## Sounding Off

The following is a copy of a letter written to the County Commissioners by a visitor and future resident of Sanibel.

Gentlemen:

From the point of view of one who has been a regular visitor to the Islands the last few years, an Island land owner, and one who hopes, before too many years, to be a permanent resident, I have the following thoughts to offer regarding toll reductions to the Islands.

I am heartily in favor of the petition to reduce toll charges by 50% to permanent residents, taxpayers and free holders. However, I would be very much opposed to reducing the toll to the tourist trade for fear that a point would be reached where the Islands would be overrun with the curiosity seeker, the groups of youngsters out on a "tear," or picnic-ers

looking for a place to picnic and possible shell or swim, with no thought of leaving the area with its beauty, as they find it.

I feel that Sanibel and Captiva have a certain atmosphere that commercialism will completely destroy. I think the charm of the Islands depends upon the preservation of this native atmosphere. I have been on Treasure Island near St. Petersburg and have observed what overcrowding of an island can do to lose the beauty and charm that was once its heritage.

I realize that some of the business of our Islands depends upon the tourist trade. That I would not want to destroy. However, the giving over of the Islands to the development of increasing tourist trade would cause the Islands to lose their individuality and would be a great mistake. I feel that keeping the tolls high to all but the bonafide residents and taxpayers may help to preserve the beauty we so like about the Islands.

The only other point that I have, which may or may not need to be considered in making a decision, is whether or not laborers working for an off-island contractor doing construction on the Island, delivery trucks of needed materials for construction on the Islands, or delivery trucks of produce to the Islands might well be considered exempt or at a reduced rate.


LIBRARY MOVES





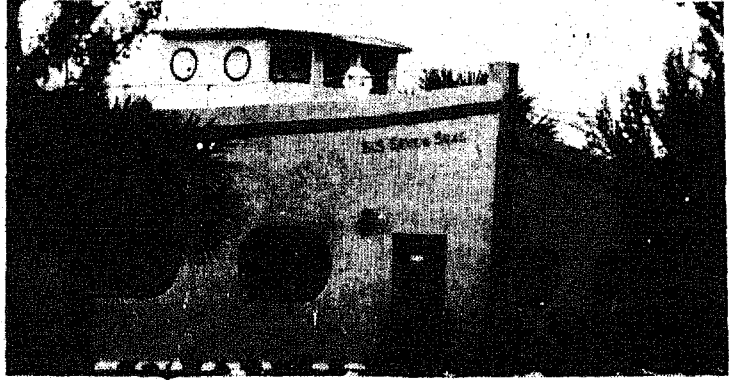
