



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

Chambers reported that a new brochure should be ready shortly, and that they hoped to be in the new Chamber building in less than two months.


Bill Newman reported that 5,914 people visited the Chamber building within the last year, and that 3,478 written requests were received. (We admire his fortitude and dedication to duty.)

John Kontinos reported that the Islands should have their water supply by next April.


