiency, by the way, did not put people out of work. Those who formerly did the billing by hand have been retrained to use the IBM machines.

Moving to Sanibel, though, made her more friendly to the frequent visitors who came to call. The Martins never needed a door bell, since Prissy lived in and would let Mrs. Martin know when someone drove up. She was named after PRISCILLA MURPHY, who would always add a post script to her business letters asking about her namesake, and how many children she had had that year.

She was a sweet, beautiful, lovable, intelligent dog and is sorely missed. She is buried in the family cemetary at Gray Gable
