


After the contests hot dogs, baked beans, potato chips and Pepsicola served picnic style made for a pleasant close to this year's school term.


WHO'S WHO ON SANIBEL




Last Friday Miss IRENE SCHAFER, visitor from Clarksville, Indiana, staying at Gulf Breeze Cottages, found her first Junonia.
