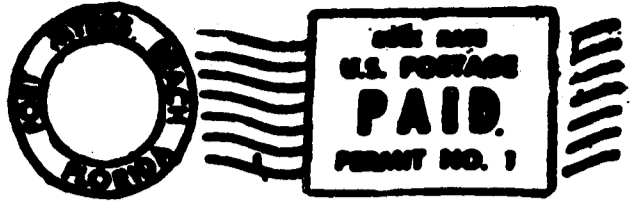

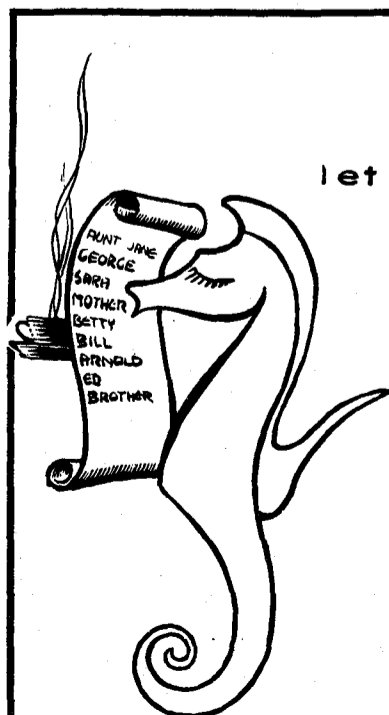

The library, located in the Sanibel Community House, is open Tuesdays from 9 a.m. till noon and Saturdays from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.


NEW SHOP ON SANIBEL

PRECIOUS MEMENTO

We have just learned that in 1947 our H.K. (JERRY) JEREMIASSEN received a letter from President HERBERT HOOVER in his own hand writing. During that period, Jerry was a sea captain and Herbert Hoover and his party were aboard Jerry's ship. The letter read:

"Dear Capt. JeremiasSEN: We, all of us, want you to know what a good time you have given us and the care you took of the young but successful fishers as well as the older less successful. Anytime I can serve you, please let me know. Good wishes, /s/ Herbert Hoover."

Mr. Hoover's secretary told Jerry that he should be very proud of having received this letter as it was one of the very few that Mr. Hoover ever personally wrote.

Since Mr. Hoover's death, Jerry has communicated with the library at West Branch, Iowa, Mr. Hoover's home town, and asked if they would like to have the letter. They accepted it with gladness and it is now displayed along with other mementos in this hall of memory.

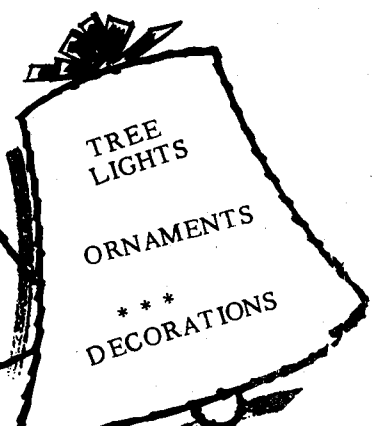


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
