




CAPTIVA EROSION DISCUSSED

A public hearing called by the Corps of Engineers of Lee County was held at the Captiva Community Center on Tuesday, March 22. Approximately 150 people were present.

County Engineer F. James DeLozier, Jr., declared that the erosion that is going on on Captiva is an emergency demanding immediate action and urged that the county-wide erosion study planned by the Corps of Engineers be directed first at Captiva so that Federal funds for correction and prevention can be secured with all haste.

This survey will seek to determine the extent and cause of the erosion that is going on on all the beaches of Lee County. To secure Federal funds it is necessary that the local taxpayers first put up funds themselves. Local taxpayers have not been idle, however, for in the last seven years it is reported that about \$300,000 has been spent in attempts at control of the erosion on Captiva.


It was decided to continue to haul sand for the road and beach and also to continue the present dredging for fill between the groins.

ARTIST VISITS ISLANDS AGAIN

Lauren Ford has been coming to Sanibel every year for 14 to 15 years (usually early March to after Easter), leaving this year just before Easter. She is an artist---paints in egg tempora and acrylic, does etchings, charcoal and pen and ink drawings.

Years ago Lauren conceived the idea of an illustrated story of the Old Testament written especially to give to her adopted daughter, Lauren, aged three. She was then in Solesme, France, and she showed the partly finished work, done in gouache, to one of the monks at the monastery nearby.

He was so enthusiastic about it he said she had no right to keep it for just one child, so when she returned to the U.S. she walked the streets of N.Y. searching for a publisher. Finally Dorothy Bryant at Doubleday accepted it. First printing was in 1934, "The Little Book about God,"

Lauren does Christmas cards for the American Artist Group, who has encouraged artists from all over the country to make their Christmas paintings into cards. She has her own reproducing machine (you other artists take note!) in her cellar to turn out two to three thousand of each of her 36 (monochrome) cards every year. She also has a few of more than one color that she doesn't undertake to do herself.

Lauren's books and cards are stocked at both The Glory of the Sea and MacIntosh Book Shop and she spends some happy hours autographing her books for their customers. But a very special autograph, not just a signature. Always there is added a little picture done by hand and sometimes when a customer joyfully discovers this was one of his own treasured childhood books, she writes a special dedication for the child or grandchild about to receive a copy. All proceeds of the cards and books, beyond paying her own expenses, go to little Lauren, now grown up and married. Lauren, herself, has twelve great grandchildren and four grandchildren all living

near her home in Bethelhem. Connecticut. When she comes to Casa Ybel each year, her old friends give her a warm reception --- her arrival is a longawaited event of the season. Many more happy returns, Lauren!

completed.


