

## LEE COUNTY THIS WEEK



#### GATHERING PLACE

Island Inn is a warm and homey place. It ought to be, for it's been around since the last century. You would expect that it would be one of the places where long-time island visitors would like to congregate---and they do. They make a little community within a community.

Allen Drury, the novelist, has been coming for years. Gene Sarazen is another and then there is Dean Hollister of Cornell. These are just a few of the part-time islanders who have a loyalty to Sanibel and a loyalty to the Island Inn. They do a lot to make it a center of vigorous and diversified activity that is striking to anyone who comes onto the Island grounds.

You see them young and old, playing shuffleboard or in conversation; and over here an art class is going on---and there is a hat with a bird perched on it and a woman under it bobbing about among her art students looking at their work, picking up a crayon and adding a stroke, no doubt being helpful, because they all seemed to be having a marvelous time,

The woman is Molly Pitcher, and she is why we are writing this. Molly is one of the oldtimers; spends six months every year on her beloved island and six months in her colder Vermont home. She paints mostly in water color here on Sanibel and finds oils more suitable for Vermont landscapes. She has exhibits each summer in the North and you may see her yearly island exhibit now in progress at Island Inn.

Molly is a product of Swarthmore and the Industrial Arts School in nearby Philadelphia. She was born in China of missionary parents (but her mother was an artist) and came to the States at age 13. Her mother started her in art and she has lived it (and taught it) ever since. She is delightful to meet and talk to. Go see her, especially if you have any interest in art.



FIRE AT CASTAWAYS A brief but violent fire Monday gutted the thatched hut used for storage and the pool filter at Mitchell's Castaways on Sanibel. The fire, which manager Jim Dowling thinks may have been started by a short circuit in one of the stored TVs they had been testing, knocked out the phone service, so Dowling drove all the way down the island to notify Fire Chief Nave, He and the Sanibel fire trucks got back to the scene shortly after the Captiva fire trucks arrived and the fire was out within a few minutes of their arrival.

No one was hurt, but since all the extra air conditioners and TVs were stored in the building, the financial loss was considerable.


### CANDIDATES INVITED HERE

### BIOLOGY LESSON


About six weeks ago Eula Rhodes picked up an egg case on the beach near Casa Ybel. She held it up to the light, saw an embryo swimming around inside the pouch and knew she had found a live skate egg.

The little four-pronged eggcase is popularly called a mermaid's purse or seapurse. It is made of keratin, the basic stuff of hair and horn and fingernails and is waterproof until the embryo is advanced enough to tolerate sea water. Eula took her seapurse find to Nature, Inc. and put it in Charles Le-Buff's keeping.

He put it in one of the tanks and waited for it to hatch. Meanwhile he kept watch, occasionally holding the dark brown pouch to the light to see what new might be going on inside.

The skate embryo starts as only a dot on a large yolk. It grows a tail and slowly absorbs the entire contents of the yolk sac. Sea water comes in when the yolk has been absorbed. It is thought to enter through a tiny hole in each corner of the purse.

Charles said the embryo Eula found was probably two or three weeks old. He watched it slowly develop wing-like fins, and then last Tuesday (Mar. 22) the purse seam split, the case opened and the baby skate swam out. The ending of this tale is short and sad: the little creature joined its ancestors just two days later. Let's wish the next one longer life.







### ONE MAN SHOW

Leon Levy calls himself an architect who has only turned artist on retirement. You won't believe him when you see his one-man show at the Sea Horse Gallery. He may have earned his living as a distinguished architect, but it is evident that Leon has always been an artist.

He must have always seen beauty in fascinating color contrasts, whether vivid or pastel. He must have always been able to isolate into almost framed unity small portions of the total panorama that met his eyes each day. His images are vivid and bright or murky and faded, as the mood strikes him. Take, for example, "The Shipwreck" and, on the bright side, "The Bayou" (surely from some far tropical world). Whether you have ever liked abstracts or not, you will be charmed by the one on the right hand wall of the gallery, as you enter, marked "Unnamed,"

Before you make the rounds of the work he is showing, you will be exclaiming over Leon's versatility, both in technique, subject matter and mood. You will chuckle over an impudent little tugboat in New York Harbor and what it creates to compete for your attention with the giants which form the background. (He calls this one "The Upstart.") We like the whimsical "Argument at Table"; we like "Florida Dry-Kye." And, "The Sitters"---they aren't baby-sitters, but the scene

would appeal to any lover of Sanibel.


