CONGO SURVIVOR GUEST ON SANIBEL

KEN MILLER and his mother, of Weston, Conn., spent a few days recently at Island Inn. Mr. MILLER was aboard the last Belgian airplane that rescued Americans in the Congo after the massacre there.

Mrs. MILLER, who told of her son's experiences, said that Dr. Paul Earle Carlson had been among the Americans Mr. MILLER had met in the Congo. The medical missionary was killed in the massacre. Dr. Carlson nearly escaped, Mrs. MILLER said, but failed at the last moment when two bullets struck him as he fled. Mr. MILLER had the highest praise for the Belgian fliers and their rescue work. The survivor is married and has two children.


All children on the Island, both resident and visiting, will be welcome at the party which starts at 8:15.

Proceeds from the dance will provide funds for the annual children's Christmas Party next year.









